

Kathryn Krick Declares 'Revival Is Taking Over' Following Ignite Conference

As America approaches its 250th anniversary, author and commentator Eric Metaxas is urging Americans to revisit the nation's founding story—not merely as a political event, but as a spiritual one.

Speaking with commentator Dinesh D'Souza, Metaxas argued that the American Revolution stands alone in world history because it produced something unprecedented: a self-governing constitutional republic that has endured for nearly two and a half centuries.

"There has never been a revolution in the history of the world to compare with the American Revolution," Metaxas said.

According to Metaxas, the success of the American Revolution cannot be explained apart from the founders' belief that liberty required moral responsibility and submission to God.

"Only in America did we actually accomplish what we set out to do," Metaxas said, contrasting America's experience with revolutions in France, Russia and elsewhere.

Metaxas argued that while other revolutions sought to overthrow existing authority, America's founders understood that freedom could not survive without virtue. He pointed to the founders' repeated references to Scripture, divine providence and covenantal ideas drawn from biblical history.

"The men of the revolution in America understood that if we get rid of an earthly king, we have to look to God directly," Metaxas said.

Throughout the conversation, D'Souza and Metaxas discussed how biblical themes—including the Exodus story and the covenant relationship between God and Israel—influenced the founders' understanding of self-government.

Metaxas noted that even figures often portrayed as less religious, such as Thomas Jefferson and Benjamin Franklin, frequently referenced biblical imagery when discussing America's future.

The interview also addressed concerns about America's current cultural trajectory. Metaxas warned that modern society has increasingly disconnected liberty from virtue and faith, creating a dangerous misunderstanding of freedom itself.

"If we don't have it, we cannot have liberty," he said, referring to the moral and spiritual foundations that historically sustained self-government.

The author further argued that many Americans have lost touch with the nation's founding principles, leaving younger generations vulnerable to distorted narratives about America's origins.

"God at the center of American culture gave us the freest, most prosperous nation in the history of the world," Metaxas said.

As preparations continue for celebrations surrounding America's semi-quincentennial, Metaxas believes the moment presents an opportunity for national reflection. He encouraged Americans to rediscover the stories, sacrifices and convictions that shaped the nation and to recognize what he views as God's providential hand throughout its history.

"It is unique. It is outrageous. It ought never to have

happened, but God ordained that it might happen, and it did happen," Metaxas said.

For believers, the conversation serves as a reminder that America's story is not merely one of political independence. It is also a story of faith, responsibility and the enduring conviction that true liberty flourishes only when rooted in God's truth.

Disclosure Is Coming: Steven Spielberg Predicts Humanity Will Soon Find Extraterrestrial Life

For decades, Hollywood has captivated its audience with one question: Are we alone in the universe?

Now legendary filmmaker Steven Spielberg believes humanity may soon receive an answer.

Speaking at the UK premiere of his new science-fiction thriller, *Disclosure Day*, Spielberg said he believes humanity

will discover extraterrestrial life during our lifetime, according to a BBC interview.

The comments come as public interest in unidentified aerial phenomena, government transparency and the possibility of non-human intelligence continues to grow. What was once considered a fringe topic has increasingly become part of mainstream discussion, with congressional hearings, military disclosures and ongoing debate surrounding unexplained aerial encounters drawing global attention.

Spielberg's latest film taps directly into those conversations.

According to the BBC, Disclosure Day follows cybersecurity expert Daniel Kellner, played by Josh O'Connor, and meteorologist Margaret Fairchild, portrayed by Emily Blunt, as they uncover evidence suggesting non-human intelligence exists and that the truth has been concealed from the public for decades.

The film explores questions of secrecy, trust and how humanity might respond if long-held assumptions about reality were suddenly shattered.

For Spielberg, however, the story is ultimately about something much deeper.

"It's about empathy and bringing people together," he told the BBC, adding that the discovery of intelligent life beyond Earth could become a unifying moment for humanity.

The acclaimed director also revealed that his personal views on the subject have evolved over the years.

"My view has become more realistic," Spielberg said. "There's

a lot of mystery and things that are undisclosed but I've become more optimistic that people are going to be able to discover things that we have not been allowed to discover."

When asked whether humanity will learn that life exists beyond Earth during our lifetime, Spielberg answered simply: "Yes."

"And I'll accept whatever they are."

Several members of the cast shared similar perspectives.

O'Connor told the BBC he believes there is likely "something out there" and suggested that contact with another intelligent civilization could cause people to look beyond their differences and divisions.

Blunt also expressed openness to the possibility of extraterrestrial life, telling the BBC that she hopes any future discovery would leave humanity "astonished, humbled and awestruck."

The timing of the film is notable. Conversations about extraterrestrial life, advanced technology and artificial intelligence continue to shape public discourse. During the premiere, Spielberg also addressed AI's growing role in filmmaking, saying it can be useful for logistical tasks but should never replace human creativity.

"It depends what the AI is," Spielberg said. "To find locations or organize schedules is great, but not to replace the writer, actor or director."

As speculation surrounding extraterrestrial life continues to intensify, Christians are increasingly being forced to wrestle with questions that previous generations rarely considered. While the world searches for answers among the stars, there is only one truth that is certain and sure: Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today and forever, and He is still on the throne as the King of Kings and the Lord of Lords.

Former Disney Star Warns 'They're Coming After Our Kids'

Most families don't wake up one day and decide to drift away from God.

Instead, the process is often subtle, quiet and almost imperceptible.

"Most families don't drift from God because they meant to," Pastor Jim Raley recently shared. "They drift because life got full. Schedules got packed. Pressure started building. Conversations got thinner. Prayer gets pushed to the side."

In a powerful teaching on spiritual drift within the family, Raley warned that busyness can become one of the greatest threats to a home's spiritual health. While everything may appear productive on the surface, something deeper can begin to deteriorate.

"Your home can look busy on the outside," he said. "People would look at it and say, 'Man, that's a productive house.'"

But something spiritual feels off.”

According to Raley, drifting rarely announces itself. There are no alarms, flashing lights or dramatic moments of rebellion. Instead, it often begins with small compromises—missed prayer times, inconsistent church attendance and growing dependence on schedules rather than on God.

“A little distraction here. A missed prayer time there. A few Sundays out of church,” he said. “Before you even have the language to be able to say what happened, what was once central has become occasional.”

To illustrate the danger, he compared spiritual drift to a plane flying slightly off course.

“In aviation, being slightly off course may not seem like a big deal,” he explained. “But over distance and over time, that single degree or those few degrees that you’re off can cause you to be in a completely different city.”

Raley noted that many families today are faithfully moving through life, yet heading in the wrong spiritual direction.

“Some families are faithfully moving, but they’ve drifted and now they’re going the wrong direction,” he said. “They’re busy. They’re productive. They’re on autopilot, but they’re drifting.”

Throughout the message, he pointed to several biblical examples of drift, including Lot gradually moving toward Sodom, Samson losing God’s presence without realizing it and Peter following Jesus “from a distance.”

Yet despite the warning, the message was ultimately one of

hope.

“You might be drifting, but drift is not destiny,” he declared. “Drift is a heading problem, not a destination problem.”

He encouraged listeners not to give in to despair but to recalibrate through prayer, repentance and renewed focus on God’s purpose for their families.

One of the most powerful examples came from the story of the prodigal son. While many focus on the son’s rebellion, Raley highlighted the father’s unwavering faith.

“While he was still a great way off, the father saw him,” he said. “That means the father was still looking for him, still watching the road, still believing for the possibility that his son would return.”

For families sensing spiritual drift, Raley urged believers to pray with honesty, clarity and persistence.

“Lord, show me what needs to change. Show me what needs to be interrupted,” he prayed.

Raley’s final encouragement was simple but powerful: “God is still the God of the suddenly. He’s still the God of the homecoming. He’s still the God who fills houses with His presence and with His power.”

And for families willing to turn back toward Him, the journey home can begin today.

Scientists Explore Reversing Aging as Bible Prophecy Foretells Extraordinary Lifespans

A new wave of longevity research emerging from Israel is drawing attention not only from the scientific community but also from those interested in what the Bible says about the future of human life.

According to reporting by Israel365 News, researchers studying a protein known as SIRT6 believe it may hold important clues to understanding why humans age and how certain aspects of that process might eventually be slowed or modified.

The research is part of a growing scientific field known as geroscience, which focuses on the biological mechanisms behind aging itself. Rather than concentrating solely on individual diseases, scientists are increasingly exploring whether aging can be addressed at the cellular level.

Israel365 News reported that Dr. Haim Cohen, an Israeli researcher who has spent years studying SIRT6, is among those leading efforts in this area. Cohen's biotechnology company, SirTLab, is developing therapies aimed at increasing the protein's activity, which researchers believe plays a role in DNA repair, metabolism and cellular health.

The report also highlighted ongoing studies involving

exceptionally long-lived individuals. According to Israel365 News, some researchers have identified genetic traits among centenarians that appear to be associated with healthier aging and greater resistance to age-related decline.

While scientists are not claiming they have discovered a way to eliminate aging, the research is contributing to a broader discussion about how much of the aging process can be influenced through medical intervention.

For many people of faith, those conversations naturally raise questions about biblical passages that describe extraordinary longevity.

One such passage is Exodus 23:26, where God declares, "The number of your days I will fulfill." The Bible also records individuals in the book of Genesis who lived for centuries before the Flood.

The article's strongest biblical connection centers on Isaiah 65, a prophetic chapter describing conditions associated with the Messianic age. Isaiah 65:20 says that a person who dies at 100 will be considered young, while Isaiah 65:22 compares human lifespan to that of trees.

Israel365 News noted that some Jewish scholars interpret these verses as describing a future era in which human longevity will increase dramatically.

The article also cited comments from the late Rabbi Eyal Riess, who viewed modern discoveries in longevity through a biblical lens. According to the report, Riess pointed to Isaiah 25:8, which declares that God will ultimately "swallow up death forever."

Although today's research remains experimental, it has sparked

renewed interest in age-old questions surrounding life, mortality and the future of humanity.

As scientists continue searching for ways to understand aging, Christians can look forward to the day when God's restoration is fully realized and death is finally overcome.

John Eckhardt Releases Urgent Prophetic Word for June

For years, Randy Kay kept one of the most dramatic portions of his near-death experience hidden from public view.

Now, as reports of revival continue to emerge from around the world, Kay believes the time has come to share what he says Jesus showed him in heaven concerning "the storm" that will precede Christ's return.

Speaking with Gabe Poirot, Kay recounted an encounter that began after his death from blood clots and continued into what he describes as a journey through heaven. While many accounts of heaven focus on its beauty and peace, Kay said Jesus specifically brought him into the throne room to witness a

coming sequence of events.

“The storm was Jesus’ term to me in heaven,” Kay explained.

According to Kay, the first phase of the storm was not destruction but an unprecedented outpouring of God’s glory upon the earth.

He described hearing a declaration from God’s throne: “It has begun.”

Following that proclamation, Kay said he witnessed what appeared to be a massive outpouring of heavenly glory covering the earth.

“I could see multitudes of people just praising the Lord and giving Him glory and honor,” Kay said. “I could see people literally walking out of wheelchairs. I could see them in the hospital just walking out of their hospital beds.”

He said the vision revealed widespread healing, salvation and miracles occurring across nations.

But the experience soon shifted.

Kay said Jesus covered his eyes and allowed him to witness seven protective “shields” being removed from the earth.

“The Holy Spirit was explaining to me what was going on,” he said. “These were the shields of God’s protection that were being lifted over the earth.”

As those protections were removed, Kay said he saw devastating scenes of suffering, destruction and chaos unlike anything he had ever witnessed.

“I was seeing all kinds of atrocities on earth,” Kay recalled.

“I asked Jesus to please stop it. Don’t let me see these things.”

The vision then transitioned to what Kay believes was Christ’s triumphant return.

He described seeing Jesus mount a white horse surrounded by countless angels before descending upon Israel.

“Jesus ... declared, echoing what the Father had declared, ‘It is finished, ’” Kay said.

According to Kay, the battle was over almost instantly as Christ established His kingdom.

The final portion of the vision focused on the New Earth and what Kay described as the marriage supper of the Lamb.

“I could see a feast,” he said. “Jesus was at the head of the table, and He was saying, ‘Welcome to the marriage feast.’”

Today, Kay believes the first phase of the storm—the global outpouring of God’s glory—is already underway.

Pointing to revival movements in Africa, China and among younger generations, he said he sees evidence that the vision is unfolding.

His message remains simple and urgent.

“Get serious with God,” Kay said. “He loves you so much.”

Kay’s testimony serves as both a warning and an encouragement: before the storm reaches its climax, God’s glory is being poured out across the earth, calling people to repentance, healing and salvation.
