

1,800-Year-Old Image of Jesus Found in Ancient Tomb

A stunning discovery from the heart of ancient Christianity is drawing worldwide attention after archaeologists uncovered a remarkably preserved image of Jesus in what was once the city of Nicaea.

According to reports from The Christian Post, researchers excavating an ancient burial site near the modern Turkish city of Iznik, Turkey, uncovered a third-century fresco depicting Christ as the Good Shepherd. Experts believe the artwork is among the earliest known depictions of Jesus and one of the best-preserved examples from Christianity's earliest centuries.

The fresco was found inside a family tomb within the Hisardere necropolis, an ancient cemetery dating back to the Roman era. Hidden within the sealed burial chamber, the artwork remained protected from the elements for centuries, allowing its colors and intricate details to survive far longer than researchers typically find.

The image portrays Jesus carrying a sheep across His shoulders, a powerful symbol rooted in Scripture. Unlike many familiar artistic representations that emerged centuries later, this depiction presents Christ as youthful and clean-shaven, clothed in garments consistent with the Roman world of the time.

The discovery offers a fascinating glimpse into how some of the earliest believers visualized Christ long before the iconic portrayals that would later become commonplace throughout Christian history.

In John 10:11, Jesus declared, “I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep.” During an era when followers of Christ often faced persecution and uncertainty, the shepherd symbolized protection, guidance and sacrificial love.

Researchers believe the fresco dates to the early-to-mid third century, decades before Christianity gained legal recognition within the Roman Empire. As a result, the discovery provides a rare look into the faith and worship practices of believers who lived before Christianity became a dominant force throughout the ancient world.

The location of the find adds another layer of historical significance. Ancient Nicaea would later become the site of the First Council of Nicaea in A.D. 325, a gathering that helped establish foundational Christian doctrine and produced what would become known as the Nicene Creed.

Researchers also uncovered additional tombs, artwork and archaeological evidence throughout the site, helping piece together a broader picture of Christian life during a pivotal period in church history. These discoveries continue to reveal how believers lived, worshipped and expressed their faith amid the challenges of the Roman era.

Nearly 1,800 years after it was painted, the image still points to the same truth that has encouraged believers for years: Jesus is the Good Shepherd who leads, protects and cares for His flock. Though civilizations rise and fall, the message of the gospel continues to endure—preserved not only in stone and pigment, but in the hearts of those who follow Him.

What Kenneth Copeland Learned From Oral Roberts and Kenneth Hagin

A surprising shift is taking place among Generation Z, and Christian influencer Bryce Crawford believes it points to a deeper spiritual hunger that many young people can no longer ignore.

Appearing on Fox News with Rachel Campos-Duffy, Crawford discussed new data showing that young men have now surpassed young women in saying religion is “very important” in their lives. For a generation often described as increasingly secular, the trend has sparked fresh conversations about faith, purpose and the search for truth.

Crawford, who has amassed millions of followers across social media platforms by sharing Christian content, believes many young adults are discovering firsthand that the world’s promises cannot satisfy the deepest needs of the human heart.

“I think, you know, people in general are on a search for truth, right? Everyone’s on a quest for love,” Crawford said.

According to Crawford, one factor driving this renewed

interest in faith is the unprecedented access Gen Z has to temptation and distraction through technology.

“Because of sin and phones, Gen-Z’s been able to get sin in such large amounts in such short amount of time, and it’s kind of shown Gen-Z very quickly, oh wow, this stuff isn’t fulfilling us,” he said.

Rather than finding lasting satisfaction through entertainment, social media, addictions or other pursuits, many young people are discovering an emptiness that only Christ can fill.

When Campos-Duffy asked how Christians can better reach young women, Crawford emphasized the importance of godly leadership and example. Rather than relying solely on words, he believes believers—especially men—must demonstrate the character of Christ through their actions.

“We need to lead by example,” Crawford said. “The Bible says He didn’t come to be served, but to serve.”

He encouraged Christian men to model patience, courage, self-control and sacrificial love, creating a compelling witness that points others toward Jesus.

The conversation also touched on another emerging trend among young Christians: marriage and commitment. At just 22 years old, Crawford shared how marriage has transformed his understanding of God’s love.

Recalling the moment he watched his wife walk down the aisle, Crawford said it gave him a deeper revelation of Christ as the Bridegroom and the church as His bride.

“My job as a husband is to lay my life down for my wife,” he said. “That’s exactly what Christ has done for me.”

Crawford added that many of his peers are embracing marriage and lifelong commitment, noting, “Tons of my friends are getting engaged, married, and commitment is cool.”

Campos-Duffy concluded by highlighting Crawford’s observation about the overwhelming influence of smartphones on today’s generation. She described it as “the absolute mega-dose of sin that is coming via the phone to this generation.”

Yet amid the challenges, there is hope.

For many young people experiencing the emptiness of a culture that promises fulfillment but often delivers disappointment, a growing number are rediscovering what previous generations found to be true: genuine purpose, identity and lasting peace are ultimately found in a relationship with Jesus Christ.

Sesame Street Sparks Outrage With Pride Month Push

Many believers may be missing what God is doing because they

are confusing fear with discernment and religious routine with the power of the Holy Spirit.

In a recent conversation with Sid Roth on It's Supernatural!, minister David Diga Hernandez said the Lord highlighted three words for this hour: "Deliverance, deception and discernment."

Roth opened the discussion by saying, "If you don't understand those three words, the three D's, then you're going to miss 90% of the activity of what God is up to on planet Earth."

Hernandez pointed to a recent ministry trip to Abuja, Nigeria, where he said many warned him about witchcraft, demonic activity and heightened spiritual warfare in the region. But instead of becoming fearful, Hernandez said the Holy Spirit reminded him of a deeper truth.

"There are no tough regions for Him," Hernandez said. "Wherever there is hunger and faith, His power can move."

He said the Lord convicted him with the biblical truth that "greater is He who's in me than he who is in the world," emphasizing that the Holy Spirit does not lose power based on geography, culture or spiritual opposition.

During the service in Nigeria, Hernandez said many people were delivered. But one moment stood out. A woman who had already received deliverance began manifesting again. While many ministers may have assumed she still needed further deliverance, Hernandez said the Holy Spirit gave him discernment that the demonic bondage had already been broken and that emotion had taken over.

"Lady, you're free," Hernandez told her. "That's just flesh now. I'm telling you, the Lord's done it."

He then calmly ministered to her, saying, "You don't need to beg and plead. It's done."

Hernandez said the moment revealed how easily believers can

mistake appearance for true spiritual discernment.

“If this were an actual devil, she would not have been able to do that right now,” he said. “Sometimes we get caught up in things. I think it was a real deliverance. But it was done.”

For Hernandez, the lesson was clear: Christians must rely on the Holy Spirit, not formulas, fear or religious performance.

“Religion keeps people bound,” he said. “When the Son sets you free, He sets you free indeed.”

The conversation then shifted to Hernandez’s move back to California, which he said came after 12 confirmations from the Lord. Though he had settled in Texas with his family and ministry, Hernandez said God began stirring him to return to California, specifically Orange County.

“I believe there’s a great harvest of souls coming in,” Hernandez said. “I believe Los Angeles, I believe all of California is going to experience revival.”

He said true surrender is not complicated or emotional hype, but simple obedience.

“Surrender is simply reading the Word, knowing the Word and then obeying the Word of God,” he said.

Hernandez also shared reports of healings, including people claiming restored hearing and tumors disappearing during recent services. Still, he made it clear that the glory belongs to Jesus alone.

“I’m not the healer. He’s the healer,” Hernandez said. “I’m not the deliverer. Jesus is the deliverer.”

For Christians in this hour, the message is urgent: do not be

deceived by fear, religious striving or outward appearances. Deliverance is real. Deception is subtle. Discernment is essential. And when the Holy Spirit moves, He does not need man's panic—He needs yielded vessels who trust His voice.

'China's Nostradamus' Predicts Global Upheaval Amid UFO and AI Obsession

As anticipation builds around the release of government UFO records, one international commentator warns that the greatest impact may not come from what is revealed—but from how humanity responds.

Jiang Xueqin, a Chinese-Canadian professor and geopolitical commentator sometimes referred to by supporters as “China's Nostradamus,” recently weighed in on the growing global fascination with UFOs, artificial intelligence and hidden government knowledge.

According to a Daily Mail report, Jiang believes society may be approaching a pivotal moment that could fundamentally challenge long-held assumptions about reality.

The discussion comes amid renewed attention to the Trump administration's efforts to declassify and release documents related to unidentified flying objects and unexplained aerial phenomena. The prospect of additional government transparency has fueled speculation among researchers, lawmakers and the public regarding what authorities may know about unexplained encounters.

According to the Daily Mail, he argues that humanity is becoming increasingly consumed by questions surrounding extraterrestrial life, artificial intelligence, conspiracy theories and unexplained phenomena. Rather than bringing clarity, he suggests these developments could contribute to greater social division as people become entrenched in competing narratives about reality.

The warning arrives at a time when public interest in UFOs has reached levels not seen in decades. Congressional hearings, military footage and government investigations have pushed the topic from the fringes of public discourse into mainstream conversation.

Jiang reportedly suggested that future discoveries—whether scientific, technological or governmental—could force people to reconsider their understanding of the world. He also raised questions about advanced scientific research and whether humanity may be approaching breakthroughs that challenge conventional views of consciousness, dimensions and the nature of existence itself, according to the Daily Mail.

While many view such possibilities through a scientific lens, others see deeper spiritual implications.

Conversations about unexplained phenomena often raise questions that extend beyond technology and national security. Scripture repeatedly emphasizes the need for discernment in times of uncertainty and warns believers not to be carried away by deception or sensational claims.

Jesus cautioned His followers that deception would increase in the last days, while the apostle Paul urged believers to “test everything; hold fast what is good” (1 Thess. 5:21).

In a culture captivated by mysteries in the sky, Christians are called to keep their eyes fixed on Christ, who remains unchanged regardless of what discoveries emerge. As fascination with UFOs, artificial intelligence, and the unknown continues to grow, the challenge for believers is not merely to seek answers—but to remain grounded in biblical truth as they do so.

Operating under the slogan "Where calling meets college," Elevation College will offer students opportunities to pursue degrees in areas such as biblical studies, pastoral care and counseling, digital media and design, production and ministerial leadership.

According to WFAE, the partnership follows Southeastern University's established model of working with church-based educational sites across the country. Students enrolled in the program will not only complete coursework but will also gain practical ministry experience by serving alongside Elevation Church staff in worship, youth ministry, production, creative departments and other church ministries.

The college's annual cost is expected to remain below \$20,000, including tuition, housing and fees, according to figures cited by Charlotte Ledger.
