

Ex-CIA Psychic's Stunning Alien Base Claims Expose a Dangerous Spiritual Deception

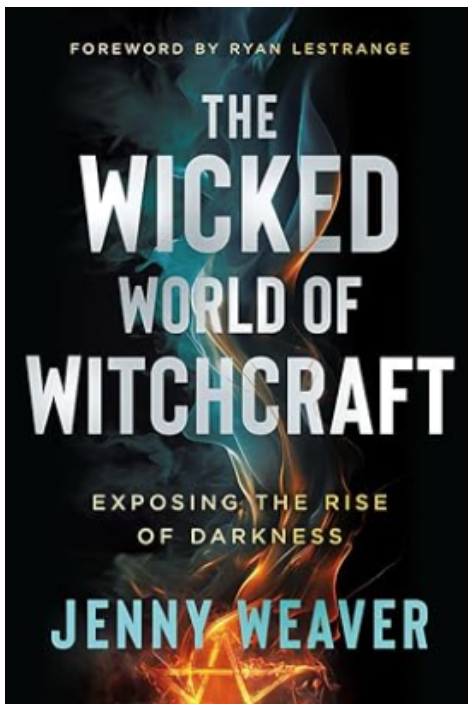
According to a recent Daily Mail report, former Army remote viewer Lyn Buchanan claims he identified several underground extraterrestrial installations around the world while serving in the government's Cold War-era psychic spying program. Buchanan alleged that one base exists beneath Mount Hayes in Alaska, another under Mount Ziel in Australia and a third beneath Mount Nyangani in Zimbabwe. He described the locations as centers for observation, transportation and even UFO repair.

Buchanan's claims stem from his involvement in the military's remote-viewing program, a controversial initiative that sought to determine whether individuals could gather intelligence through extrasensory perception. The program eventually became part of Project Stargate, a government-funded effort that investigated psychic phenomena [for potential military and intelligence applications](#).

While stories about aliens often capture public imagination, the more significant issue may be what these claims reveal about humanity's ongoing fascination with supernatural knowledge apart from God.

According to historical records, the U.S. government invested millions of dollars over several decades studying remote viewing and psychic intelligence gathering. However, a CIA review conducted in the 1990s concluded the program failed to

produce reliable intelligence results and was ultimately discontinued.

From a biblical perspective, the pursuit of supernatural information through psychics, mediums and occult practices is not merely unwise—it is explicitly forbidden. Scripture repeatedly warns God's people against seeking hidden knowledge through spiritual sources outside of Him.

Deuteronomy 18:10-12 states that there should be no one among God's people who practices divination, sorcery, interprets omens or consults the dead. Leviticus 19:31 similarly warns, "Do not turn to mediums or seek out spiritists, for you will be defiled by them."

The Bible presents a clear distinction between divine revelation and occult practices. While God speaks through His Word, the Holy Spirit and legitimate prophetic gifts, Scripture warns that other spiritual influences [also seek to deceive humanity.](#)

"Just sit back and relax, it will all work out well in the end – It always does!" – President Donald J. Trump.

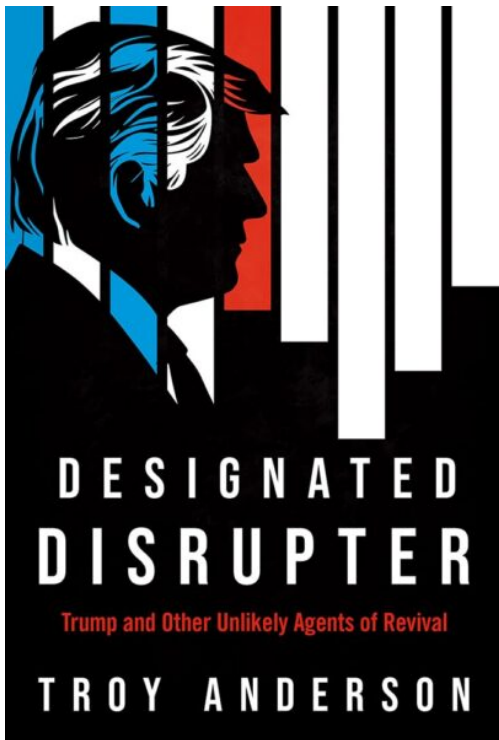

The post garnered attention from those who were leery of fully trusting the president.

One user asked Grok, "Does the bible warn against trusting in men? Very concise," and the AI tool displayed the answer, pointing to Jeremiah 17:5 and Psalm 118:8-9 as references to place trust in God alone.

Another commenter said, "This is just 'Trust the plan' reworded," while still someone else wrote, "We should trust in GOD alone. [And He will use President Trump](#) to accomplish what's best for America. Our nation's victory is in His hands."

As the discussion continues online, the White House's message has highlighted the differing views Americans hold regarding political leadership, personal trust and faith.

Above all, we must never lose sight of God, who is above all leaders.

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Chuck Pierce Releases Prophetic Word: The Double Portion Anointing Is Here

Prophetic minister Chuck Pierce says believers are entering a season of supernatural strengthening, fresh discernment and spiritual alignment.

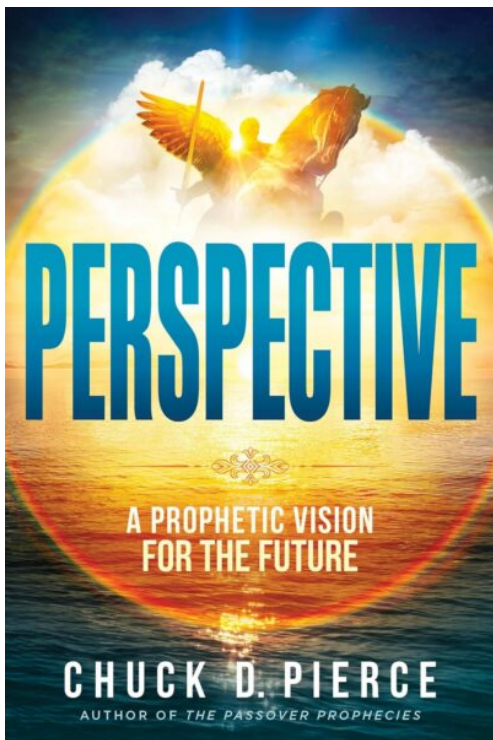

searching for direction in turbulent times.

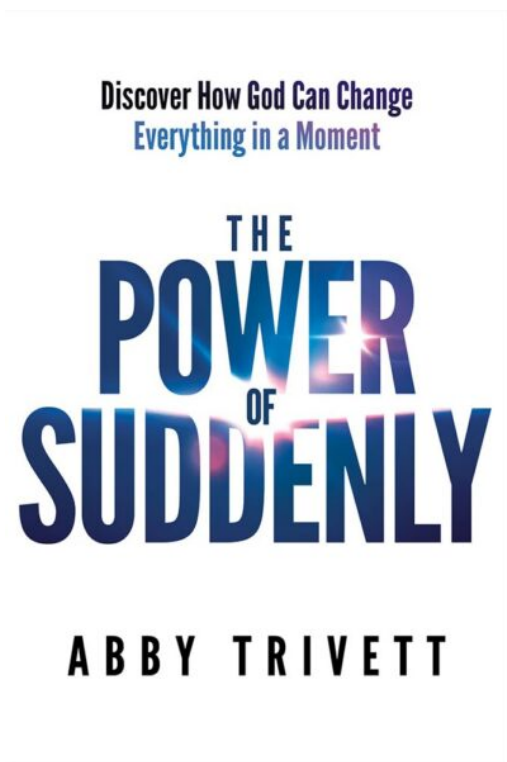
In a recent episode of House of Destiny Analysis, Clement's daughter, Donn  Clement Petruska, revisited one of her father's messages focused on hearing God's voice, understanding destiny and standing firm in a culture that often opposes biblical values.

Clement began with a foundational truth: [believers must learn to recognize the voice of God.](#)

"Knowing the voice of God is probably the most important thing in your Christianity and your walk with God," Clement taught. "Jesus said, 'My sheep will know Me by My voice.'"

According to Clement, walking with God is far more than religious activity. It is living in alignment with God's purposes and maintaining communication with Him.

"You've got to know that you're at the right place at the right time for the right reason at the right season," he said.

One of the most significant themes of his teaching was the distinction between a person's calling and destiny. Clement explained that callings can change throughout life, but destiny remains fixed.

"Your call on earth can change," he said. "Your election or your destiny on this earth is set."

Drawing from biblical examples such as Jacob, Jonah and David, Clement emphasized that God often uses geographical moves, unexpected circumstances and even difficult seasons to position people for their ultimate purpose. Clement also highlighted the life of the biblical figure Daniel as a model for believers living in challenging cultural environments.

"Daniel was in Babylon, but Babylon was not in Daniel," Clement said.

Rather than fleeing from a hostile culture, Daniel learned its language, understood its systems and ultimately became a voice of influence while remaining faithful to God. Clement urged Christians to follow the same example.

"What you have to do now is become a voice in the midst of it," he said.

Perhaps the most encouraging portion of the message centered on how God reveals destiny progressively.

"When God speaks, first of all He gives a revelation," Clement explained. "Then it begins to unfold."

Comparing God's guidance to reading a book one page at a time, he reminded believers that progress often precedes greater revelation.

For those feeling stuck, discouraged or forgotten, Clement offered a message of hope.

"Don't ever limit yourself to your present circumstances," he

declared. "There is a God-given grand design."

In a season marked by global instability and uncertainty, Clement's words remain a powerful reminder that God still speaks, destiny still matters, and believers can become influential voices even in the midst of modern-day Babylon.

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This Is the Real Reason Many Churches Avoid Teaching on Tongues

Many churches today avoid teaching on speaking in tongues, but Pastor Otha Turnbough believes the issue is not so much rejection as misunderstanding.

Appearing alongside his wife, LaRonna Turnbough, on the Rebecca Lamb Weiss podcast, Otha addressed one of the most debated topics in the church and explained why he believes praying in tongues remains a vital part of a believer's spiritual life.

"One, in most cases, it's just a lack of understanding," Turnbough said when asked why some Christians oppose the

practice.

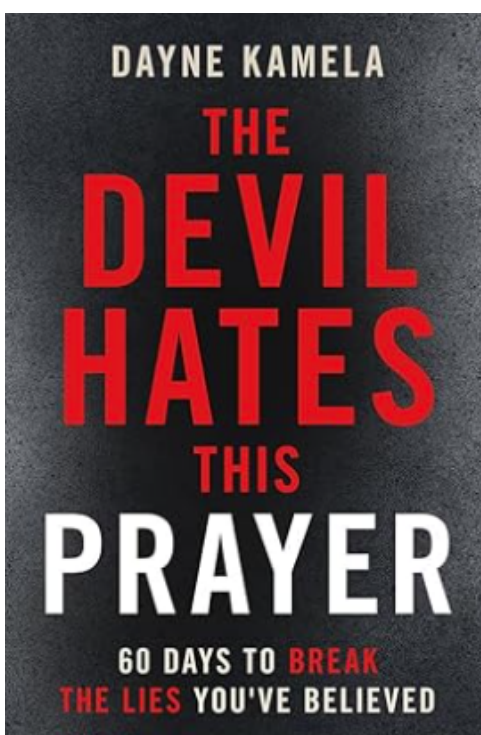
According to Turnbough, much of the confusion stems from believers failing to distinguish between different expressions of tongues found in Scripture. He pointed to 1 Corinthians 14, emphasizing what he described [as a private prayer language between a believer and God.](#)

“He that speaks in tongues does not speak unto men. He only speaks unto God,” he said. “Well, if you don’t speak unto men, you don’t need an interpreter.”

The Turnboughs lead a church where praying in tongues is incorporated into corporate worship before services. Otha said they dedicate an hour to prayer before preaching and regularly provide opportunities for people to receive the gift.

“When we’re done with the hour, we give people an opportunity to receive it,” he said. “The people receive the gift of tongues 100% of the time before I’m done with the sermon.”

While some pastors worry that such practices might make visitors uncomfortable, Turnbough believes the opposite often occurs.

"The first-time visitors, they stay because even though they don't understand the language, they can't deny that there's a mysterious power in the room," he said.

Throughout the conversation, Otha repeatedly connected praying in tongues with spiritual empowerment. Referencing the book of Acts, he distinguished between what he called the Holy Spirit "within" and the Holy Spirit "upon."

"The Holy Spirit within is for salvation. When you give your life to Christ, He moves in," Otha said. "The Holy Spirit is upon us for power. That's why in Acts it says, 'You shall receive power.'"

He also challenged believers to pursue a deeper prayer life, citing Jesus' words in the Garden of Gethsemane.

"When I asked the Lord, 'How would You pastor the church if You sat me down for a whole year?'" Otha recalled. "The first thing He said was, 'Could you not pray with Me for an hour?'"

LaRonna echoed the importance of cultivating a personal relationship with God through prayer, fasting and time in Scripture. She shared how seeking the Lord consistently transformed her own spiritual walk.

"My biggest prayer was, 'God, I want to experience the supernatural,'" she said. "I desire a supernatural encounter with You, Your Word, heaven."

The couple also emphasized [that spiritual growth requires intentional pursuit](#). Using the analogy of a store filled with resources for believers, Otha said that many Christians fail to access what God has provided simply because they never seek it.

"If you really, really, really desire something in your heart,

God is going to make sure you get it," he said.

For the Turnboughs, the conversation ultimately came back to a simple question every believer must answer for themselves.

"It really comes down to what do you want?" Otha said. "If you want more, then you've got to search. You've got to ask. You've got to seek."

The Turnboughs' message was clear: a vibrant prayer life remains essential for believers who desire to grow deeper in their relationship with God and experience the fullness of His presence.

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Can Prayer Improve Your Health? Study Reveals Surprising Benefits

Prayer is far more than a spiritual discipline—it is a lifeline. Now, new research suggests that even a brief moment of receiving prayer may be associated with measurable improvements in physical and emotional well-being.

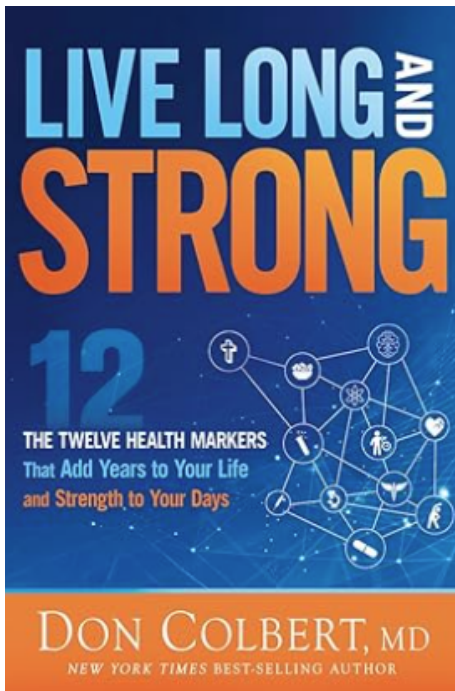
According to a report by Fox News, researchers at the

University of Maryland School of Medicine found that just five minutes of in-person prayer was linked to significant reductions in pain and anxiety among patients in a primary care setting.

The findings, published in the *Annals of Family Medicine*, came from a randomized controlled trial involving 180 adults [who reported experiencing moderate to severe pain](#), anxiety or both. Participants were recruited from a family medicine clinic and randomly assigned to one of two groups. One group received five minutes of face-to-face Christian prayer from a trained volunteer, while the other listened to music for five minutes, according to Fox News.

Researchers measured participants' pain and anxiety levels immediately after the intervention and again two weeks and six weeks later.

According to the study cited by Fox News, patients who received prayer experienced greater reductions in pain immediately following the session and continued to report lower pain levels than those in the music group at the two-week follow-up. While the difference in pain levels became less pronounced by six weeks, reductions in anxiety remained statistically significant throughout the study period.

One of the most unexpected findings was that the benefits were not limited to participants who identified as highly religious.

“Religious affiliation, religious intensity and expectancy of healing did not predict who improved,” Dr. Katherine Jacobson, assistant professor at the University of Maryland School of Medicine, told Fox News.

The study examined [a practice known as proximal intercessory prayer](#), or PIP, in which one person prays directly and in person for another individual. Researchers found that participants experienced improvements regardless of their religious background or expectations about prayer.

The findings also revealed a generally positive attitude toward spiritual care in medical settings. Jacobson told Fox News that 97% of participants were either neutral or supportive of having prayer available during medical visits.

Pastor Jesse Bradley of Grace Community Church said the study's findings align with what many believers have

experienced firsthand.

“Prayer is powerful and beneficial on many levels,” Bradley told Fox News.

In a culture increasingly marked by stress, fear and uncertainty, the study highlights something many Christians have long embraced: moments of spiritual encouragement, compassionate care and prayer can have a meaningful impact.

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Jonathan Cahn Unpacks the Mystery of Revelation's 144,000 in the Last Days

Who are the mysterious 144,000 described in the book of Revelation?

In a powerful sermon titled “The Mystery of 144,000,” Jonathan Cahn unpacked one of the most debated end-times passages in Scripture, pointing believers back to the plain reading of Revelation 7 and Revelation 14.

Cahn emphasized that this prophetic group is not merely

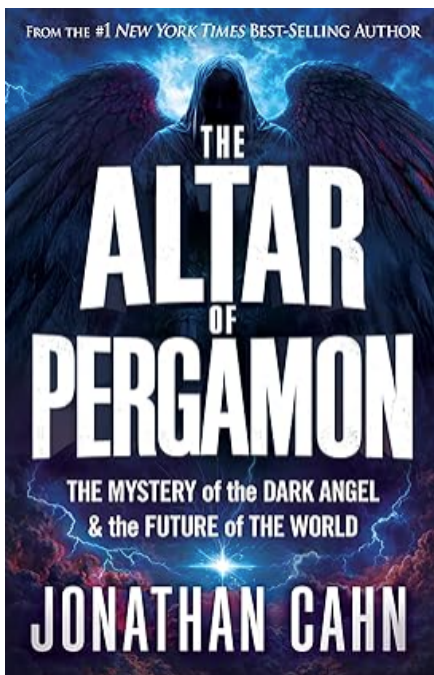
symbolic of all Christians, but specifically connected to Israel, [the last days and God's redemptive purposes.](#)

Reading from Revelation 7, Cahn noted that the Bible says the 144,000 are "sealed from every tribe of the sons of Israel." Before judgment is released on the earth, Cahn explained, God marks His servants for protection.

"Who are they? From this right here, they are servants of God," Cahn said. "They are to be sealed."

Cahn compared this sealing to Ezekiel 9, where judgment was about to fall on Jerusalem, yet God first commanded that a mark be placed on the foreheads of those who grieved over the abominations taking place in the land.

"Judgment's coming," Cahn said. "But before judgment comes, He says, 'Seal them. Put a mark on their forehead.'"

He also connected this passage to Passover, when the blood of the lamb marked the homes of the Israelites in Egypt. "When I see the blood, I will pass over you," Cahn said, tying the imagery of divine protection to the Lamb of God.

One of the most striking connections Cahn made was from the Hebrew word used in Ezekiel for “mark,” which he said is tav, a Hebrew letter. “It’s the sign of the cross put on there in Ezekiel,” he said.

Turning back to Revelation, Cahn explained the importance of the number 144,000. Since 144 is 12 squared, he said the number points to God’s kingdom purposes.

“Twelve is the number of the kingdom of God,” Cahn said, noting the 12 tribes of Israel and the 12 apostles. “Here you have both Israel and the church joined together in the book of Revelation for the climax.”

Cahn also examined Revelation 14, where the 144,000 stand with the Lamb on Mount Zion and have the name of the Father written on their foreheads. To Cahn, this speaks of ownership, consecration and divine covering.

“When you own something, and you don’t want somebody to get it, you put your name on it,” Cahn said. “So here God puts His name on them. They belong to Him. They are set apart for the Lord.”

Cahn described the 144,000 as “first fruits,” comparing them to the Jewish believers gathered in Jerusalem at Pentecost. Just as the early church began with Jewish believers filled with the Spirit, he suggested the end-times harvest will again involve a consecrated Jewish remnant.

“They are Jewish people who are believers in Messiah in the last days,” Cahn said. “They are especially consecrated to Him, [set apart for His purposes in the last days.](#)”

Cahn strongly rejected interpretations that remove Israel from the passage. He criticized replacement theology, the belief that the church has replaced Israel in God’s prophetic plan, arguing that Revelation explicitly names the tribes of Israel for a reason.

“What is it about every tribe of the sons of Israel that’s hard to understand?” Cahn asked.

The message of the 144,000 is not only about prophecy, but about God’s faithfulness. Even in a time of shaking, judgment and global darkness, the Lord knows how to preserve His people, mark His servants and fulfill every promise He has made. Ultimately, it is a reminder that God has not abandoned His covenant purposes.

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Amanda Grace Issues Urgent Prophetic Word: ‘Your Breakthrough Is on the Precipice’

As many believers navigate what feels like an increasingly heavy and challenging season, prophetic voice Amanda Grace says the pressure may be signaling something unexpected: breakthrough is closer than people realize.

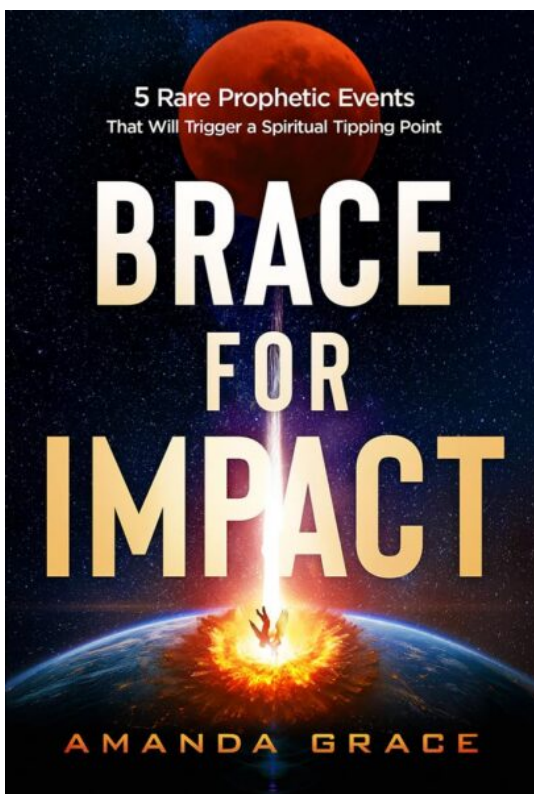
In a prophetic word she received from the Lord on May 30, Grace shared a message of encouragement, warning and divine

Rather than retreating during difficult circumstances, the prophetic message calls believers to press deeper into their relationship with God.

“Now, says the Lord, is the time to press in. Contend. My strength is made perfect in your weakness,” Grace declared. “Where you are weak, I the Lord am strong.”

A major theme throughout the word is divine separation and repositioning. Grace said God is removing individuals who have hindered, undermined or attempted to take what was assigned to others while simultaneously bringing new relationships and connections into place.

“So they have to sit there and watch Me prepare a table before you in the presence of your enemies,” the word states. “The portion stealers are being removed, and those who treat My blessings with contempt shall lose them in this time.”

The message also indicates that not everyone will accompany believers into their next season.

“Your breakthrough is on the precipice. Where you are going, all cannot go with you,” Grace said.

At the same time, the word speaks of supernatural provision and unexpected resources becoming available to accomplish God’s purposes.

“Resources from areas, untapped areas, shall open up and come in and flow in order that you may build and accomplish what I, the Lord, have set out to do,” Grace shared. “The divine helpers who have been assigned are coming in.”

Grace’s message also points to a season of reversal, restoration and divine justice.

“For this is a time of reversals, transition and restoration for [My people amongst the clashes](#) within your nation,” the word says.

The prophetic exhortation concludes with a promise that long-forgotten seeds of faithfulness may finally be entering their harvest season.

“My system of seed time and harvest, says the Lord, is now awakening,” Grace said. “Seeds planted years ago that have lied dormant shall now be awakened and produce a bumper crop.”

For believers who have spent years praying, sowing and waiting for answers, the message serves as a reminder not to lose heart. Grace ended her remarks with a simple but powerful encouragement: “Be in the Word of God every single day. Take courage. Keep the faith.”

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What Connects These Scientist Deaths? New Questions Follow Astrophysicist’s Killing

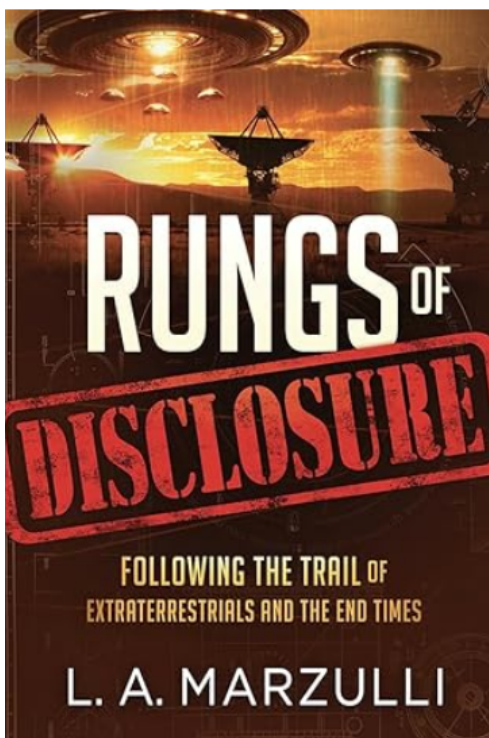
The murder of a celebrated astrophysicist in rural California has sparked more than grief within the scientific community.

As investigators pursue charges against the man accused of killing him, the case is also drawing fresh attention to several [recent deaths involving prominent scientists](#) that have become the subject of intense public discussion.

According to ABC7 Los Angeles, 67-year-old Carl Grillmair, a longtime scientist with the California Institute of Technology, was killed Feb. 16 at his home in Llano, California. Authorities later arrested 29-year-old Freddy Snyder, who has been charged with murder, burglary and carjacking in connection with the case.

Grillmair was widely respected for his contributions to astronomy and astrophysics. According to reporting by the Daily Mail, his research helped advance scientific understanding of dark matter, galactic structures and planets beyond Earth's solar system. The outlet reported that he also received NASA's Exceptional Scientific Achievement Medal during his distinguished career.

While law enforcement has identified a suspect and continues to investigate the homicide, the Daily Mail noted that Grillmair's death has become part of a broader conversation surrounding several recent cases involving scientists, researchers and technical experts whose deaths have attracted significant public interest.

One of the cases frequently mentioned alongside Grillmair's is that of MIT physicist Nuno Loureiro, who was killed in December 2025. The Daily Mail reported that both men were internationally recognized researchers working in highly specialized scientific fields, and both died in violent incidents near their residences within a relatively short period of time.

Family members have also pushed back strongly against theories suggesting the scientist's work played a role in his death.

Even so, the case has fueled renewed interest in a growing number of recent tragedies involving researchers and scientific experts, leading many to ask whether the similarities are merely coincidental or part of a larger trend.

As the Daily Mail noted, [there is something very odd](#) about some of the disappearances happening right now. Three of these strange cases: "...all involved workers at some of America's most important nuclear facilities, and all three were last seen walking out of their homes without their phones or keys..."

As investigators move forward with these cases many will continue watching for answers as the deaths of these scientists continue to emerge.

Until one man finally had the courage to tell the truth.

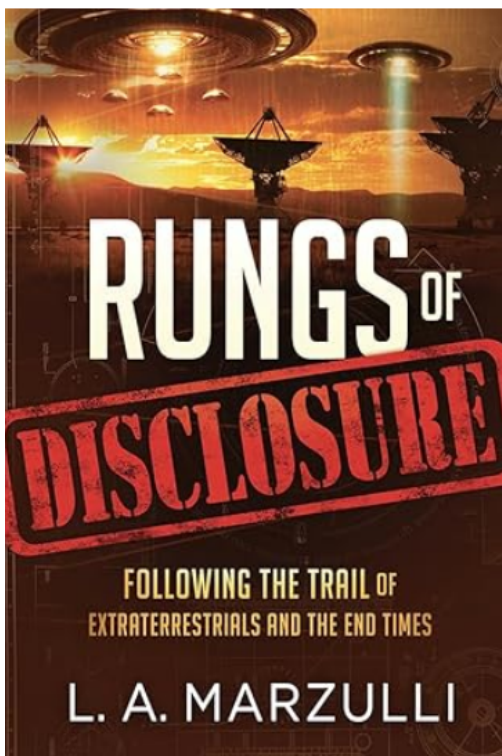
Bold. Unapologetic. Unafraid.
