

This Message About Diddy's Scandal Is Going Viral—and It Could Save Your Soul

The headlines surrounding [Sean "Diddy" Combs](#) have become increasingly disturbing as a federal trial unfolds, revealing allegations of abuse, manipulation and deeply troubling behavior. With 16 witnesses testifying over two weeks, the charges against the music mogul paint a dark picture.

Yet amidst the legal drama and celebrity scandal, Joe Kirby is asking a deeper, more eternal question: What about your own guilt before God?

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The trial testimony includes accounts of violence and coercion. Cassie Ventura, Diddy's former partner, testified that their decade-long relationship devolved into fear and control.

"When I decided to leave, I grabbed what I could and I got out," she said. "But Sean followed me into the hallway by the elevators, picked me up, threw me down, kicked me and tried to drag me back."

Others shared similarly chilling stories. Hotel security guard Israel Flores recalled an incident in 2016 when he responded to a distress call and found Ventura injured in a hallway. He [claimed Diddy](#) tried to bribe him into silence. Former assistant David James described Bad Boy Entertainment as "Mr.

Combs' kingdom. We're all here to serve him."

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While Diddy maintains his innocence, the allegations have captured the public's attention—and prompted a powerful reflection. Are we innocent before God?

This sobering question shifts the focus from the courtroom to the heart.

"Every single one of us has broken God's law. We've told lies. We've looked at things we shouldn't have. We've thought angry thoughts, wrong thoughts, hateful thoughts. We've all sinned," asserts Kirby.

Scripture affirms this truth: "All have sinned and [fall short of the glory of God](#)" (Rom. 3:23). And the consequence? "The wages of sin is death" (Rom. 6:23). But the good news is not found in hiding our guilt—it's in God's mercy. "God in His grace doesn't want us to go to hell. So He sent His Son Jesus Christ to go upon an old Roman cross and die in our place," says Kirby.

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Even [someone like Diddy](#), surrounded by allegations and facing possible judgment, is not beyond redemption. "Did you know this? Even Diddy is not too far gone," Kirby says. "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9).

In a culture quick to judge and cancel, the gospel offers something radically different—grace. Whether a public figure on trial or a hidden sinner in the pew, forgiveness is available through Jesus Christ. The question isn't just about

Diddy's guilt. It's about ours—and what we will do with it.

10 Reasons Israel Is Here to Stay: Biblical Proof You Can't Ignore

Israel is more than just a nation. It is a prophetic promise kept by God, and the epicenter of where end time events will take place.

In a powerful video by James Kaddis, he described why the modern state of Israel is not only biblically significant but also prophetically unstoppable.

Ezekiel 36:24 predicted it: “I will take you from [among the heathen](#)... and bring you into your own land.” And it's happening in real time. According to Kaddis, even amid turmoil in Israel, the Jewish people from around the world continue to gather together.

“Approximately 31,000 Jews from 100-plus nations have immigrated to Israel between Rosh Hashanah 2023 and 2024,” Kaddis says. This modern-day regathering is fulfillment in motion.

3. Israel's Population Explosion

Jeremiah 31:10 reminds us: “He that scattered Israel will gather him and keep him as a shepherd doth his flock.” Not only will people come together, but the evidence will be in the populous number of the people in that nation.

The proof of this increase? “Israel's population just crossed 10 million on Apr. 29, 2025. That's 12 times the number in 1948,” Kaddis shares. Nearly half of the world's Jewish

population now resides in Israel.

4. A Nation Born in a Day

Isaiah 66:8 asks, “Shall a nation be born at once?” That’s exactly what happened in 1948 when Israel became a nation according to this prophecy.

Israel’s economic boom underscores the prophetic weight of that day. “In 2023, the GDP per capita was \$52,642—equal to that of the United States. In 2024, it’s expected to rise even more,” Kaddis notes.

5. The Desert Land is Blooming

The prophecy of Isaiah 35:1 is literal as rich vegetation has come out of the nation of Israel: “The desert shall rejoice and blossom as the rose.”

From drip irrigation to solar desalination, [Israel has turned](#) its arid terrain into fertile ground. “They literally make them a net food exporter...to over a hundred countries,” Kaddis marvels.

Despite its small size, Israel is constantly in global headlines, drawing eyes and ears worldwide to hear of what is happening in this area.

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“Countries all around us are doing things way worse... and yet Israel seems to still be at the center,” the Kaddis says.

7. God's Blessing Is Evident on the Jewish People

From technological innovation to global influence, God's hand is unmistakable. "Look at just the Nobel Prizes alone—13 in 59 years—more per capita than the U.S., Germany, and France combined," Kaddis shares. These awards reflect contributions in chemistry, economics and peace.

8. Jerusalem Is the Burdensome Stone

Zechariah 12:3 prophesies: "In that day will I make Jerusalem a burdensome stone for all people." Today, the city of Jerusalem is a flashpoint of international debate, just as Scripture foretold. Nations grapple over its status, yet every attempt to divide or control it only [intensifies the global turmoil](#)—fulfilling prophecy in real time.

9. Ezekiel 38 Is Unfolding Right In Front of Us

The prophecy foretells a coalition of nations that will rise against Israel in the last days—and now, we're seeing it take shape in real time.

“God is going to use people to bring the Jews to Him,” he concludes. “You can’t erase what God is doing through Israel.”

Noah's Ark Found? Why This Stunning New Evidence Could Shake the World

In a recent video update, bestselling author and prophetic voice Jonathan Cahn shared a double portion of excitement: new compelling evidence pointing to the possible [discovery of Noah's Ark](#), and a forthcoming book he promises will be “explosive.”

Examining this incredible archaeological discovery, Cahn addressed a question that has fascinated believers and

skeptics alike: Has Noah's Ark actually been found?

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"It's a mystery that has spanned the ages," he said. "Some believe it's now on the verge of being solved."

According to the Bible, Noah's ark came to rest on Mount Ararat, in what is now modern-day Turkey. Near this mountain lies a curious formation known as the Durupınar site—a 538-foot-long mound in the shape of a boat.

Even more intriguing, recent geological and radar-based studies have revealed characteristics consistent with an ancient, man-made vessel.

["The most striking thing...](#) is that the samples that were taken outside the mound were different from those taken within the mound," Cahn explained. "The mound had lower pH levels and higher organic matter as well as more potassium than the soil around it."

What does that mean? According to Cahn, these signs suggest rotting wood, exactly what one might expect in the remains of an ancient ark. "If it was just a thing of dirt, a natural formation, that wouldn't have been," he said.

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Even the vegetation is acting strangely. "The grass inside the [boat-shaped site](#) turns yellow and fades earlier in the season than the grass of the surrounding area," he noted, suggesting

a man-made structure lies beneath the surface.

Using advanced ground-penetrating radar (GPR), researchers detected rectangular shapes about 22 feet underground—potentially chambers or construction elements consistent with the biblical description of the ark. A full-scale excavation is planned for the coming years.

Yet Cahn reminds viewers that faith doesn't rest on artifacts. "Our faith rests on the word of God regardless of anything else. But it's an added blessing to watch as modern archaeology has continually borne witness to the truth of God's word."

He reminded viewers that just as the ark served to protect Noah and his family from evil, we now are called to run to the Lord as our place of refuge.

["Evil will be judged.](#) The day of judgment is coming. So get right with God... Messiah Yeshua, Jesus—that's the ark. Get into the ark."

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Cahn also shared a major teaser with his audience. "I've been writing the newest book and I just finished it. It is just now being sent to the printer."

While he kept the title under wraps, he added, "It's going to be explosive. I don't know what's going to happen when it comes out." Followers of his ministry won't have to wait long to hear more. "You will be the first to get it or to be able to get it... It'll be the announcement that will be coming. So stay tuned to this channel."

As Cahn prepares to unveil his new book and the world waits to see what the Durupınar site will reveal, his message remains the same: "Stay strong in the Lord and in the power of His

might.”

Kathryn Krick: 4 Keys to Destroy Satan’s Grip on Your Life

In a world where the unseen spiritual realm plays a very real role in our lives, many believers remain unaware of how demonic oppression can subtly take hold. The Bible calls Satan the “prince and power of the air,” and his goal is always to steal, kill and destroy. But as believers, we are not left defenseless. In a powerful message on Daystar, [Kathryn Krick](#) laid out four key principles for removing demonic influence from your life—and keeping it out.

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The four keys Krick shares are anointing, faith, renouncing and sowing. While each plays a significant role, she focused on the power of renouncing [strongholds in a person’s life](#).

“Renouncing is to use your own authority in Christ and say, ‘I renounce anxiety, depression,’” she explained. “You’re renouncing the specific oppression that you have that you don’t want anymore.”

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Renouncing isn't just a spiritual ritual—it's a declaration of dominion. It involves rejecting the enemy's foothold in your life and actively reclaiming your peace through Christ's authority. "God wants us to walk in authority," Krick continued. "So that includes rejecting the devil. That includes knowing the Word of God, renewing our mind with the [Word of God](#)."

For deliverance to be lasting, renouncing must be specific. Believers are urged to call out and reject not just feelings, but the root behaviors and open doors that gave the enemy access in the first place.

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"You should also renounce the specific open doors you know of," she said. "Like if you know, 'Oh, I've confessed wrong words a lot,' negative words. 'Oh, I've sinned ... continually drinking, continually doing drugs, continually sleeping around, watching horror movies, watching porn.'" The list also includes inner heart conditions such as bitterness, unforgiveness and shame.

Even mental strongholds must be confronted: "Renouncing believing lies again and again, meditating on lies of the enemy, even like condemnation and shame. There's [no condemnation](#) for those of us who are in Christ Jesus."

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Ultimately, freedom begins when believers stop living passively and start walking in their God-given dominion. "This anxiety, this can't stay. This depression, this can't stay. This is the enemy. He doesn't have authority over me. Greater is He who is in me than he who is in the world," Krick said.

When believers use the authority Christ has given them, renounce the lies of the enemy and walk in alignment with God's Word, they position themselves to experience lasting deliverance and victory.

Gilgamesh and the Nephilim Agenda: Ancient Plots Exposed!

Author and researcher Gary Wayne is no stranger to the mysteries of Genesis.

In a recent discussion on Taylor Welch's "The Deep End," he unpacked the ancient flood story through a biblical lens, drawing connections between the Genesis account and flood legends found in cultures worldwide.

According to Wayne, these parallels aren't contradictions—they're confirmations.

"We ought not to worry about other accounts of the flood," he said. "We have the biblical account and we can see how they intersect with the Bible... they're talking about the same details..."

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Wayne emphasized that even though the Epic of Gilgamesh is often cited as being older than Genesis, that doesn't discredit the Bible's authority. "That perspective is... we have tablets dating to about 2150 BC... but it doesn't make [the Bible] not true," he explained. "Moses is receiving the ancient story from God."

He views the Epic of Gilgamesh as a polytheistic version of the same flood event, noting its protagonist Utnapishtim is described as part god and part human—[clearly a reference to Nephilim](#), or giants.

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"The Noah story is humans. These are giants," he emphasizes. "The details become different because...one is a survival from the polytheist lens of the giants."

In Gilgamesh's world, [giants are central](#), a detail Wayne links to Genesis 6:4 and the concept of a second incursion of fallen angels after the flood.

Wayne further notes that the proof of underwater cities today bring up the greater question of how they got there in the first place, potential proof of ancient Nephilim existence.

"If we look around the earth, we have [underwater cities](#)... in the Southeast Asia and elsewhere. And how did they get there? So, I think the flood story is something we should have faith in, and it's God's intercession into humanity," he says.

This is an intriguing notion just may further connect to recent evidence regarding tombs related to these Gilgamesh giant have appeared on social media.

"What the Iraq War in 2003 was really about: The Gilgamesh resurrection protocol," read one post.

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Ultimately, regardless of how these giants lived, where and its implications for the future, Wayne points out one thing that is certain about the flood: “This is a worldwide catastrophe that is remembered... because it was the reset of the earth.”

Wayne’s research challenges listeners to reevaluate what they think they know about myth and history. In his view, the flood was not just an ancient disaster—it was a divine intervention with eternal implications.

Jack Hibbs: The Top Reason Christians Miss the Voice of God

Have you ever had a hard time discerning whether something was from God?

In a recent episode of The Jack Hibbs Podcast, [Pastor Jack Hibbs](#) tackled a question that resonates with every believer at some point: How do you know when God is speaking to you? Drawing from personal experience and the authority of Scripture, Hibbs offered insight, humor and conviction on how to discern God's voice in a noisy world.

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One of Hibbs' central points is that God speaks primarily through His Word. "God will never, never ever contradict His Word when He speaks," he explained. Citing Psalm 138, he reminded listeners that God esteems His Word even above His name, underscoring the trustworthiness of Scripture in helping believers [discern God's direction.](#)

He referenced Psalm 23 and Psalm 32 to emphasize how God leads His people: "The Lord is my shepherd... He leads me beside still waters" (Ps. 23) and "I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go. I will guide you with my eye" (Ps. 32:8).

Hibbs encouraged believers to train their spiritual ears: "Please make my heart sensitive, connected to my ears, that I might hear You when You speak."

But how does this [play out in everyday life?](#)

Hibbs shared a personal example of reading the book of Acts and then being reminded of a verse later in the day while walking through a mall. "Out of nowhere... the verse comes to my mind instantly... 'You shall receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you,'" he said, after seeing a Tesla display promoting "connection to power." For Hibbs, this wasn't coincidence but confirmation: "Guess what? I'm useless until

I'm powered up."

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Hibbs challenged the notion that a "good feeling" is enough to claim God's direction. "Can you imagine if SpaceX said, 'We've got a really good feeling about this' before a launch?" he asked.

Instead, he stressed the need to align decisions with God's Word and character, warning believers not to rely on emotional impulses alone.

He also highlighted the importance of [daily time in Scripture](#). "This is probably the number one area where Christians cause themselves to be anemic on a daily basis," he said. "We didn't consult the Lord in the morning—and then we wonder why the day has been so tough."

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God still speaks, but we must slow down, open His Word and train our ears to hear. It is only by sticking close to the still waters of God's voice through our time of prayer, reading and meditation on the Word of God that we can expect God to move in miraculous ways.

Katie Souza: Miracles Broke Out in Middle of Seattle Riots

In a stunning display of faith amid turmoil, Katie Souza and her ministry team took to the [streets of Seattle](#) during the MayDay event, bringing the message of Jesus Christ directly into a riot-torn atmosphere.

“We’re here to glorify Jesus Christ,” Souza declared. “We’re here to pull our kids out of a demonic agenda, and everyone is together.” As protests raged and police moved in, Souza’s team remained focused on their mission: worship, prayer and prophetic outreach.

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Amid the growing tension between protesters and law enforcement, Souza emphasized the true battle being waged—one not of flesh and blood, but of spiritual forces.

Seeing the brokenness of the people around in need of Christ, Souza opened up about her own harrowing past of what Christ saved her from.

“I was molested and sexually assaulted...I became a career criminal. I went to prison. I ended up going to federal prison and getting sentenced to 12 and a half years. You know why? Because I’m like you. I would be the one that was protesting. I would be the one that was doing the violence.”

But in the [heart of the chaos](#), miracles began to unfold.

A woman stepped forward to testify that she had metal in her shoulder and couldn’t raise her arm.

“What was your level of pain?” Souza asked. “An eight,” the woman replied. But in a moment of prayer and praise, she began lifting her arm freely. “Could you do that before? ... Doesn’t hurt when you do it?” Souza exclaimed in awe as the woman demonstrated full movement. “You are zero. She said zero. Zero. Come on. Oh, we have to give God a praise right now for what he’s doing!”

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Souza and her team also reached out to individuals one-on-one, offering prayer and prophetic encouragement.

One such encounter involved a 60-year-old man who spoke with one of her team members. “He said he didn’t believe in God or anything,” he recounted. “I just told him like, ‘Hey, I believe in the spirit of God. I believe in the Holy Spirit. I believe he can talk to you right now if you accept him in your heart.’” The man teared up and responded, “I wish I’d met more Christians like you.”

What unfolded in Seattle was more than a protest or a rally, it was a collision between darkness and light, and the light prevailed. Amid spiritual oppression, hostility and brokenness, the presence of God brought healing, deliverance and a message of hope. Even in the most unlikely places, revival can erupt, lives can be transformed and the kingdom of

God can advance.

This decision comes just days after Faith Live said that they were canceling the Newsboys tour after the "'lack of interest' and mounting questions came as a direct result of [Michael](#)

[Tait's](#) unexpected departure, which we were not informed of in advance." They also noted that the "handling of the transition lacked clarity and transparency, leaving both our team and the public in a difficult position."

Christians Are Under Attack: 3 Spirits Silently Destroying Your Faith

If you're feeling weary, hopeless or tempted to give up entirely, you're not alone.

According to evangelist Perry Stone, nine out of 10 believers will wrestle with at least one of [three spiritual attacks](#)—fainting, hopelessness or despair—at some point in their walk with God.

“These are the three spirits that I saw in my own spirit by revelation that are attacking people in the body of Christ,” Stone explained. While these spirits can affect anyone, the teaching focuses on how they specifically target believers and how to fight back spiritually.

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1. The Fainting Spirit

The first spirit identified is what Stone calls a “fainting spirit.” It doesn't refer to physically passing out, but to becoming spiritually weary and emotionally exhausted.

“You lose motivation,” he says. “You have no motivation to go to church. You have no motivation to pray. You have no motivation to read the Bible.”

To [overcome this evil spirit](#), Stone advises believers to, “Feed your spirit. I put gospel music on and sing with it... I listen to that and it builds me up. I can feel the quickening of the Holy Spirit in me.” He also encourages rest—both physically and spiritually—and warns against letting negative

information “defile your spirit.”

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2. The Spirit of Hopelessness

The second spirit is rooted in Proverbs 13:12: “Hope deferred makes the soul sick.” Stone describes this as a prolonged delay that causes people to give up believing for a good outcome.

“Hope means unseen positive expectation about the future... the anticipation for the good outcome.” When hope is delayed or drawn out for too long, it becomes like a hostage situation: “You start saying, this could turn out bad. This is not going [to turn out good.](#)”

But hope is powerful: “As long as people have hope... they expect good and they fight in faith.” He shares from personal experience: “There are times in my life when I’ve gone through things... and I knew in my spirit... hang on to your hope. And in every instance... God did something.”

3. The Spirit of Despair and Suicide

The final and most dangerous spirit is one of deep despair, often leading to suicidal thoughts. “When a person feels hopeless that there’s no hope in this situation, you’ll usually see them go on drugs or alcohol or begin to talk about taking their own life,” he warned.

Drawing from biblical examples like King Saul and Judas, Stone shows how despair can become deadly. But there is hope even in

the darkest hour. The message? Never give up on God. “God can do something in like 24 hours the next morning and He has [reversed a situation](#),” says Stone. “Do not do it. This is about eternity. This is not about the temporary. This is about the forever... Prayer can change the outcome. Hold on to God.”

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In this critical hour, believers must recognize the unseen battles waging against their hearts and minds.

These spirits are not just emotional struggles, but strategic attacks meant to derail destinies and silence faith. Now more than ever, we must stay spiritually vigilant, intentionally feed our spirit and cling to the hope that anchors the soul.

Victory is not only possible—it’s promised to those who refuse to quit.
