

# God's First Command to You: Most Christians Miss This!

What is God's purpose for your life? According to [Rabbi Schneider](#), the answer is found at the very beginning of Scripture.

In Genesis 1:28, God blesses humanity and gives a foundational command: "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it; and rule over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the sky and over every living thing that moves on the earth."

This passage, Rabbi Schneider explains, reveals two primary aspects of God's will for His people: to increase and to rule. These aren't mere suggestions—they are the [Creator's original instructions](#) to humanity, and they still apply today. "God's plan for you is to increase," he says, highlighting that this increase includes, but goes far beyond, physical reproduction.

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God's desire is for His people to grow—not only in number, but in character, influence, and spiritual capacity. Life with God is meant to be dynamic, not static. Rabbi Schneider emphasizes that every day, month and year of a believer's life is an opportunity for increase. Growth is not just possible; it is the divine expectation.

The call to rule, he explains, does not mean domination in the worldly sense. Rather, it reflects a spiritual authority rooted in God's presence. [Humanity was created to act](#) as God's

ambassadors on the earth—stewards of His creation and representatives of His kingdom. To rule means to bring order, life and godly influence into the world around us.

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This calling to multiply and rule carries through the entire narrative of Scripture. In the New Testament, Jesus echoes the same commission in spiritual terms: “Go into all the world and preach this gospel to all creation, to every nation, making disciples of all nations.” The mission remains the same—reproduce and [\*\*bring God’s rule to the earth.\*\*](#)

[\*\*Rabbi Schneider\*\*](#) also touches on the traditional Jewish understanding of this command. Among Orthodox Jews, having children is seen as one of the greatest mitzvot—a fulfillment of God’s first command. For some, this even takes on redemptive meaning as they see each new child as a way of repopulating the Jewish people after the horrors of the Holocaust.

But physical fruitfulness is only part of the story. Spiritual fruitfulness—reproducing the nature and character of God in ourselves and others—is central to this mandate. As believers grow in the Spirit, denying the flesh and choosing God’s ways, they are transformed. “Our spirit in us is expanding,” Rabbi Schneider says. “We’re continually being transformed from glory to glory and from strength to strength.”

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Even in old age, this fruitfulness doesn’t stop. Though the outer man may decay, the inner person can still be renewed daily. In this way, believers continue to bear fruit and walk in spiritual dominion. They carry God’s light into dark places, shifting atmospheres and planting seeds of the kingdom

wherever they go.

By embracing the call to increase and rule, believers step into the fullness of their God-given identity and purpose—fulfilling the very first command ever spoken by the Creator.

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# Death Contracts, Slander and Spiritual Warfare: What Every Believer Must Prepare for in May 2025

The book of Ephesians couldn't be more accurate: We do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities and powers not of this world.

In a recent message, [Katie Souza](#) shared a sobering revelation about spiritual attacks believers may be facing in 2025, almost as though it was the “year of the assassins.” According to Souza, “The enemy has a plan to take out the people in the body of Christ.”

These attacks aren't just physical, but spiritual, often manifesting through slander, gossip and character assassination. “When people are slandering and becoming assassins by assassinating your character, their words and their actions are empowering special forces unit demons to carry out death contracts on you.”

Now, as we enter into this new month, this is the time to tackle these issues head on and break the power of bondage that has been a reality for [so many believers](#) this year.

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Souza explains that “death and life are in the power of the tongue,” referencing Proverbs 18:21. Words, especially those spoken carelessly, can release “death contracts” that lead to harm in the spiritual realm. she goes on to cite Matthew 5:21-22, where Jesus warns, “Anyone who is so much as angry with a brother or sister is guilty of murder.” This scripture emphasizes the seriousness of using words to destroy others’ reputations, as it spiritually empowers forces working against the body of Christ.

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The message serves as a wake-up call for believers to be cautious with their words and actions. “The simple moral fact is that words kill.” Souza further warns, “If you carelessly call your brother an idiot... you are on the brink of hellfire,” highlighting the weight of character assassination.

However, there is hope and spiritual recourse. She reminds us that “you have legal recourse in this hour against this slander,” pointing to the ability to stand in the courts of heaven and break the spiritual contracts that slanderous words have created. Souza also mentions the consequences for those who engage in harmful behavior: “Whoever [digs a pit](#) for another man’s feet shall fall into it himself.”

Now is the moment for both repentance and forgiveness in order to experience new spiritual life. She also encourages believers to remember their righteousness in Christ, declaring, "In the way of righteousness, there is no death."

Despite the challenges ahead, Souza assures believers that "this is the year of vindication," where God will restore and honor those who remain steadfast in their faith and continue to walk in integrity.

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As we enter May 2025, it is crucial for believers to recognize the spiritual battles being waged in the unseen realm. The enemy is using tactics like slander, gossip and character assassination to release death contracts against God's people. However, there is hope and victory in Christ.

This is a season of divine vindication, where God is calling His people to rise above the attacks and walk in authority, knowing that they have the power to break every death contract and overcome the schemes of the enemy. By standing firm in faith, praying in the Spirit and keeping our hearts pure, we can see the boomerang effect of these attacks turn back upon the enemy.

May we remain steadfast, trusting that God will honor His promises and lead us into a season of restoration, elevation, and supernatural victory.

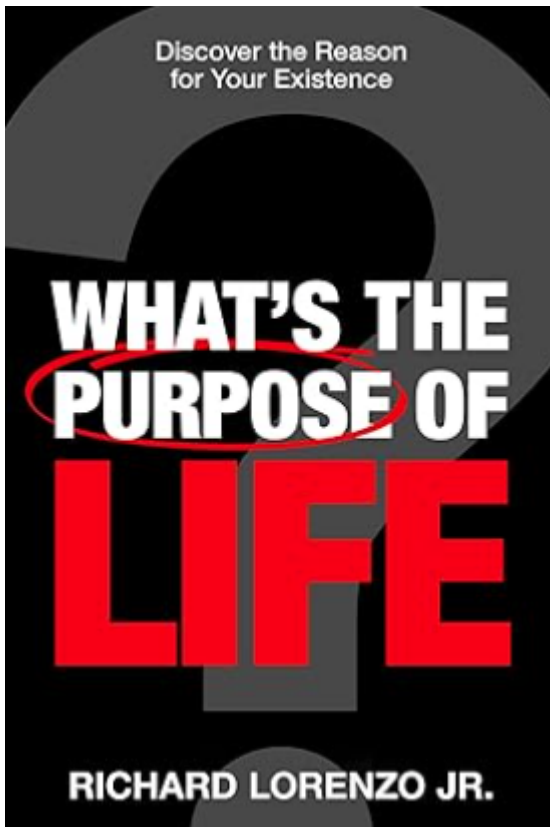

As the team prayed, the power of God fell and the girls began speaking in tongues right in the middle of the McDonald's.

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The scene left customers and staff in awe. Though asked to leave once they finished, it was clear something supernatural had taken place.

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## **Christians Are Using New Age Language—And Most Don't Even Realize It**

In today's culture, many believers find themselves drawn to conversations that merge entrepreneurship, personal development and spirituality. Yet in this pursuit, a line often blurs between genuine biblical truth and the subtle distortions of New Age ideology.

For Christians seeking to go deeper in faith while remaining engaged in the marketplace, it is crucial to discern the difference between divine truth and the counterfeits the world presents.

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In an episode of [Kap Chatfield's](#) Directed Life podcast, Taylor Welch from The Deep End expressed how the New Age warps and manipulates people just enough away from the truth of God's Word, including Christians.

### **The Call to Build Without Compromise**

There is a growing hunger among believers who want more than surface-level Christianity. These individuals love God, yet also feel called to build, create and innovate. They long to explore the deeper things of the Spirit, but without compromising their convictions or stepping into deception. In their search, they sometimes encounter teachings or platforms that raise questions—especially when terms like “manifestation,” “frequency” or “vibes” are used. The key is not to immediately reject these topics, but to examine their origins and see whether they align with the Word of God.

### **The Counterfeit and the Original**

Many ideas found in the New Age—such as the power of words, visualization or energy—are actually rooted in biblical principles but have been hijacked, stripped of their connection to Christ, and rebranded as mystical or secular truths, [according to Welch](#) and Chatfield.

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For example, manifestation, when rightly understood, reflects [God's creative design](#). Humanity was made in His image, with the ability to speak life and create change through faith. But when Jesus is removed from the equation, these same principles become spiritually dangerous and lead to counterfeit power that opens the door to deception.

## **Redeeming What Was Stolen**

For those who have come out of the New Age, sensitivity to such topics is understandable. Like an addict avoiding a relapse, it's wise to steer clear of past strongholds. However, that doesn't mean the church should ignore or discard spiritual truths that have been misused. Instead, Christians are called to redeem them by restoring Christ to His rightful place as the source and center of all spiritual authority.

At the heart of this discernment is a relationship with the Holy Spirit. What may be permissible for one person might not be for another, depending on their maturity and season of life. Wisdom requires nuance. The Holy Spirit leads individuals differently, but the ultimate guide remains constant: Jesus. He is not a religious idea confined to [church culture](#) but the living God who desires to be known in every sphere—including business, science and personal growth.

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As believers, we must anchor ourselves in the unshakable truth of God's Word and be vigilant against any influence that mimics His power but denies His Lordship. The enemy is subtle, often disguising deception in language that sounds spiritual, positive and even biblical. But if we are not discerning, we risk aligning with a counterfeit spirit that leads us away from God's purposes.

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# Amanda Grace Connects the Dots: Pope's Death, Pentecost and a Fiery Spiritual Window

The timeframe between Passover and Pentecost just may be even more significant this year than it ever has been.

"It has an agricultural cycle and then the spiritual journey," [Amanda Grace](#) explains. "Between Passover and Shavuot or Passover and Pentecost, [it marks] a period that has quite a bit of anticipation and spiritual preparation."

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This year, that anticipation has intensified as global and spiritual events unfold within the same window. "Shavuot this year... begins June first and ends June third. Now Pentecost this year is June eighth," says Grace.

Significantly, Pope Francis died on Passover [and] Easter Monday—an event believed to be far from coincidence. "So we have within this window... the pope's death... Trump meets with Zelensky at the Vatican... a new pope will be chosen... [and] an enormous explosion at a major Iranian port," she says.

Grace believes that the prophetic symbolism of a major shift happening within the Vatican could potentially even relate back to [a dream she had in 2018](#).

"The Lord had given me a dream—He took me [under the Vatican](#). There was a bunch of catacombs and underground tunnels, and there were witches, warlocks, court jesters, and every unclean

thing in this dream. And actually one of the witches was disappearing and reappearing—could make themselves invisible—and tried to grab me. And a force that had to have been almighty God threw them literally off of me when they tried to grab my foot... when I was being navigated through this area,” she recalls.

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Adding to the spiritual intrigue is the release of the film *Conclave* in October 2024, just before the U.S. elections. The movie, written by Peter Straughan, explores a secretive papal election following the sudden death of a pope, involving “political maneuvering, personal secrets, emerging scandals.” The film’s fictional pope, Innocent XVI, is revealed to be intersex—a fact accepted by the late pope and kept secret.

“This is what they want to do... brings the LGBTQ+ transgender agenda in... combines it with the Catholic church,” she says, suggesting the film is a strategic cultural message. “The enemy will always try and label something the opposite of what it is... make you believe this is innocent.”

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As [Amanda Grace](#) lays out the prophetic significance of the events unfolding between Passover and Pentecost, the convergence of timelines—both biblical and global—suggests that we are on the brink of seismic spiritual shifts.

With the death of Pope Francis, the rise of a new pontiff and deeply symbolic dates like the Second Passover and Pentecost

aligning within a rare 50-day window, the stage appears set for massive changes—not only within the Catholic Church, but potentially across the global body of Christ. As she connects dreams, scripture and current events, Grace’s insights compel believers to watch, pray and discern the times—because what happens in this prophetic window may ripple through the church in ways we’ve never seen before.

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## **Are You Secretly Prophetic? 4 Signs You Might Have a Hidden Gift!**

Do you believe you have a prophetic gift that needs to be unlocked?

In a recent video by [Pastor Mike Signorelli](#), he discussed how believers can discern whether or not they may have a prophetic gift that the Lord is calling them to learn how to utilize properly.

### **Sign #1: You Sense What Others Miss**

The first sign of a prophetic calling is the ability to “sense what others miss.” As Signorelli says, “It’s almost like obvious to you, but then you say it to other people and they’re like, ‘I didn’t even pick up on that at all’.” Prophetic individuals often feel deeply and discern atmospheres that others overlook. This is not just intuition, but a spiritual gift in action.

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The Bible speaks to this in 1 Samuel 16:7, saying, “For the Lord sees not as man sees. Man looks on the outward appearance, but the Lord looks on the heart.” When your eyes are opened prophetically, you begin to see the unseen, much like the prophet Samuel was mentored by Eli in recognizing God’s voice.

### **Sign #2: You Dream, See or Hear Spiritually**

Signorelli points to dreams and visions with prophetic accuracy as one of the ways of being able to tell that you have a prophetic calling on your life. This is one of the ways the Lord has confirmed to Signorelli of his own prophetic giftings.

“I had a dream one time that I went to go look at a venue... I described it in detail... Sure enough, we open the door. Everything’s laid out exactly like I said,” Signorelli says.

Whether through dreams or visions, God communicates with His prophets to reveal His plans. If you’ve had dreams or visions that later came true, this is a [powerful indicator](#) of a prophetic gifting.

### **Sign #3: You Can’t Stay Silent About What God Is Saying**

The third sign is the inability to stay silent about what God is speaking to you.

“I had a dream about one of our leaders. I saw infidelity. I saw financial impropriety. I saw all this stuff going on. And I’m like, ‘Lord, is this me? Am I crazy?’” But when he

followed up with a mentor, the confirmation came: “It was all happening behind the scenes.”

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Signorelli’s obedience to deliver the prophetic word led to both a difficult but necessary confrontation. As Jeremiah 20:9 states, “His word is in my heart like a fire, a fire shut up in my bones, and I’m weary of holding it in.” This deep urge to speak God’s message is a hallmark of prophetic calling.

#### **Sign #4: You Experience Loneliness Before Activation**

Such insight can feel burdensome, especially when others don’t understand it. “When you’re prophetic, sometimes you feel weird,” he says. “You feel different, you feel like you don’t fit in.” But this is not a flaw—it’s often part of God’s design. “Sometimes you feel isolated before you’re activated.”

Those with a prophetic gift often experience [deep seasons of isolation](#). It’s not uncommon to feel misunderstood, rejected, or even abandoned after receiving a word from the Lord.

This sense of aloneness can be confusing, especially when a powerful revelation is followed by silence or darkness. But this isolation is not a sign of failure; it’s part of God’s process. Being set apart is often necessary so the prophetic voice can be refined, tested, and matured away from the noise and expectations of others.

The wilderness isn’t meant to break the prophetic person—it’s meant to build them, anchoring their trust in God alone before the fulfillment of the vision ever comes to pass.

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In the end, the prophetic journey is not just about delivering

a word—it's about becoming the kind of vessel that can carry it with integrity, endurance and faith. The process may be painful, marked by hidden seasons and testing fires, but it's all part of God's intentional preparation.

When the word finally comes to pass, it won't just be a moment of fulfillment—it will be a testimony of God's faithfulness and the shaping of a messenger who didn't give up. For those walking through the quiet valleys after a loud revelation, take heart: God sees, God knows and in due time, He will bring it to light.

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In addition to trauma, other open doors include involvement in the occult, unforgiveness or persistent sin. These behaviors or experiences invite spiritual forces into a person's life, often without them realizing it. It's crucial for believers to recognize these open doors and close them through repentance, prayer and spiritual warfare. When we understand how demons gain access, we can be proactive in protecting ourselves and others from spiritual attack.

### **The Role of Discernment in Deliverance**

Discernment plays a crucial role in identifying whether someone's struggles are rooted in spiritual oppression or if they stem from a physical or mental health issue. In today's world, with increasing diagnoses of mental illness and the widespread use of medication, it can be difficult to distinguish between a spiritual issue and a medical one. However, the Bible teaches that spiritual forces are at work behind many of the struggles people face.

While medical professionals focus on the physical and mental aspects of health, deliverance ministry addresses the spiritual root. Deliverance does not replace medical care but works in tandem with it, targeting the unseen [spiritual influences](#) that may be affecting a person's well-being. This discernment helps believers address the true source of a person's struggles, whether they are mental, emotional or spiritual in nature.

### **Closing the Doors to Demonic Influence**

The good news is that demons can be expelled and their access to a person's life can be closed. Believers have the authority

in Christ to close the doors to demonic influence, reclaiming the spiritual ground that has been taken. 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## **Jonathan Cahn Reveals the Nehemiah Strategy: Confidence, Calling and Combat**

What do you do when the enemy attacks your calling?

In a message to his Beth-Israel congregation, Jonathan Cahn provided the steps and the strategies to fight against the enemy when he tries to attack your confidence in Christ.

“You've got a calling—[fight for it](#). You've got something God

gave you—a ministry—fight for it. You’ve got a marriage—fight for it. You have a family—fight for it. You have purity in your life—fight for it. Protect it,” Cahn says.

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These stirring words echo the heart of Nehemiah’s story and speak directly to every believer navigating the battles of life and ministry.

Drawing from the biblical account of Nehemiah, Cahn’s message is clear: God’s people must build and battle at the same time.

“Those who were rebuilding the wall and those who carried burdens carried with one hand doing the work, building, the other hand holding a weapon.”

The Christian walk is not a passive path but one of purpose, strength and resistance. “You cannot build if you’re not fighting, and if you’re fighting, you must build,” he notes.

The strategy of the [enemy is consistent](#)—create confusion, stir up doubt and shake your confidence. “The enemies of God always try to take away your confidence in God and stop the purposes.”

However, in Nehemiah’s time, the people prevailed. “It says the enemies of God all lost their confidence.” The key? Confidence not in self, but in God. “Confidence means with faith. If you have faith, you are to be confident—not of you, but in God and in His work,” Cahn says.

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Confidence is essential to [fulfilling God's call](#). "God wants you confident in His Word. He doesn't want you doubting. He wants you confident in His promise, confident in His calling, confident in what He gave you." Even in failure, the anchor is His faithfulness: "If I mess up, I'm confident not in me—I'm confident in Him."

Every believer has a role. "Don't say you don't have a part, and don't say you have a lesser part, because everyone has a part that is precious to God." And when you question your qualification, remember: "You can't be underqualified for your calling. The only thing that qualifies you in God is that you're not qualified—but His grace makes you qualified."

When opposition comes, take it straight to God, "We prayed to our God, and because of them, we set up a guard against them day and night." The response is both [spiritual and practical](#)—pray and act.

Lastly, Cahn points out that we are not to become consumed by conflict. "Don't get wrapped up in the junk... stay constructive, stay in the construction business." Nehemiah didn't let opposition distract him from the mission. Neither should we. "Move on, move on—because then the enemy is lost."

Where you focus matters. "Your eyes are only in one direction... your eyes and your feet go together. What you are looking at is where you will go in your life." Set your eyes forward and keep building.

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"Focus not on the enemy—focus on your Friend. Be aware of the enemy... but move on with the kingdom of God."

No matter what life throws at us, we can confidently keep our

eyes on Christ and trust that He will do every good work within us, bringing everything He starts into completion, despite any opposition we may face.

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## **Prophetic Signs Hidden in the Kentucky Derby? Amanda Grace Points to Spiritual Meaning Behind the Race**

Could there be prophetic signs even with the Kentucky Derby about the times we're living in?

A recent prophetic message highlights what some believe are spiritual signs embedded within one of America's biggest sporting events—[the Kentucky Derby](#). According Amanda Grace, events in the natural world, including horse races, can reflect deeper movements in the spiritual realm.

This year, the Derby is unfolding alongside another major event: [the election of the 267th pope](#). "I don't think that's an accident," says Amanda Grace. "It's the race for the 267th pope and if you add that up you get the number 15." The number 15 recurs prophetically, with another appearance in Canada's recent liberal party victory—"the liberal party won 168 seats, if you add that together you also get 15."

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Two horses in this prophetic race stand out: American Promise and Render Judgment. “In the number five position is a horse by the name of American Promise. His sire is Justify, who won the Triple Crown in 2018—“seven years ago Donald Trump was president... seven years later, here is Donald Trump as president again with Justify’s offspring.”

According to Grace, the pairing of names is telling: “The Lord justified the promise to America,” she says, connecting Trump’s election with biblical implications.

However, there is another horse in the running owned by country music artist, Toby Keith, named Render Judgment.

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“Render Judgment is also in the Kentucky Derby this year,” Grace says. His sire is named Blame: “When blame is cast, judgment is rendered.”

So, what could this all mean from a prophetic standpoint?

“This is a theme right of judgment being rendered with the Vatican, with [what’s coming in Canada](#),” Grace says.

Regarding Canada’s new leader she says: “Mark Carney gets put into term... his name means dedicated to Mars as a champion.” Mars, the Roman god of war, draws a direct connection to the Vatican—“Roman, Roman. Remember this. [Where is the Vatican?](#) Rome.”

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These prophetic connections surrounding the Kentucky Derby, the Vatican and international political shifts suggest that we are witnessing a convergence of spiritual and natural events. From horses like American Promise and Render Judgment to the elevation of new leaders whose names carry symbolic weight, each element appears to carry a message—pointing toward covenant, justice and the clash between kingdoms.

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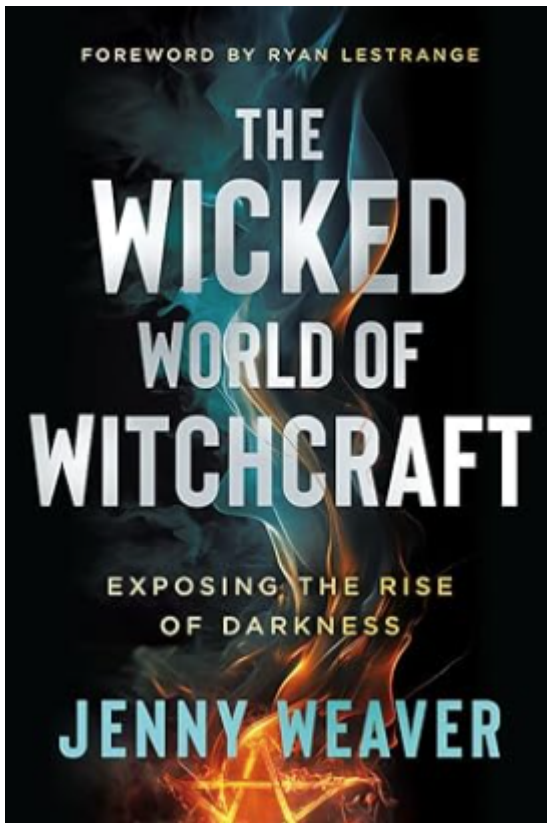
“When someone says, ‘I have a bad temper, I’m just an Aries, or I can’t help being impulsive; this is who I am, or I’m born
