Now is the time for the body of Christ to be on high alert when it comes to honing in on listening to the voice of the Holy Spirit.

In a recent message, Richard Lorenzo Jr. urged the body of Christ to discern spiritual challenges and embrace God's process of refinement. "Some people are not discerning you spiritually, they're diagnosing your suffering," he says, emphasizing that God tests believers' faith to make it stronger. "The Bible says He takes our faith and puts it through a fire... so it comes out stronger than it was before."

However, while many are being refined for greatness, the church today has become a breeding ground for people to question the success of others. In our current culture, it almost seems as though many would prefer to see believers fall into scandal and sin than to see them raised up and redeemed by God. This "Pharisee spirit," as Lorenzo explains, focuses on others' failures instead of their spiritual growth.

"The Pharisees were spiritual bounty hunters chasing failures and not souls," Lorenzo says. He encourages believers to focus on winning souls rather than engaging in competition. "When you start winning souls... there's going to be people as you're chasing souls, they're going to be chasing your failures."

This Pharisee spirit is rooted in jealousy and competition. "Your destiny exposes their delay," he says. Lorenzo observes that some people might secretly be "waiting for your downfall" due to envy, especially when others seem to advance quickly in their spiritual journey. "When people see you moving quickly in Christ... people will try to latch on to eat from your fruit," he says.

However, these jealous spirits are opposite God's heart for redemption. "God is not looking for a reason to judge you. He's looking for a reason to redeem you," Lorenzo says.

He stresses that God's grace and love are abundant, pointing out, "God is extremely gracious... He gives people time to repent because He loves and He is love." Lorenzo likens God's intentions to those of a loving father: "Think about a father who loves their son... they want to see their children win."

Just as God wants to see us win, the true heart of a disciple of Christ should be to see others flourish in their walk with God.

This is a powerful reminder for Christians to prioritize their spiritual growth, trust in God's redemptive process and rise above the distractions of jealousy and competition. It calls believers to stand firm in their faith, embrace God's testing and support one another in their journey toward fulfilling their destiny—always remembering that God's heart is for restoration, not condemnation.

In an electrifying conversation on "Happening Now," Pastor Jack Hibbs and conservative commentator Charlie Kirk dove deep into one of the most pressing questions of our time: Is America running toward Christianity?

America's Foundational Principles

Kirk and Hibbs were adamant—America was not designed as a democracy in the modern sense, but as a republic rooted in biblical principles. They vigorously challenged the widely held belief that democracy is the cornerstone of the nation, instead underscoring the unique vision of the Constitution as a document that secures God-given rights rather than mere majority rule. This distinction, they argued, is essential for understanding the nation's true identity.

The Shift Among Young Voters

Kirk offered eye-opening data showing a significant shift

among younger generations, especially young men, toward conservatism. He attributed this trend to the power of digital platforms like TikTok and YouTube, where young people are being exposed to unfiltered truths that counterbalance the prevailing leftist ideologies. This shift represents a growing rejection of the progressive agenda, particularly among Gen Z, who are increasingly questioning the narratives they've been taught.

Part of this shift is because of the alarming rise of depression, anxiety and suicide among America's youth. Both Kirk and Hibbs pinpointed the root cause—an absence of biblical truth. Without a solid foundation in Scripture, young people are adrift in a secular world that offers no answers to life's most profound questions. The education system, they noted, only deepens the confusion by promoting relativism instead of truth. The result is a generation grappling with an overwhelming identity crisis who are now seeking change.

Masculinity and Leadership

Kirk emphasized that strong, godly men are essential for shaping the culture in a positive direction. Young men, he said, are increasingly drawn to churches that uphold biblical masculinity—men who understand their God-ordained roles as leaders in the home, church and society. This resurgence of biblical masculinity, they argued, is vital to restoring order and strength to both the family and the nation.

“Young men are gravitating toward this broader cultural realignment but it is at its core spiritual,” Kirk says.

The Church's Role in Society

As the two pointed out, now is the moment that the church must help guide this next generation into this realignment with biblical principles. Hibbs and Kirk called on pastors to reclaim the prophetic voice of the church and boldly speak the truth—even when it's unpopular. Hibbs pointed to past revival movements, particularly the Jesus Movement, as a blueprint for how the church, when steadfast in its commitment to biblical truth, can lead a culture-shaping revival.

They urged believers to engage in the cultural battle, speak truth boldly and take an active role in reclaiming America for Christ. The church, they argued, cannot afford to remain silent or passive in the face of moral decay and spiritual confusion.

The Political and Spiritual Battle

Drawing a powerful parallel between former President Donald Trump and King Josiah of the Bible, Hibbs suggested that America needs leaders who are unafraid to call the nation back to God.

“Here's what's fun about being a believer who knows their Bible at a time like this,” Hibbs says. “I'm reminded that how God used King Josiah is how God's using Donald Trump and this cabinet.”

The nation's future hinges not only on the right policies but also on a spiritual revival that brings the country back to

its moral and spiritual roots. Could Trump's presidency provide those elements?

Will the Church Rise to the Challenge?

As this timely conversation demonstrates, the stakes could not be higher. The future of America depends on whether the next generation embraces the truth of the gospel and whether the church boldly defends it in the public square. The hour is late, but the opportunity for revival has never been greater.

In a powerful teaching, Pastor Vlad Savchuk unpacks the critical conditions that must be met for believers to be truly led by the Holy Spirit. Many desire divine guidance, yet few experience it because they overlook the biblical principles that position them to receive it.

“The Holy Spirit desires to lead all believers, but certain conditions must be met before we can be effectively led by Him,” Savchuk says.

Below are the seven keys to being guided by the Holy Spirit.

1. Surrender to God's Will

A heart that clings to its own plans will struggle to hear the Spirit's voice. Jesus modeled surrender in Luke 22:42, saying, "Not My will, but Yours be done." True guidance begins when we lay down our agenda and allow the Holy Spirit to direct our steps.

"If you really want the Holy Spirit to lead you, you've got to come with a blank slate, a blank page. Let Him write on you," Savchuk says. "Don't come already with the made-up ideas of what you want to do."

2. Willingness to Obey

Hearing God's voice is meaningless if we refuse to act on His instructions. As 1 Samuel 15:22 reminds us, "Obedience is better than sacrifice." Philip in Acts 8 obeyed without hesitation, and as a result, he played a role in bringing the gospel to Ethiopia.

"Not only do you have to be surrendered, you've got to be willing to obey, not just willing to listen," he says.

3. Sensitivity to the Holy Spirit

Just as physical senses can become dulled, spiritual sensitivity can fade due to distractions, sin or a cluttered mind. Galatians 5:16 urges believers to "walk in the Spirit" and resist fleshly desires. Fasting, repentance and time in God's presence sharpen our ability to discern His leading.

Savchuk points out that the flesh tries to speak very loudly to us. However, the voice of the Lord comes in a still small voice many of times. This means we must continually sharpen

our senses to hearing the Lord's voice.

"Your sensitivities are like a knife. It can be sharpened or dull, and sometimes when you're not sensing the Holy Spirit's lead in your life, it is not that He has abandoned you per se, as much as you have gotten dull."

4. Walking by Faith, Not Sight

The Holy Spirit often gives us the destination without revealing the full roadmap. Abraham stepped out in faith, not knowing where he was going (see Hebrews 11:8). Likewise, we must trust God even when the details are unclear.

"Some people wait for the Holy Spirit to give them all the details, and then they will obey. But this is where faith comes in," Savchuk says. "That means, sometimes you got to move on the 'maybe' faith. You've got to move in spite of doubts."

5. Being Filled with the Holy Spirit

Ephesians 5:18 commands believers to be "filled with the Spirit." A Spirit-filled life produces clarity and boldness, making us more attuned to His direction.

The reality of what it takes to be led by the Holy Spirit is oftentimes quite basic and simple: we must be filled with Him.

"As you're being filled by the Holy Spirit, you become more conscious of the Holy Spirit, you become more aware of the Holy Spirit. So, if you want to be led by the Spirit, be filled by the Holy Spirit first because whatever you are filled with, you become led by," Savchuk points out.

6. Renewing the Mind Through God's Word

Romans 12:2 teaches that transformation comes through renewing

our minds. A carnal mind resists the Spirit, but a mind grounded in Scripture aligns with God's will. Each day we must pray for the Lord to renew our mind, to lead and guide our thought-life to focus on His truths found in Scripture, not on the things we see in the world around us.

"Your mind must be renewed with the truth of God," Savchuk says. "You got to renew it by not being conformed to this world, by allowing the Word of God to renew your thoughts, your mind, your pattern, break down the strongholds, bring healing into your soul. Then you will begin to be transformed and then you step into the God's perfect will."

7. Being Rooted in Scripture

Psalm 119:105 declares, "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." The Holy Spirit will never lead you in a way that contradicts the Bible. The deeper you immerse yourself in Scripture, the clearer His voice becomes. Since the Holy Spirit inspired the writing of Scripture, spending time in the Word aligns your heart with His guidance.

"He wants to be your guide in everything in your life. But God's Word must be a foundation," Savchuk notes.

The Holy Spirit longs to lead you, but He will not override your will. As Pastor Savchuk emphasizes, true guidance requires surrender, obedience, faith, and a mind immersed in God's Word. Position yourself today to be led by the Spirit!

Why Is Darkness Taking Over? Jesus Warned Us About This!

In a recent broadcast, Pastor Mike Signorelli shares a powerful prophetic word for the month of April, marking it as a season of both spiritual death and resurrection. "I believe there's going to be death of relationship. There's going to be death of position and title. Death of status. People are going to experience death in the month of April but

also Resurrection power and life, and you're going to see both."

Signorelli says that for many people who have felt confused, this is not meant to be a place of confusion, but rather the beginning of what's coming next.

"...unfamiliar is another way of saying the new is coming," Signorelli says.

While such shifts could feel disorienting, Signorelli urges his audience not to resist, but to trust in God's timing. Just as Jesus experienced death before His Resurrection, believers too would find that what was removed in this season is making way for something far greater.

Lock In Your Commitment: A Time for Spiritual Focus

One of the key elements of the prophecy is a call to spiritual commitment. "April is a time to lock in," Signorelli states emphatically. He encourages his followers to take their spiritual lives seriously, not to waver in their dedication to God and to pursue discipline in every area of life. Signorelli believes that the timeframe of March through May is critical for God to work on things in the spiritual realm and bring them all to completion. Therefore, dedication to the Lord is vital.

"There is going to be some things that you think are important, or rather the Lord says, were important in another season. And yet, the Lord will say to you, that it is not important anymore."

A Global Outpouring: Revival Fires Coming

Pastor Signorelli also prophesies that following Resurrection Sunday, there would be an outpouring of the Holy Spirit,

described as a “wildfire” that sweeps across churches, breaking through religious and denominational barriers. He sees revival fires spreading globally, with leaders rising up to lead with unprecedented authority and clarity.

“I will raise up leaders in nations now that know how to feed the sheep, that know how to provide for them,” Signorelli prophesies.

With divine disconnections and the resurrection of dreams and callings, this month offers a powerful opportunity for spiritual focus and renewed commitment. April is poised to be a pivotal month—one that requires believers to lock in, surrender to God’s plan and prepare for a supernatural shift that will impact both individuals and the global church.
