

King Charles' New Digital ID Vision Raises Questions About the Coming One-World System

Scientists Trigger 8,000 Earthquakes Beneath Swiss Alps in Shocking Experiment

Scientists working deep beneath the Swiss Alps are intentionally triggering tiny earthquakes as part of a

controversial effort to better understand how seismic events begin and spread.

According to a report from the Daily Mail, researchers in an underground laboratory beneath the Alps are conducting controlled experiments to observe fault activity in real time. By pumping water into rock formations deep underground, scientists can increase pressure along existing fault lines, causing small slips that generate micro-earthquakes.

The report states that researchers have already triggered approximately 8,000 tiny seismic events during the study.

Researchers believe the experiments could provide valuable insight into one of the greatest mysteries in earthquake science: what happens immediately before a quake begins.



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Because earthquakes occur naturally and often without warning, scientists typically can only analyze the aftermath of seismic events. The Swiss experiments are designed to allow researchers to study the process as it unfolds underground.

According to the Daily Mail, the goal is to understand better how pressure builds within faults, how ruptures spread and why some earthquakes remain minor while others become devastating.

The experiments are taking place roughly a mile beneath the surface inside a specialized underground research facility in Switzerland.

The article also notes that the research has sparked concern because of past examples of human-induced seismic activity connected to industrial operations such as fracking, wastewater injection and geothermal drilling.

Throughout Scripture, earthquakes often symbolize the overwhelming power of God and the fragility of the natural world. While researchers hope studies like this may one day improve earthquake preparedness and scientific understanding, the experiments beneath the Swiss Alps also underscore a deeper truth: even with advancing technology and growing scientific knowledge, mankind still cannot fully control the forces woven into creation itself.

After decades behind pulpits, on television broadcasts and at conferences around the world, Kenneth Copeland is inviting audiences into a more personal side of his life.

In the very first episode of the new Kenneth Copeland Podcast, the 89-year-old minister sat down with his granddaughter, Courtney Copeland Acuña, for a heartfelt conversation filled with stories about faith, marriage, ministry and the people who shaped his life.

‘You Wrap Your Heart Around It’

Copeland began the episode reflecting on God’s faithfulness and the strength he still carries as he approaches his 90th birthday.

“December the 6th I’ll be 90 years old,” Copeland said. “This morning I was able to get up early, get dressed, get on the treadmill, work out hard. I have to because it’s heart exercise.”

The conversation quickly shifted into stories from Copeland’s early years, including his brief music career in the 1950s and the lessons he learned about faith and prosperity after enrolling at Oral Roberts University in 1967 while carrying significant debt.

Referencing a recent discussion with Bryce Crawford about the prosperity message, Copeland said many people approach faith intellectually instead of spiritually.

“He kept saying, ‘I can’t wrap my mind around it,’” Copeland recalled. “You don’t wrap your mind around it, you wrap your heart around it.”

The Love Story That Changed Everything

One of the most touching portions of the podcast centered on how Copeland met his wife, Gloria Copeland.

He shared the now-famous story of meeting Gloria. After only one date, Copeland proposed.

"I just walked up on the porch," he said. "'Gloria, will you marry me?' 'Okay.'"

The couple recently celebrated 64 years of marriage.

When asked the secret to a strong marriage, Copeland did not hesitate.

"Base everything you do on the Word of God. Everything," he said.

He also emphasized the importance of prayer and unity in decision-making.

"Since January the 24th, 1967, she and I have never done anything without praying about it first," Copeland said.

Later in the conversation, he added another key to longevity in marriage: "Keep it on the Word of God and keep it in love."

Remembering Jerry Savelle

The tone of the episode became emotional as Copeland reflected on the loss of longtime friend and ministry partner Jerry Savelle.

"Yes, I do miss him," Copeland admitted quietly.

He recounted receiving the devastating phone call announcing Savelle's death. He said their friendship and ministry partnership spanned more than five decades.

A Legacy Still Speaking

While the episode included lighthearted moments and family memories, it also revealed something deeper: a minister looking back on a lifetime marked by prayer, covenant relationships and unwavering faith in God's promises.

Perhaps the clearest message from Copeland's first episode was simple: a life built on prayer, love and God's Word can leave a legacy that continues speaking for generations.

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Evangelical Leader Sparks Uproar After Comparing Trump and Pope Leo's Knowledge of Scripture

Pastor Robert Jeffress is stirring debate after publicly declaring that President Donald Trump has a "better

understanding” of biblical government than Pope Leo XIV amid rising tensions over Iran, war and the role of nations in confronting evil.

Speaking during a recent Fox News appearance, Jeffress defended Trump’s stance on military action and national security while criticizing the pope’s repeated calls for de-escalation and restraint.

According to The Independent, Jeffress said the pope was “sincerely wrong” in his interpretation of how nations should respond to threats like Iran.

The comments come during an increasingly public divide between Trump and Pope Leo XIV over foreign policy and military escalation in the Middle East.

Jeffress framed the issue as a distinction between the church’s mission and the government’s responsibility.

As conversations about biblical prophecy, wars and signs of the times continue to intensify across the church, John Bevere says many Christians may be focusing on the wrong question.

During a recent episode of the John Bevere Podcast, alongside his son, Arden Bevere, John challenged believers to shift their attention away from obsessing over the timing of Christ’s return and to focus instead on spiritual preparation.

“Most believers are fascinated about when Jesus is going to return,” he said. “What I find to be much more important is being ready for when He returns.”

‘His Bride Has Prepared Herself’

Drawing from Revelation 19, Bevere compared the church to a bride preparing for her wedding day. While many Christians study signs of the times, he said Scripture places greater emphasis on readiness and holiness.

“The marriage of the Lamb has come and His wife ... has made herself ready,” Bevere quoted from Scripture before emphasizing, “This does not say that God made her ready. She has made herself ready.”

Using the imagery of ancient Jewish weddings, Bevere explained how brides would spend months preparing themselves while waiting for the groom’s return.

“Can you imagine if the bride ... spent all her time trying to figure out which night he was going to surprise her?” he asked. “She neglects to make her wedding dress. She neglects to pack her trunks.”

According to Bevere, many believers today are similarly distracted by speculation while neglecting spiritual maturity.

The Role of the Holy Spirit in Preparation

Throughout the conversation, Arden pressed deeper into what practical preparation actually looks like for believers.

“What is that preparation look like for me?” Arden asked, noting that many new Christians may not understand how to grow spiritually.

John Bevere pointed to two essentials: the Word of God and the Holy Spirit.

“He washes her with the water of the Word,” Bevere said. “But how can He wash me with His Word if I don’t spend time in His Word?”

He also described the Holy Spirit as the believer’s “guarantee,” comparing Him to an engagement ring given in preparation for Christ’s return.

“When I open up my Bible, I don’t want to read that Bible without His help,” Bevere said. “A teacher answers questions.”

‘Remain in Fellowship With Christ’

One of the strongest moments in the discussion came when Bevere addressed the fear of God and remaining spiritually faithful even during difficult seasons.

Quoting 1 John 2:28, he warned believers that Christians will either stand before Jesus with confidence or shame at His return.

“Remain in fellowship with Christ so that when He returns, you will be full of courage and you’ll not shrink back in shame,” Bevere said.

He also warned that modern Western Christianity has often minimized obedience and holiness.

“Our Western Christianity has really clouded this very important truth,” Bevere said. “Those who obey God’s commandments remain in fellowship with Him.”

As spiritual deception grows in the last days, Bevere urged believers to remain rooted in Scripture, to be sensitive to the Holy Spirit, and to be committed to genuine intimacy with Christ.

In an era increasingly fascinated with prophecy charts and end-times speculation, Bevere’s message was simple yet sobering: the greatest question is not whether believers can identify the season of Christ’s return—but whether the church will be spiritually ready when the King finally comes.

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Christian Leader Prays Over Massive Gold Trump Statue, Igniting Idolatry Debate

A massive gold-colored statue of President Donald Trump is stirring intense national debate after a public dedication and prayer ceremony at Trump National Doral Miami drew accusations

of political idolatry from critics across social media and Christian circles alike.

According to The Christian Post, Pastor Mark Burns strongly rejected comparisons between the statue and the golden calf described in Exodus 32, insisting that Christians involved in the event worship “the Lord Jesus Christ and Him alone.”

The towering 22-foot monument, reportedly covered in gold leaf and nicknamed the “Don Colossus,” depicts Trump raising his fist after surviving the 2024 assassination attempt in Butler, Pennsylvania. Burns participated in a public blessing ceremony surrounding the unveiling, which quickly ignited online backlash.

“This is not a golden calf,” Burns said, according to The Christian Post. “We worship the Lord Jesus Christ and Him alone.”

Burns defended the ceremony as patriotic rather than spiritual worship, saying the statue was meant to symbolize perseverance, courage and what many supporters believe was God’s protection over Trump during the assassination attempt.

Still, critics argued the imagery was deeply troubling.

Videos and photos from the event spread rapidly online, with many Christians expressing concern over ministers publicly praying around a giant gold statue tied to a political figure. Some pointed directly to the biblical account in Exodus, where the Israelites fashioned a golden calf while waiting for Moses to return from Mount Sinai.

Others defended the tribute, arguing that statues honoring political leaders or historical figures are common in American culture and do not automatically constitute idol worship.

Scripture repeatedly warns us about the deceptive nature of idolatry. Idols are not always carved images sitting in ancient temples. Often, they are the things people exalt, defend and prioritize above obedience to God.

Power can become an idol.

Influence can become an idol.

Political movements, personalities and even patriotism can slowly begin to occupy a place in the heart that belongs to Christ alone.

The danger of idolatry is not merely outward – it is spiritual. An idol is anything that competes with God for affection, trust, reverence or identity.

The biblical warning remains as urgent now as it was in Exodus: “You shall have no other gods before Me.” Anything that attempts to rival God’s rightful place in our hearts must be torn down before it quietly becomes an idol.

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What Happens Before Death?

New Study Reveals Stunning Brain Activity During Unconsciousness

A new neuroscience study is raising profound questions about consciousness after researchers discovered that the human brain may continue processing language even while a person is fully unconscious under general anesthesia.

According to a report from the Daily Mail, researchers from Baylor College of Medicine found evidence that anesthetized patients still showed signs of sophisticated language activity inside the brain.

“Our findings show that the brain is far more active and capable during unconsciousness than previously thought,” study author Dr. Sameer Sheth said.

“Even when patients are fully anesthetized, their brains continue to analyze the world around them.”

The findings, published in the journal *Nature*, challenge long-standing assumptions about the relationship between consciousness and cognition.

Researchers wrote in the study that one of the central questions in neuroscience is whether complex mental functions depend entirely on conscious awareness.



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To explore that question, scientists monitored epilepsy patients undergoing surgery while under general anesthesia. According to the Daily Mail report, researchers focused specifically on the hippocampus, the brain region associated

with memory and learning.

During one phase of the study, patients were exposed to repetitive sounds interrupted by occasional unusual tones. Researchers found that neurons in the hippocampus could distinguish between sounds, and that the brain's response appeared to improve over time.

Scientists said the results may point to a form of learning occurring even during unconsciousness.

Researchers then played short stories for the patients while recording brain activity. According to the report, the hippocampus demonstrated signs of real-time language processing, including the ability to distinguish between nouns, verbs and adjectives.

The researchers also observed evidence suggesting the brain could anticipate upcoming words before they were spoken.

Still, researchers cautioned that more study is needed before broader conclusions can be made about unconscious states or the moments leading up to death.

"Anesthesia has an uncertain relationship with waking life," the researchers noted, adding that it remains unclear whether the findings apply to sleep, coma states or near-death experiences.

The Daily Mail article also referenced separate research involving end-of-life dreams and visions reported by terminally ill patients. Researchers from Azienda USL-IRCCS di Reggio Emilia surveyed caregivers who described recurring reports of dying patients seeing deceased loved ones, bright lights, stairways and other symbolic images associated with transition.

As scientists continue to study the mysteries of consciousness, the research is adding weight to the

possibility that the human mind remains far more active beneath the surface than previously understood.

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
