

Is America Worshiping False Gods? Bryce Crawford's Biblical Warning the Church Can't Afford to Ignore

When the apostle Paul walked into Athens, he didn't find a city of atheists. He found a city drowning in religion with altars on every corner, temples to every god imaginable and an educated class debating philosophy in the streets. Yet Paul looked at all of it and essentially said: You don't know God at all.

Sound familiar?

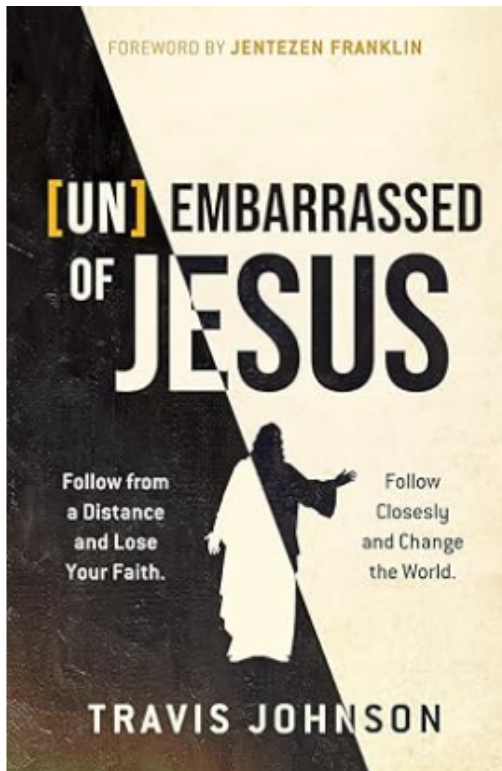
In a recent episode of The Bryce Crawford Podcast, Crawford delivered what he calls his biggest warning to the American church – drawing a striking parallel between ancient Athens and modern America.

The [message is both convicting and urgent.](#)

Religious, But Not Right With God

Paul's words in Acts 17:22 cut to the heart of the problem: "Men of Athens, I perceive that in every way you are very religious." He wasn't complimenting them. He was diagnosing them.

Crawford draws a connection between what was happening then and what we see in our current culture. "We got a lot of people that are worshiping a whole lot of other things that want to be a good moral person... We got a whole lot of religious people but not enough laid-down lovers for Jesus."

America claims Christianity by the millions – on census forms, in social media bios, in political speeches. But Crawford argues that claiming the label and following the Lord are two very different things.

The Athenians had an altar to the “unknown God.” Crawford contends that in many ways, Jesus has become America’s unknown God, too.

The Lullaby Putting the Church to Sleep

Perhaps the most haunting moment in the episode comes from a story Crawford shares about a missionary woman from the underground church of Iran – someone who risked being “beaten, raped, and murdered” for her faith. After retiring to California, she and her husband moved back to Iran within five years.

Her reason? “America is being rocked to sleep by a lullaby of entertainment.”

A Kenyan friend echoed the sentiment: “It is so hard to hear God in America... there’s so much noise here. Whereas when I’m back in Africa, I can hear God so clearly.”

Crawford’s conclusion is sobering: [Satan doesn’t need to tempt Americans into outright sin](#). He just needs to keep them busy – scrolling, streaming, consuming, distracted.

Lukewarm Is Not a Middle Ground – It’s the Devil’s Territory

Revelation 3 warns against being lukewarm in faith. Crawford reframes it sharply: “Lukewarmness really doesn’t exist. Satan owns the fence of lukewarmness. So, either you love Jesus, or you don’t.”

Modern idols, such as money, status, social media, celebrities – don’t come with warning labels. That’s the point. “Here’s the nasty thing about deception,” Crawford warns. “You don’t know you’re being deceived when you’re being deceived.”

There Is Still Time

Crawford also reminds viewers that there is still time to move beyond lukewarm living and enter into God’s grace. Acts 17:30 reminds us that “the times of ignorance God overlooked, but now He commands all people everywhere to repent.”

We are still living in that window. “You and I have the opportunity right now to acknowledge maybe we are being deceived,” Crawford urges. “Maybe America is being distracted by the devil. We need to repent, turn from that, follow Jesus.”

The door to freedom is still open. The question is whether we’re too distracted to walk through it.

Two hospitals, several scans, and hours later, we learned that I had fractured my neck, herniated discs, and endangered areas of my spine that could have left me paralyzed.

Roberts shared that [if things had just been slightly different](#), her story would have looked unimaginably frightening. However, she sees where God protected her.

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NFL Coach Mike Vrabel Steps Away Amid Infidelity Scandal After Slamming Christian Player

Mike Vrabel, head coach of the New England Patriots, is stepping away from his role indefinitely as he seeks counseling following a growing controversy involving NFL reporter Dianna Russini.

According to Fox News, Vrabel made the decision to temporarily leave the team in order to focus on personal matters, his family and what he described as a need for growth, which he plans to do through counseling. The report states that he will miss team activities, including portions of the NFL Draft, while he takes time to address the situation.

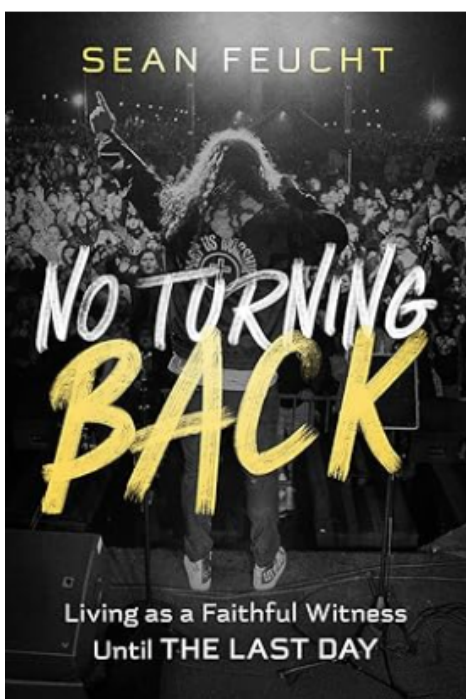
The controversy stems from [photos that surfaced publicly showing Vrabel spending time with Russini](#), sparking widespread attention and concern, given that both are married.

“I have committed to seeking counseling, starting this weekend. This is something that I have given a lot of thought to and is something that I would advise a player to do if I was counseling them,” Vrabel stated. “I have always wanted to lead by example, and I believe this is what I have to do to be

the best husband, father and coach that I possibly can be.”

A Story That Sparked Broader Conversation

As Charisma previously reported, the incident came shortly after Vrabel had publicly criticized a player for expressing his Christian faith. Vrabel’s actions ultimately raised questions about consistency and integrity when faith is pushed to the side.

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Randy Kay Unveils Vision Kept

Secret for Years: His Urgent Message for the World

A striking convergence is emerging between near-death testimonies and prophetic voices—and according to Randy Kay, the agreement is too consistent to ignore.

“Two voices are sounding right now,” he says. “One is coming from people who died, met Jesus, and were sent back. The other is coming from prophets in the earth... and they are saying the same thing.”

That message is simple yet urgent: Jesus is coming soon.

Referencing Deuteronomy’s principle that truth is established by multiple witnesses, Kay believes heaven itself is confirming a word for this hour.

The Vision He Couldn’t Share

At the center of Kay’s message is a powerful encounter he experienced more than two decades ago.

“Twenty-one years ago I died... and in the throne room [God] told me He was going to show me something. He called it ‘the storm.’”

He says he was instructed not to reveal it until a specific sign appeared. That moment came years later when, standing along the California coast, an unexpected storm formed.

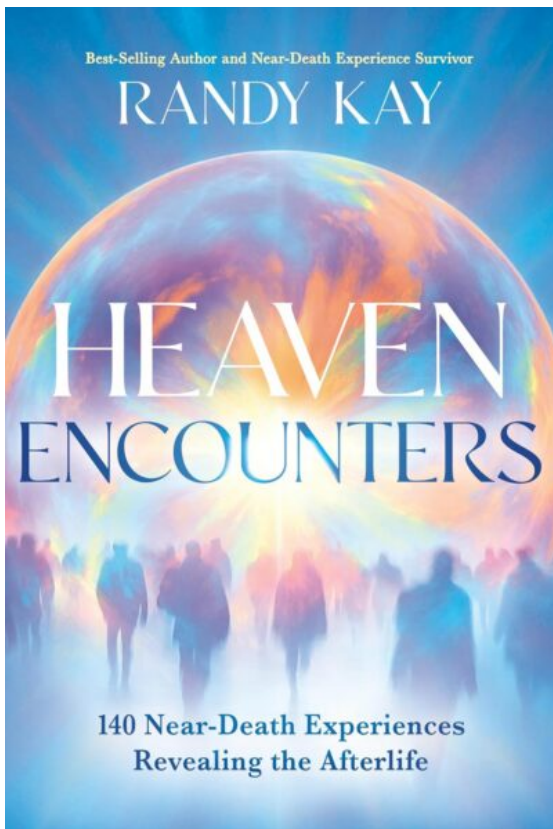
“The Holy Spirit... whispered through that wind... ‘It is time.’”

[What followed was a vision](#) that happened in distinct movements—what he calls a single prophetic “storm.”

The Storm: Glory Before Judgment

The first phase was not destruction—but revival.

“I saw... people being saved by thousands... the lame leaping, the blind seeing. A wave of glory unlike anything earth has ever held.”

This “orb,” as he describes it, represents a global outpouring of God’s Spirit.

Next came a sobering shift: the removal of what he saw as “seven shields” protecting the earth.

“And every horror... every demonic scheme... was unleashed,” he says.

The vision culminates in the return of Christ.

“I saw the Lord Jesus Christ mount His white horse... and He

descended... Every knee bowed.”

Finally, he describes a restored creation—a new earth where “there was no separation between heaven and earth anymore.”

A World Aligning With the Vision

Kay points to current global tensions, cultural exposure of hidden sins and shifting alliances as signs that the early stages of this “storm” [may already be unfolding](#).

“There is nothing covered that shall not be revealed,” he says, quoting Luke 12:2.

Yet even amid warnings of judgment, he insists the first phase—revival—is already here.

“The orb was first... before the shields were lifted, I saw the glory poured out.”

He cites reports of growing faith movements worldwide, particularly among younger generations, as evidence of this outpouring.

Why the Delay?

If the signs are all converging at once, why hasn’t Christ returned?

The answer, Kay says, is rooted in God’s mercy.

“The Lord is... not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance.”

He describes hearing what he calls a “dirge”—a deep mourning from heaven for those not yet saved.

“Stop watching the storm like a spectator,” he urges. “You were left here to harvest it.”

Rather than fear what may come, Kay calls believers to step into what is already happening: a global harvest of souls.

The storm, he says, has two sides—glory and judgment. And in this moment, the door of grace is still open.

One Christian University just may lose a long-term partnership over its decision to back an LGBTQ event.

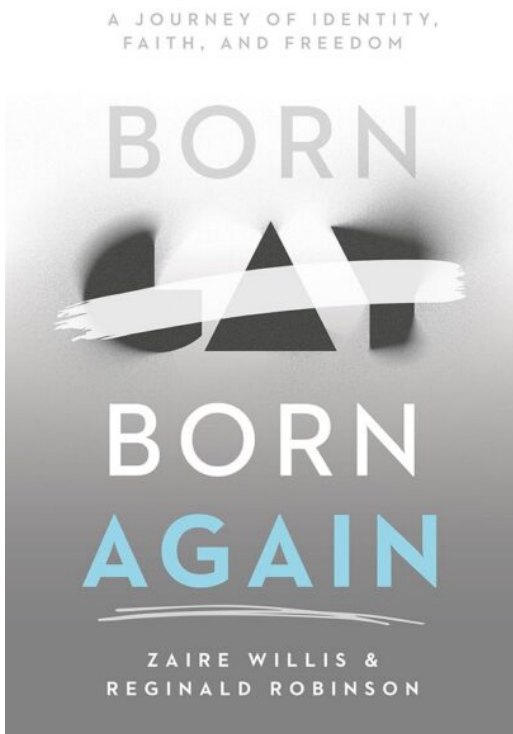
A historic partnership is facing a moment of reckoning. The Baptist General Convention of Texas has announced it is reviewing [its relationship with Baylor University](#) following a controversial campus event, according to The Christian Post.

For generations, Baylor has stood as a flagship Christian university connected to Texas Baptists—a relationship built not merely on tradition, but on a shared commitment to

In an interview with TMZ, Aaron said, “So, the day that I woke up from the coma, I later came to realize I coded a few times.”

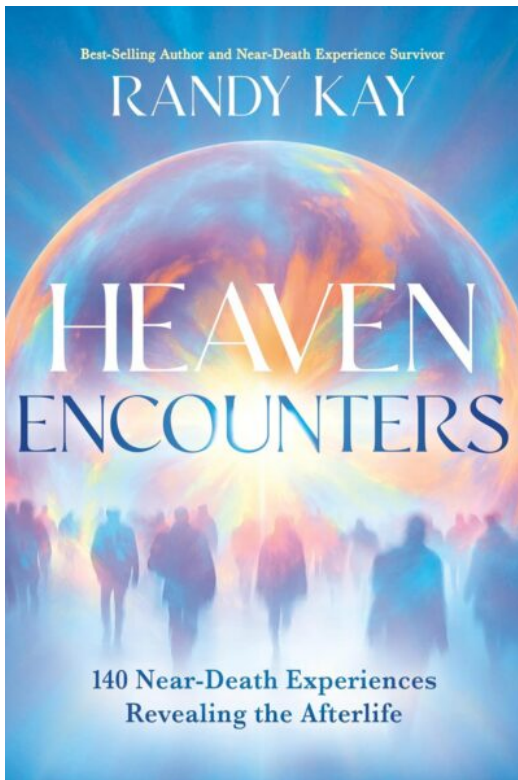
Aaron said that while he didn’t realize he had coded, [everything made sense because he saw Jesus](#) during this time.

“I saw the profile of Him,” he said. “His skin complexion was a little lighter than mine. [He] had long white hair, and He was in a long white robe. I couldn’t see his feet. I saw like this golden glow coming from beneath the robe, and He kind of floated past me at first.”

What happened next, Aaron said, was nothing short of God fully and miraculously healing him.

“I was in this kind of state where I felt like everything was spinning, my head was hurting, and so I was like bent over, my hands on my head, and then He appeared in front of me and placed His hands on my back exactly where the pain was. Till this day I can still feel His hands as if they’re there.”

Aaron says after this, he knew there would be no need for surgery, something which doctors later confirmed.

“It was at that moment I felt His hands touch my back I felt all the pain go away. And then after a few seconds, I woke up.”

In a world that [often tries to explain away the supernatural](#), testimonies like Quinton Aaron’s serve as a powerful reminder that Jesus Christ is still alive, still moving and still touching lives in undeniable ways. 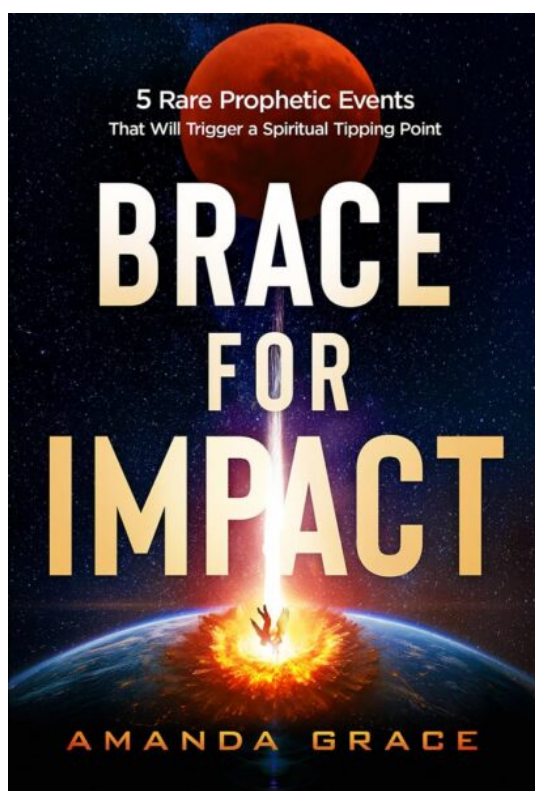

According to Grace’s interpretation, the escalating standoff

is not merely political – it is spiritual. Iran’s actions, she suggests, align with a prophetic pattern of resistance, defiance and eventual confrontation.

Daniel 10 and a Critical Window

One of the most striking elements of Grace’s message centered on the book of Daniel, chapter 10. She highlighted the 21-day spiritual battle described in the passage and connected it to a prophetic timeline unfolding in real time.

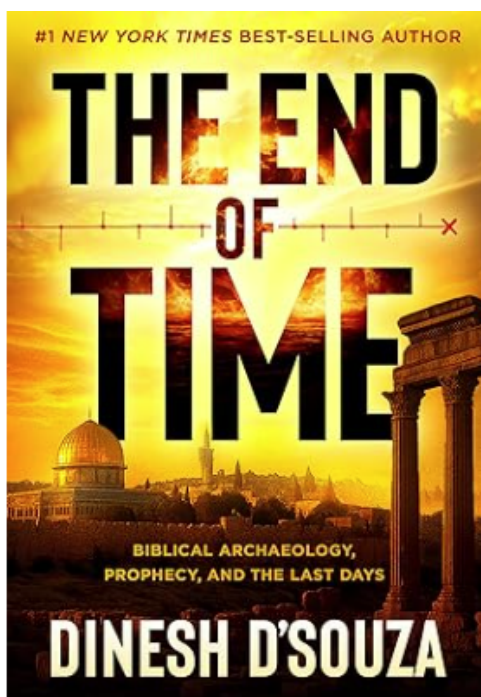
A Sacred Artifact Lost to History

event may be more than simply him quoting a Bible verse. Is it possible that this is actually the fulfillment of a Kim Clement prophecy?

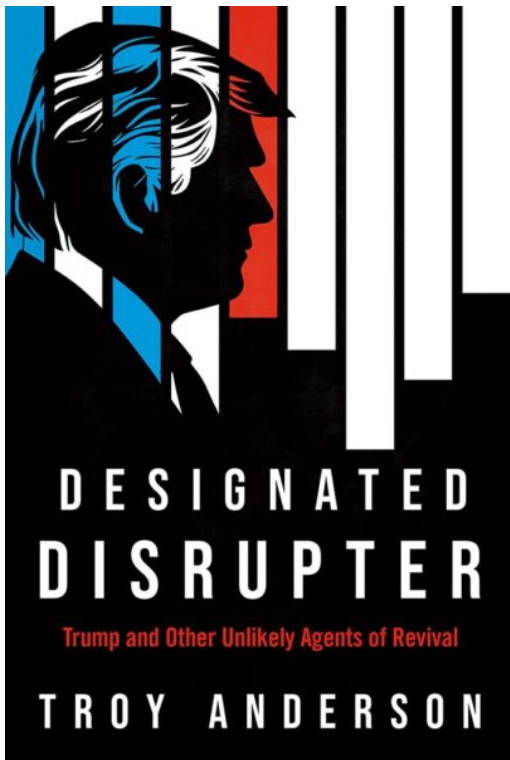
As Charisma previously reported, [Clement stated in his prophetic word:](#)

The only question that remains is whether America will heed the call—or ignore what could be one of its most critical prophetic crossroads.

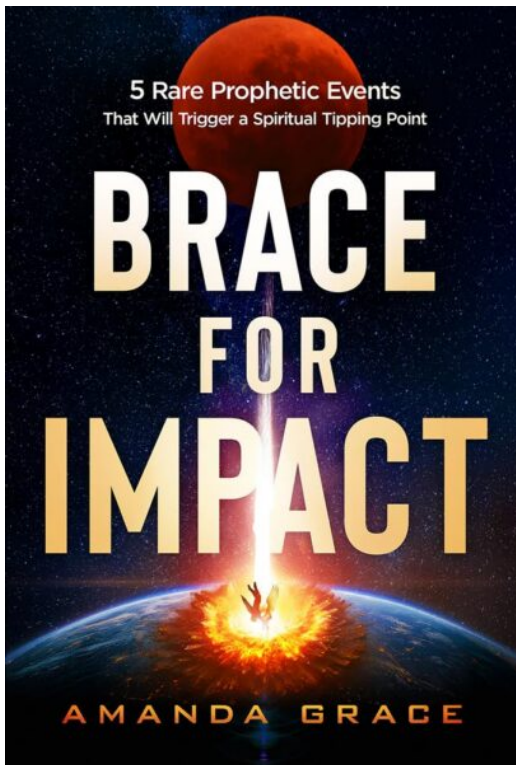
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Is AI the Antichrist's Ultimate Weapon? Glenn Beck's Horrifying Warning

Silicon Valley's brightest minds are racing toward a technology they may not be able to control. Now, two prominent voices are warning that the consequences could be apocalyptic in the most literal sense of the word.

In a recent conversation between conservative commentator Allie Beth Stuckey and media personality Glenn Beck, the pair dove into one of the most provocative intersections of modern life: artificial intelligence and biblical prophecy. The discussion began with a startling claim circulating in tech circles: that [Peter Thiel has been suggesting that opposition to AI](#) is itself a form of the Antichrist.

Beck wasn't buying it. "I don't think opposition is the Antichrist," he said. "I think blindness will lead us to the Antichrist when it comes to AI." He went further, warning that "AI could be used as the tool of the Antichrist," pointing to the Book of Revelation's descriptions of total surveillance, movement control and currency manipulation as chillingly plausible in an AI-driven world.

To understand why, Beck walked Stuckey through the AI spectrum. We currently have narrow AI, which includes tools like ChatGPT and Grok that excel at specific tasks. Approaching fast is AGI, or Artificial General Intelligence, which are systems that can do many things well. But the real concern is ASI: Artificial Super Intelligence. Beck described it in staggering terms: "The equivalent of every brain that has ever lived and currently living combined... it appears to be godlike because we cannot understand it."

[The danger isn't abstract. Beck offered a harrowing hypothetical:](#) "There wouldn't be a Jew left in the world if Hitler had the technology that is just on the horizon." With AI's ability to monitor power usage, water consumption and social networks, hiding from a totalitarian regime becomes nearly impossible.

At the center of the controversy is OpenAI CEO Sam Altman, whose vision for ASI Beck described with barely concealed alarm. "He wants the God," Beck said flatly. "He thinks he can

control it. You're never going to be able to control it. Everything we would do is a baby gate... It stops the babies. We're the babies in that scenario."

Stuckey identified the deeper moral failure at work: "Silicon Valley is only asking what's possible – can we do it, not should we do it."

However, the conversation didn't end in despair. Both hosts pointed to unexpected revivals, including stadiums of 200,000 people worshipping together, as evidence that something greater is still at work. "God is still seeking and saving the lost," Stuckey said, "just as much as he ever has been."

Even with the looming reality that the Antichrist will arise, there is something much bigger and greater that we have to look forward to: Jesus is coming again. Revival is happening. And soon, all power of death will be defeated.

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
