

‘I Saw Angels’: Country Singer Recalls Near-Death Experience During Concert, Meeting Jesus

In a moment that came without warning, country artist Drake White found himself staring death in the face—right in the middle of a live performance.

According to a report from Fox News, White recently opened up about the harrowing 2019 concert where his life nearly ended in an instant. What began as a normal night on stage quickly turned into a medical emergency that would forever alter his perspective on life, survival and faith.

“I’m Having a Stroke”

White described the moment with chilling clarity. In the middle of his set, he was suddenly overtaken by a sensation so intense, it felt as though he had been struck by a gunshot to the head. Having been given the diagnosis of a rare condition with his brain, White knew the pain had to be related.

The pain was immediate—and so was the realization.

“Everything slowed way down, and it just felt like I was walking in quicksand, and everything was was like...‘I’m having a stroke.’”

A Glimpse Beyond Life

What happened next, however, went far beyond a medical crisis.

“...saw angels, saw the whole near-death experience, talked to God, the whole thing,” he stated, according to Fox News. “I

realized that rock bottom had a basement. It really got me to a spot where I didn't know if I was gonna survive."

In those moments between life and death, White says he encountered something he cannot deny—an experience that left him both shaken and transformed.

A Dire Diagnosis—and a Long Road Back

Moments after collapsing onstage, White was rushed for emergency care as doctors worked to stabilize him.

"The doctors came in and told me that I'd had a hemorrhagic heard them murmuring that I'll be lucky to walk again, much less get back on stage."

What followed was not just survival—but a fight to reclaim everything he once took for granted.

"I Met Him... It Was Real"

For White, the most profound impact wasn't just physical—it was spiritual.

"I am a Jesus-following guy that believes in that wholeheartedly. Met him, saw him, talked to him. It's as real as me and you talking right now... He was like, 'What's going on? Tell me what's up.' It was the most peaceful I'd ever been in my life in that moment."

The peace he describes stands in stark contrast to the chaos of the moment, suggesting that even as his body was failing, something deeper was taking place.

A Life Forever Changed

White further emphasized that fear was not what defined the experience.

“I was not scared, I was just not. It’s just like a transition,” he continued. “I could feel it. It was palpable. You know what I mean? I could touch faith is for you, it meets you where you are. It meets you where you are in a hospital bed or in a car wreck or whatever it is.”

That encounter has become a cornerstone of how he now understands faith: not as theory, but as something deeply personal and tangible.

“It Was the Most Peaceful I’ve Ever Been”

“I am a man of faith. I believe in the Christian values. I believe in the Father, Son and the Holy Ghost. I believe all this,” White said. “I choose to believe it.. It gave me so much peace. It was the most peaceful I’ve ever been.”

White’s story is more than a testimony of survival. It is a powerful reminder of what can happen when a person comes face-to-face with eternity.

What began as a normal night on stage became a moment that changed everything. And now, his voice carries more than music—it carries the weight of a man who believes he encountered God at the edge of life itself.

Pastor Sparks Outrage Claiming Christians Need a 'Third Testament,' Questions Bible's Authority

There's no question about it: We are living in the end times when many false teachers and prophets are arising.

In a completely heretical statement, Oakland, California minister Yvette Flunder shared that she believes the Bible is "problematic" and that Christians today need a "third testament."

"I'm of the opinion that we need a third testament," Flunder stated. "Because the Bible has become problematic."

She went on then to quote biblical commands completely out of context, using the ones about slaves obeying their masters and women being quiet in the church as a way to warp Scripture for her own message.

"Now, I'm a believer," Flunder continued. "My whole heart. I trust God with my whole heart. I wake up in the morning talking to God and God talking to me. But I am completely frustrated with the ways in which the text speaks to the kind of vitriolic God that makes those kinds of things..."

LGBTQ-aligned Bishop Yvette Flunder says the Bible has become

a big problem and that she wants to change it by writing her own testament.

She declares herself above God and says she wants to rip out the pages she doesn't like so no one can read them ever again.

Flunder then went on to suggest that it would be acceptable to rip out pages that are simply not preferable to today's agenda.

"They say, 'Well, you can't do it, it's the Word of God.' I said, 'No, it's words about God...' But is it the Word of God? No, it is not the Word of God," she stated.

The Danger of Adding to God's Word

What makes Flunder's statements especially serious is that they directly contradict the clear and repeated warnings found throughout Scripture itself. The Bible is not silent on the issue of altering, adding to or subtracting from God's Word—it speaks with sobering clarity.

In Revelation 22:18–19, a final warning is issued to all who would dare tamper with divine truth: anyone who adds to the words of prophecy will face judgment, and anyone who takes away from them risks losing their share in what God has promised. This is not symbolic language—it is a direct line drawn by God Himself.

This echoes earlier commands in Deuteronomy 4:2, where God instructs His people not to add to or subtract from what He has spoken. From Genesis to Revelation, the message is consistent: God's Word is complete, intentional and not subject to human editing or cultural revision.

Flunder's call for a "third testament" is not merely a theological stretch—it is a direct violation of these warnings. It elevates human opinion above divine revelation and opens the door to subjectivity, where Scripture becomes fluid rather than foundational. That is precisely the kind of deception the Bible warns will increase in the last days.

Jesus: The Living Word That Cannot Be Changed

Even more critically, these claims strike at the very identity of Jesus Christ. Scripture makes it unmistakably clear that Jesus is not separate from the Word—He is the Word.

Jesus also made an unshakable declaration in Matthew 24:35: "Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will never pass away." In a world of shifting culture and evolving ideologies, Christ established His words as eternal, unchanging and final.

When people begin to suggest rewriting, replacing or reinterpreting the Word of God to fit modern preferences, they are not just offering a new perspective. Instead, they are contradicting the very foundation of the Christian faith.

The Bible does not need revision. It does not need a sequel. It is the living, active, unchanging Word of God.

In these last days, believers are called not to reshape it,

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Noah's Ark Evidence? Mysterious Underground Tunnels Discovered Beneath Ancient Formation

So I do think it’s like a moment to wrestle with our own consciences. We’ll be tormented by it for a long time. I will be. And I want to say I’m sorry for misleading people – it was not intentional,” Tucker said.

The Epstein files and what comes next

For Buckley, the Epstein files were the moment Trump redefined MAGA as whatever suited him that day: “MAGA is not what I articulated clearly and coherently for 10–12 years. MAGA is what I say it is today – because I’m Donald Trump,” he quoted Trump.

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Israel to Host 'Pride Land' Festival Near Site of Biblical Sodom and Gomorrah

A new large-scale LGBTQ festival is set to take place in Israel this summer.

According to The Jerusalem Post, Israel will host what is being described as the largest LGBTQ festival ever held in the Middle East at the Dead Sea in June 2026.

The four-day event, called "Pride Land," is expected to transform part of the Judean Desert into a gathering space

featuring hotels, performances and cultural events operating around the clock, taking place from June 1-4.

Breaking Mental Strongholds

What began as a small, struggling church has now erupted into a global movement marked by miracles, deliverance and a growing hunger for the presence of God.

In a recent livestream, Kathryn Krick of 5F Church reflected on a powerful two-day revival gathering in Manila, Philippines, where thousands witnessed the unmistakable move of God.

“I’m in awe of all that Jesus did over those two days. So many miracles for thousands of people all over the arena,” she said. “So many people received impartation, the fire of the Holy Spirit. All glory to God.”

But according to Krick’s message, what has already taken place is only the beginning.

From Two People to Global Revival

The story behind the movement is anything but conventional.

After receiving a prophetic word in 2016 that she was called to ministry, she initially resisted. Yet, her obedience to God’s call led her to launch a church in Los Angeles in 2017—one that would shrink dramatically before it grew.

“Our church was so tiny, it actually got smaller with every year... We dwindled down to two people,” Krick said.

Yet even in that season, something deeper was happening spiritually.

“However, we were experiencing revival... we were experiencing truly God’s power at work.”

That unseen work would soon explode into public view.

The ‘Suddenly’ Moment That Changed Everything

The turning point came at the end of 2020, when a short video showing prayer and the power of God went viral.

“The greater miracle is that there were so many miracles that God did through this 1-minute video... uncountable amounts of people... receiving healing and deliverance,” she said.

Within months:

- Attendance grew from just a handful to hundreds
- Deliverance began happening publicly
- People traveled across the country—and eventually the world—to be part of what God was doing

“Jesus had just decided to have revival break out... it was God’s divine time,” she said.

Opposition and the Reality of Spiritual Warfare

As the movement expanded, so did resistance.

Krick warned that opposition is not a sign of failure—but confirmation of true spiritual impact.

“There’s nothing the devil hates more than revival... than people being set free,” she said.

Drawing from Scripture, she pointed to a consistent biblical pattern: moments of intense resistance are always followed by breakthrough.

“We always see... it is just for a season... and after that there’s victory, there’s breakthrough, there’s advancement.”

Why May Could Mark a Major Shift

Central to the message is a prophetic emphasis on the month of May.

Krick tied May to:

- The original breakout of revival on May 30, 2021
- Personal prophetic milestones
- The biblical symbolism of grace

Now, she believes another turning point is imminent.

“I believe that there’s going to be such a great shift in the spiritual realm... such a great shift in revival in this month of May,” she declared.

Upcoming events—including a conference and the release of her new book—are seen as catalysts for this next wave.

Referencing John 4, she emphasized that the world is more spiritually open than many realize.

“Wake up and look around... the fields are already ripe for harvest,” she said, quoting Jesus’ words.

Rather than waiting for revival, Krick insists believers must recognize that it is already underway—and respond with urgency.

“Revival is now... God wants to use you so powerfully to bring in the harvest.”

The Call: Be Set on Fire

At the heart of Krick's message is a call for believers to fully engage—not passively observe.

“Fan into flame the spiritual gift God gave you... never be ashamed to tell others about our Lord,” she said, referencing 2 Timothy 1.

She described a coming move where believers themselves become carriers of revival—marked by visible transformation and bold faith.

“When someone has truly met Jesus... you see it. The way they speak... the humility... the love... you can see the glory of God,” she said.

A Defining Moment for the Church

What unfolded in Krick's message is more than a testimony—it is a challenge to the global church.

The pattern is clear: hidden seasons, unexpected breakthrough and a God who moves suddenly when His timing arrives. And if this message proves true, the coming days may not be marked by slow growth—but by explosive, undeniable transformation.

The question now is not whether revival is coming—but whether believers are ready to step into it.

Because if the harvest is truly ripe, as Scripture declares, then this moment demands more than passive faith. It calls for boldness, surrender and a willingness to carry the fire of God into a world desperate for truth.

This is not a distant promise—it is a present reality: “Revival is now.”

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JD Vance Steps Between Donald Trump and Pope Leo as Tensions Spark Debate
