

Did Tucker Carlson Just Suggest Sharia Law for the West? His Controversial Statements

Tucker Carlson continues to go down a deep, dark path, all while claiming to be a Christian.

In a recent interview with Michael Waddell on the Outdoor Channel, [a clip is now going viral of Carlson](#) where he praised societies governed by Sharia Law and condemned the West for living by different standards.

“...there’s not a single Western city that’s thriving,” Carlson says. “And they’re all degrading in exactly the same way...it’s a lot of things, but it’s self-hatred”

Carlson believes that there has been a lost will for success in the West. “Every European city, every American city, people lose their will to live, their will to pass on their culture.”

So, how does Carlson think society can be improved? Surely, he wouldn’t suggest living under an oppressive regime that governs every thought, action and the value of human life. Yet, that is exactly what he agreed with.

“I travel a lot in the Middle East. It’s amazing. I’m not Muslim, obviously. I’m like, Christian... My ancestors are from Europe...But you go to the Gulf, and it’s incredible to me to be in a place that has pride in itself that [believes in its religion and culture](#) that thinks, ‘we’re onto something...’

Those people are happy. They're welcoming of others, they're tolerant of diversity."

Having a specific religious value pushed upon you, or else you will be killed, doesn't mean that all the people there are happy or agree with what is being practiced. Forced religion doesn't make for freedom. It makes for converts in bondage.

Carlson believes that the people there's "self-confidence" makes for a welcoming attitude. He claims that the people are more tolerant of Christianity there, even where Sharia Law is the governing rule of the land, something he found amusing. He then takes a turn, giving his explanation as to why Muslim extremism exists.

"You notice in ISIS or Al-Qaeda like the Muslim extremists, they're all from like collapsed, pathetic societies dominated by colonial powers. They've been degraded, and that's why they're so angry," Carlson states.

Perhaps someone should fill Tucker Carlson in more on what Sharia Law and the Quran actually have to say.

As voices in media and culture raise provocative ideas about the future of the West, the Church must rise with clarity, conviction and unwavering allegiance to God's Word. We are blessed to live in a nation where there is freedom of religion, freedom to succeed (or fail) and where anyone has the opportunity to prosper. As we listen to media commentators, this is the time to be discerning about which voices to listen to and which to block from our viewpoint as we look forward and follow Jesus.

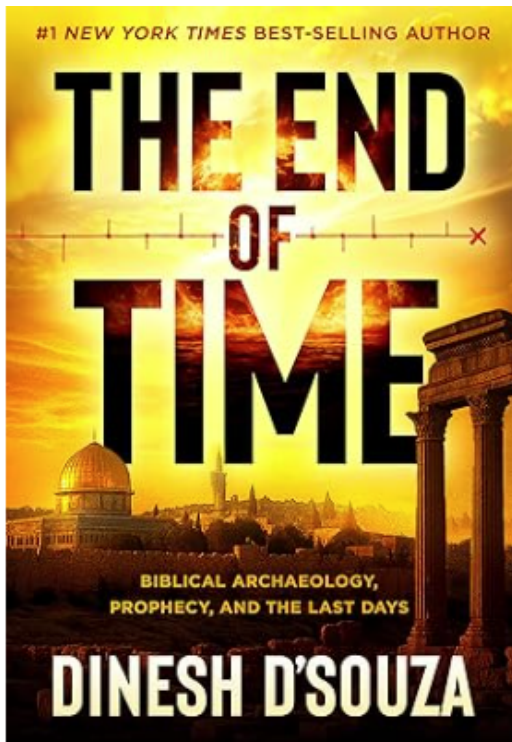
Buried for 2,000 Years: Ancient Holy Land Message Emerges With Chilling Warning

Archaeologists have discovered a stark message that was hidden for 2,000 years in the Holy Land.

According to the Daily Mail, archaeologists found a 2,000-year-old sling bullet bearing the message "Learn your lesson."

The artifact was found in Israel in the old city of Hippos. It would have been used from a "handheld projectile pocket," as the outlet noted, and it weighs 38 grams. [It is believed to have been used by Greek](#) defenders in the city.

Plenty of other lead sling bullets have been unearthed from this area, but this is the first to have been found with writing on it.

Michael Eisenberg from the University of Haifa, said that “Sling bullets were a cheap munition, a hand-thrown projectile, used for millennia...This is the first instance of the Greek word ‘learn’ attested on sling bullets...probably the local defender’s sense of sarcasm.”

The finding of this sling bullet in what is now the city of Sussita, close to the Sea of Galilee, was central to the ministry of Jesus.

In many ways, this discovery echoes one of the most iconic moments in Scripture—the clash between a shepherd boy and a giant on the battlefield.

In 1 Samuel 17, David stepped forward with nothing more than a sling and a stone, while Goliath stood armored, imposing and seemingly unstoppable. Yet it was not the size of the weapon or the strength of the warrior that determined the outcome—[it was the power of God](#) working through what appeared small, simple and even insignificant.

This 2,000-year-old sling bullet serves as a striking reminder of that same truth. In the natural, it was just a small piece of lead—cheap, common and easily overlooked. The weapons may change, the empires may rise and fall, but the pattern remains: God resists the proud and empowers the humble.

Why the Supernatural Is Needed Now More Than Ever

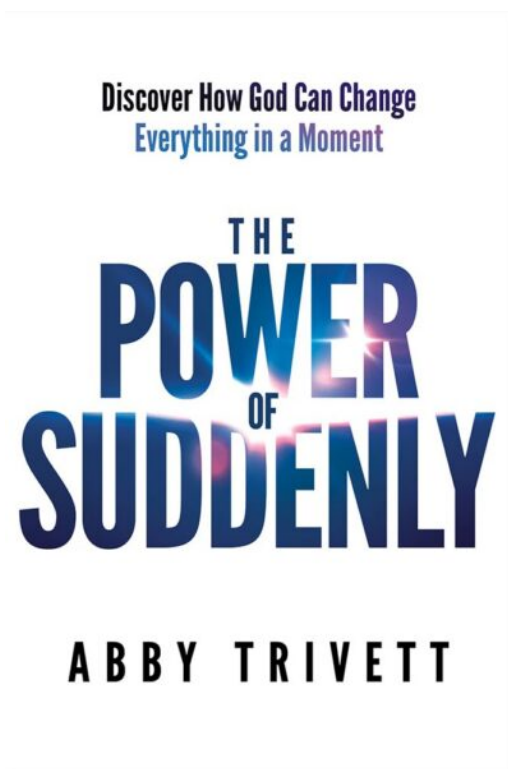
According to Murillo, the urgency of the hour demands a return to supernatural power.

“Miracles are for today. Why? Because sickness is today. Demon possession is today,” he said. “No church in the next five years, no church is going to grow if it doesn’t have authority in the supernatural.”

He warned that as darkness increases, the enemy will intensify counterfeit signs and deception—making it even more critical for the church to operate in genuine power.

A Generation Hungry for Something Real

Saldivar also emphasized that the current spiritual climate—especially among young people—reveals a deep hunger for authentic encounters with God.

“Young people want the supernatural, and they don’t see it in the church,” Saldivar said. “So, they get driven straight to the occult, straight to the New Age, straight to the

horoscopes, the mediumships.”

He described a generation tired of empty religion and desperate for a real experience with God: “Give me something real. Will somebody please [let me experience the God that you guys keep talking about?](#)”

Understanding Words of Knowledge

Addressing the often-misunderstood spiritual gift, Murillo clarified that words of knowledge are not about impressing people with information.

“He’s really not interested in telling me somebody’s address... that turns it into a sideshow,” Murillo said of the Holy Spirit’s role.

Instead, he emphasized that the purpose is transformation: “The big event... is when they go to their doctor and... the sickness is left.”

A Call to Bold Faith and Spiritual Authority

The conversation culminated in a powerful call for believers to step into their God-given authority.

Saldivar reminded listeners that the early church grew through supernatural demonstration, not strategy. “The church never grew with lights... it never grew with coffee shops... the most biblical way to grow the church... was miracles.”

As both men made clear, the stakes are high. A generation is searching, darkness is increasing and the church stands at a crossroads.

Their message is unmistakable: the answer is not retreat—but revival.

And that revival, they say, will be marked not just by preaching, but by power.

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Prince William's Faith Journey: Is the Future King Drawing Closer to God?

As Prince William prepares for his future role as king—and eventual Supreme Governor of the Church of England—new comments about his personal beliefs are drawing both intrigue and concern across Britain and beyond.

According to reports from BBC, AOL, and Town & Country, those closest to the Prince of Wales say his faith is real—but intentionally private.

According to the BBC report, an aide for Prince William stated that he is “keen to build a strong and meaningful bond” within the Church of England.

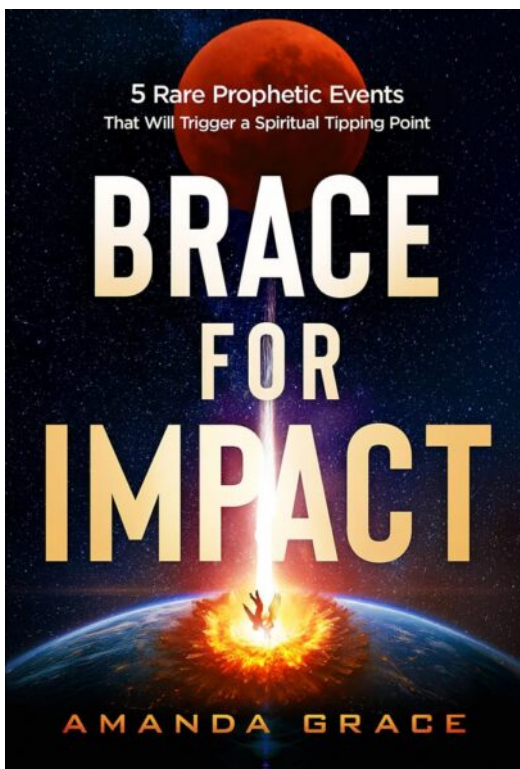
[The aide described William's spirituality](#) as a “quiet faith,” noting that William's “commitment to the Church of England is sometimes quieter than people expect, and for that reason, it

Despite not being a regular churchgoer, William still recognizes the importance of the Church of England and his future leadership role within it. According to Town & Country, aides say that with building a “bond with the Church,” he intends to be a leader who “...respects tradition while speaking to a modern Britain, and reflects his broader belief that institutions must continue to remain relevant and connected to the people they serve.”

This news comes as Prince William plans to attend the installation of Sarah Mullally as the new Archbishop of

Canterbury this week. This news also comes after recent comments about William's faith were made to "draw a line in the sand" regarding what he actually believes.

A Prophetic Moment for the Crown?

What makes Prince William's "quiet faith" conversation even more significant is how it may align with a broader prophetic warning already being spoken over the royal family.

[In a recent message covered by Charisma](#), prophetic voice Amanda Grace described a coming spiritual shift within Britain's monarchy—one that goes far beyond ceremony or tradition. The word speaks of "a passing of the old guard" and a divine shaking that will expose what has long been hidden within royal structures. Could what is happening right now be in preparation for what we will see when William takes over the royal mantle from his father?

The prophecy also spoke of God calling William's wife, Princess Catherine, into a new and deeper relationship with the Lord. Perhaps what we are seeing is a shifting and a shake-up for both the royal family and the British people.

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Jonathan Cahn's Urgent Warning on Tucker Carlson, Red Heifers and the Temple Mount

Is there a mystery behind the Temple Mount, the red heifer ceremony and a spiritual war happening around us right now?

In a new prophetic message, Jonathan Cahn explained how many influential voices today may be unknowingly echoing something deeper in their regard to Israel—dark transmissions from the spiritual realm. One of those voices he directly addressed included Tucker Carlson's comments on Israel and the Temple Mount.

Referring to Carlson's claims, Cahn said he suggested there was a "secret reason behind this war in Iran," tying it to Israel and the Temple Mount. Cahn described Carlson's argument as "basically doing what he does, which is innuendo... an allegation," [centered around the idea that Israel is attempting to remove](#) the Dome of the Rock to rebuild the Temple.

"What Tucker Carlson is insinuating is that Israel... started the war to spark a holy war," Cahn said.

He strongly rejected this narrative, calling it "all nonsense... conspiracy, lunacy, ultimately anti-Israel propaganda, anti-Semitic."

Cahn emphasized that Israel already controls the Temple Mount and has intentionally avoided escalating conflict: “They chose... to give the mount into the hands or control of the Muslim authorities because they didn’t want there to be a holy war.”

Yet what struck him most was not just the claim itself—but its similarity to rhetoric from Hamas.

“Why is he all wrapped up in the Temple Mount?” Cahn asked. “Could he be getting it from another place?”

The Temple Mount at the Center of Global Conflict

A key focus of Cahn’s message is the Temple Mount, which he says sits at the center of both geopolitical tension and prophetic fulfillment.

Referencing the Oct. 7, 2023, Hamas attack, Cahn noted: “They admitted why they did it... they said it was all done because of the temple.”

He emphasized that Hamas even named the operation after the site—Al-Aqsa Flood—linking the violence directly to claims about Israel and the Temple Mount. Cahn also pointed out what he sees as a consistent theme: “They invaded Israel... because of the red cows.”

These red heifers, tied to biblical temple purification rituals, have suddenly returned to the scene in recent years.

A Pattern Beyond Politics

Cahn argues that these repeated narratives—from terrorist groups to media personalities—share a deeper, spiritual origin.

“What Tucker Carlson is saying, what Hamas is saying... makes no sense in the natural,” he said. “But in the supernatural—total.”

He went further, issuing a sobering warning: “When you hear people like Tucker Carlson... it’s not Tucker Carlson speaking... It’s the devil speaking.”

Cahn clarified he does not necessarily believe Carlson is aware of this, but suggested such messaging reflects deeper spiritual influence.

“It’s like you’re hearing... [the devil’s thoughts, the devil’s words, the devil’s plans](#),” he said.

Why the Temple Matters in Prophecy

At the heart of Cahn’s message is a bold claim: the enemy is focused on the Temple Mount because of what it represents.

“It was prophesied in the Bible that the temple of God will actually be rebuilt,” he said. “And what will that lead to? The end times... the coming of Messiah.”

This explains the intense global fixation on Israel and Jerusalem.

“The enemy is threatened by it... because it represents the coming of the kingdom of God on earth.”

A Call to Discernment—and Hope

Cahn warns believers to use discernment in a time of spiritual confusion.

“Don’t let it into your mind... it’s the devil’s sickness,” he said. “And all things are coming against you... it’s a good sign,” Cahn said. “The intensity of the attack is telling you how great the purposes of God... ahead of you.”

This is the moment where we must look beyond headlines and recognize what may be happening in the unseen realm.

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Amanda Grace: Is the Joe Kent Resignation Tied to a ‘Purim to Passover’ Prophetic Window?

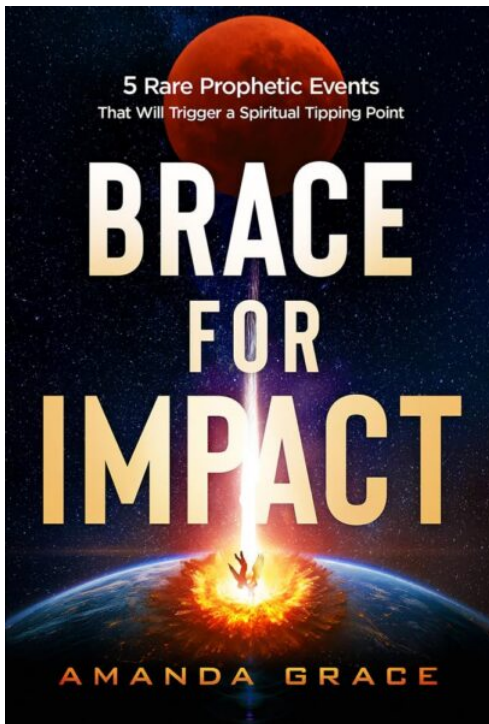
In a recent broadcast, prophetic voice Amanda Grace explained why the resignation of former counterterrorism chief Joe Kent is not just another political headline, but part of what she believes is a much larger prophetic pattern unfolding before the nation.

As Grace opened the program, she made clear that she believed the moment was spiritually weighty, adding that the events now unfolding are happening [in what she called a very intense](#) “window of Purim and Passover.”

Joe Kent's Resignation Raises Red Flags

At the center of Grace's message was Kent's resignation and the controversy surrounding it. She cited reports that the former National Counterterrorism Center director is under FBI investigation, while also noting Kent's public stance on Iran.

According to Grace, "Joe Kent resigned with an open letter basically saying Iran does not pose an imminent threat to the United States of America. He cannot support the Iran war, and that Israel is forcing the United States of America to do this."

She argued that the timing of this development is critical. "This resignation and public fallout comes in the window between Purim and Passover," Grace said. "This is not a mistake that we are literally watching this happen in the window between Purim and Passover."

A Genesis Connection to Iran

Grace then turned to Scripture, arguing that the crisis surrounding Iran has a prophetic parallel in Genesis 14. Referring to the king of Elam, which she connected to the region of Iran, Grace highlighted the phrase: “Twelve years they had served Chedorlaomer. But in the thirteenth year they rebelled.”

She tied that passage to modern events by pointing to the start of Obama-era Iran negotiations in 2013. “2013 is when Obama started negotiating the Iran deal,” Grace said. “Thirteen years later it put us at 2026 when the people of Iran uproar and rebelled.”

This was not random. “You tell me this is a coincidence,” she said. “Genesis, this book is written thousands and thousands and thousands of years ago, and it’s aligning with what is happening today.”

Revelation, America and a Call to Discernment

Grace also moved into Revelation 4, connecting the imagery of the lion, ox, man and eagle to present geopolitical players. She said these symbols are “aligning with this year” and with what is happening now in Israel, Iran and the United States.

Yet, her central warning [was not merely political. It was spiritual.](#)

“We need to understand that this is all connected and we need to get in the Word of God,” Grace said. “And we need to ask God to start showing it to us through His lens.”

She specifically urged believers not to avoid the book of Revelation. “Don’t be intimidated to open it,” she said. “Open

it in this time.”

Ultimately, the answer to national turmoil is not panic, but prayer, discernment and a return to Scripture. What is happening now is more than a news cycle—it is a call for the church to wake up and watch.

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Heaven Breaks Out in Georgia: 400 Baptized in Powerful, Spontaneous Move of God

God is moving even when we do not know how.

According to the Christian Post, Bethlehem Church, a megachurch with multi-site locations in Georgia, baptized 400 people on Sunday, March 1.

This massive baptism, however, wasn't planned months in advance but only a few days in advance.

“This spontaneous baptism was not planned for months in advance; rather, it was a prompting of the Holy Spirit that was placed on Pastor Jason's heart a few days before,” the church told The Christian Post.

They further went on to say, “[Seeds had been planted for years, and that weekend was a harvest.](#) What we saw was a culmination of many different points of connection: small groups, lunches and coffees, and meetings with staff members and other believers.”

The lead pastor, Jason Britt, said that the message he was directed to preach on was from Acts 2, which is about the Day of Pentecost.

“It says, ‘Repent and be baptized,’” Britt is quoted as stating. “[I felt the Holy Spirit pressed that on me.](#)”

What took place at Bethlehem Church is not an isolated moment—it is part of a much larger stirring happening across the nation and around the world. From college campuses to local congregations, there is a renewed hunger for authentic encounters with God, a turning away from complacency and toward repentance, surrender and bold declarations of faith. 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Gen Z Has Had Enough: Bryce Crawford Reveals Why a Generation Is Running to Jesus

Gen Z isn’t rejecting God—they’re rejecting what feels fake.

“We are tired of fake stuff. We’re tired of fluff,” evangelist Bryce Crawford said recently.

In a powerful interview with Charisma Media, Crawford painted a sobering picture of a generation overwhelmed by constant digital stimulation.

“America’s being rocked to sleep by a lullaby of entertainment,” he said. “Everyone’s glued to their phones...

glued to their Netflix.”

“My generation... is sick of it... they realize none of it is fulfilling us,” Crawford said. “And so that’s where Jesus comes in.”

Evangelism That Actually Reaches People

What makes Crawford’s ministry stand out isn’t just his message. It’s how he delivers it.

Rather than preaching at crowds, Crawford focuses on personal, honest conversations with people from every background imaginable, speaking with those that society would see as unreachable and too far gone. However, he sees the truth that, as long as someone is alive, they are not far from God’s merciful hand.

“Transparency leads to transformation,” he said. “I’m broken. I’m a walking billboard of mistakes.”

His approach removes barriers that often keep people from engaging with Christianity.

“Hey, I’m not preaching at you. I’m learning with you right now,” he said.

Even his appearance plays a role in that accessibility.

“I just wear whatever I want... Crocs and [a] T-shirt, and shorts,” Crawford said, emphasizing authenticity over performance.

This style mirrors the relational ministry of Jesus—meeting people where they are, not where religion expects them to be.

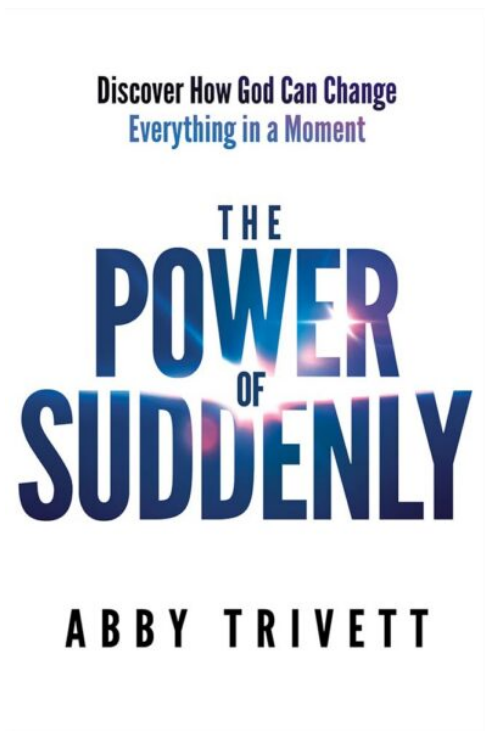
Why Gentleness Is Opening More Doors Than Confrontation

Crawford also challenged traditional models of evangelism that rely on confrontation.

“There’s a lot of people who street preach out of sincerity, but I just have not seen a lot of fruit in that,” he said.

Instead, he prioritizes conversations rooted in biblical truth and compassion.

“We’re saying the same stuff... but we’re explaining it... with gentleness and respect,” Crawford said, referencing 1 Peter 3.

This shift is producing real impact.

“We need more one-on-one conversations that treat human beings as human beings, rather than... statistics,” he said.

In a culture skeptical of institutions and religious

performance, that kind of intentionality is breaking through.

What He Learned From Sitting Down With Kenneth Copeland

One of Crawford's most surprising recent moments came during a sit-down interview with televangelist Kenneth Copeland.

While Crawford made it clear where he stands, [he approached the conversation with humility.](#)

"I do not believe in the prosperity gospel... but I'm going to be fair... I'm going to be gentle, and I want to talk about it," he said.

Rather than entering a combative stance, Crawford chose to listen.

"I'm trying to understand where you get this from," he explained.

The experience left a deeper impression than expected.

"Even though we disagreed, we had a great conversation," Crawford said, hinting that viewers may be surprised.

"There's something in that episode that I think people will be shocked to hear from him," he said.

A Generation Waiting for Spiritual Fathers

Crawford also believes the future of Gen Z revival depends not just on young voices—but on older generations stepping in.

"We need more fathers and mothers to step up," he said. "Pass the baton. Don't die with it."

And Gen Z isn't resistant—they're ready.

"Absolutely, they will [receive them]," Crawford said. "I think we're waiting."

In a world overflowing with noise, distraction and counterfeit connection, Gen Z isn't just searching—they're awakening. A generation that has tasted everything the world has to offer and found it empty is now turning toward something real, something eternal.

And perhaps the deeper question for the church is this: will we meet them there?

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God or Mother Mary? Candace Owens' Controversial Speech on Faith and Charlie Kirk

Candace Owens has long stood as one of the most polarizing figures in the conservative movement, especially as she has grown in sharing anti-Israel views and condemning the actions of Erika Kirk, the widow of Charlie Kirk.

“She Is What I Needed”

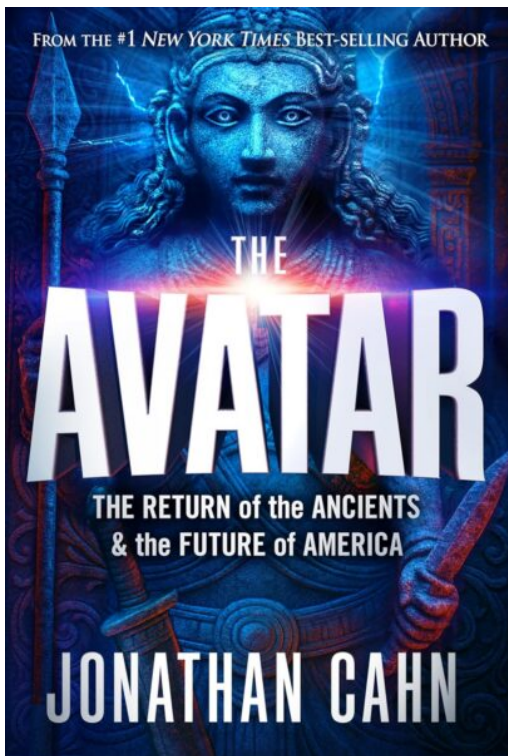
Following that experience, Owens described [a shift in how she interpreted events around her](#):

“Since Charlie's passing, there have just been random like little miracles that have happened and I feel her presence like she's the person—she is what I needed.”

She continued this statement, placing the name “Mary” where God should belong.

And it's funny now in the retrospect because when you think about a mother, a mother is something—is someone that you need, right? It's someone that you need. Babies need their

mother, right? It's less about want and more about need.

She also shared a quote backing this perspective:

If you put all the love of all the mothers into one heart, it still would not equal the love of the heart of Mary for her children.

A Biblical Perspective on Faith and Mediation

The Bible consistently points believers to Jesus Christ as the sole source of mediation, comfort and access to God:

“For there is one God and one mediator between God and mankind, the man Christ Jesus” (1 Tim. 2:5).

Scripture does not instruct believers to seek a spiritual relationship with Mary, nor does it present her as an intercessor or source of supernatural guidance. Instead,

Christians are encouraged to approach God directly:

“Let us then approach God’s throne of grace with confidence” (Heb. 4:16).

Mary holds a place of honor as the mother of Jesus, but the New Testament centers faith, prayer and dependence entirely on Christ. This means that the message of the gospel is clear: hope, peace and salvation are found in Jesus alone. Mary cannot save us, and as God’s children through our faith in Jesus, we are invited to have a close and intimate relationship with God one-on-one. No priest, no saint, no person outside of Jesus can bring us salvation and true satisfaction.

And that is very Good News.

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Former Worship Pastor Indicted in Wife’s Killing, Bond Set at \$3.5 Million

According to Dayton, Ohio news outlet WDTN TV 2, former worship pastor and American Idol contestant Caleb Flynn appeared in

court after being indicted on 11 charges. This includes four charges for the murder of his wife, Ashley.

During the arraignment, Flynn pleaded not guilty to all counts, setting the stage for what could become [a lengthy and emotionally charged legal battle.](#)

If convicted, prosecutors indicated that Flynn could face life in prison without the possibility of parole.

A Courtroom Marked by Grief

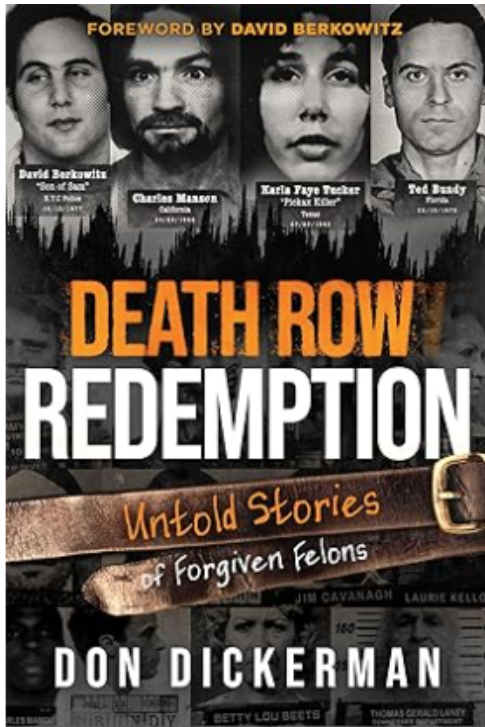
The weight of the tragedy was evident inside the courtroom, where family members of Ashley were present. Out of respect for their grief, the media were asked not to film the family during the hearing.

While many details remain under investigation, the case has already stirred deep concern due to the domestic nature of the allegations.

Bond Increased to \$3.5 Million

One of the most significant developments during the hearing was the decision to increase Flynn's bond.

Originally set at a lower amount, the judge raised it to \$3.5 million during the arraignment, citing the seriousness of the charges and the court's concern about the case.

Flynn's defense attorney declined to elaborate on the bond increase, stating only that he "looks forward to defending Flynn" as the legal process unfolds.

Strict No-Contact Order Issued

In addition to the bond increase, the court issued [a strict no-contact order](#), particularly concerning the couple's two children.

As explained during the hearing, the order prohibits Flynn from having any form of contact, including:

- In-person communication
- Third-party contact
- Communication through legal intermediaries

The only exceptions would be those specifically permitted under legal guidelines involving minor children.

A Call for Justice—and Reflection

Cases like this serve as sobering reminders of how quickly violence can devastate a family. This also calls for us to take a deeper look at the sanctity of life, the importance of justice and the need for healing in the aftermath of tragedy.

Right now, pray for Ashley Flynn's family as they deal with this heartbreaking scenario, especially for the Flynn children.

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
