

# Tim Walz Ends Re-Election Bid As Somali Fraud Scandal Explodes

Minnesota Gov. Tim Walz has officially dropped his re-election bid.

In a statement posted to X, the governor wrote:

*Minnesota has to come first – always.*

*Today, I'm proud of the work we've done to make Minnesota the best place to live and raise kids.*

*I've decided to step out of the race and let others worry about the election while I focus on the work.*

He also shared a four-page statement [where he attacked the president and the Republican Party.](#)

*Like many Minnesotans, I was glad to turn the page on 2025. It was an extraordinarily difficult year for our state. And it ended on a particularly sour note.*

*For the last several years, an organized group of criminals have sought to take advantage of our state's generosity. And even as we make progress in the fight against the fraudsters, we now see an organized group of political actors seeking to take advantage of the crisis.*

*I won't mince words here. Donald Trump and his allies—in Washington, in Saint Paul, and online – want to make our*

*state a colder, meaner place. They want to poison our people against each other by attacking our neighbors. And ultimately, they want to take away much of what makes Minnesota the best place in America to raise a family. They've already begun by taking our tax dollars that were meant to help families afford child care. And they have no intention of stopping there.*

Walz then claimed that the Minnesota government has looked into the cases of fraud.

*Make no mistake: We should be concerned about fraud in our state government. We cannot effectively deliver programs and services if we can't earn the public's trust. That's why, over the past few years, we've made systemic changes to the way we do business.*

*"We've gone to the legislature time and again to get more tools to combat fraud. We've fired people who weren't doing their jobs. We've seen people go to jail for stealing from our state. We've cut off whole streams of funding, in partnerships with the federal government, where we saw widespread criminal activity. We've put new locks on the doors of our remaining programs, and we've hired a new head of program integrity to make sure those locks can't be broken.*

He later explained how he decided to [rethink running for governorship](#) a third time over the holiday season.

*But as I reflected on this moment with my family and my team over the holidays, I came to the conclusion that I can't give a political campaign my all. Every minute I spend defending my own political interests would be a minute I can't spend defending the people of Minnesota against the criminals who prey on our generosity and the cynics who prey on our differences.*

*So I've decided to step out of the race and let others worry about the election while I focus on the work.*

Walz stated that he was “passing on the race with zero sadness and zero regret.”

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## **Robots with Skin? The Bizarre Innovation Pushing AI Closer**

# to Humanity

Are we getting closer to human-like robots among us?

A report by Interesting Engineering noted that scientists in China have created a “neuromorphic electronic skin.”

The purpose of this skin? It will allow robots to be able to experience touch, identify when an injury takes place and allow the machine to “respond to harmful contact with rapid, reflex-like movements...”

If you weren't sure [how quickly artificial intelligence](#) was evolving before, imagine what it will be capable of in the near future.

According to the report, this electronic skin is based on the human nervous system. It can help the robot determine whether an incoming interaction is harmful by using an “e-skin” or an “NRE-skin,” which transmits pulse signals comparable to those of human nerves. This skin is also composed of four distinct layers. When the robot comes into contact with something a “high-voltage signal is sent directly to the robot’s motors...”

As Scripture warns, the end times would be marked by an unprecedented increase of knowledge (Dan. 12:4), and the rapid evolution of artificial intelligence appears to be a striking reflection of that prophecy unfolding in real time. Technologies once confined to science fiction—machines that can “feel,” react and mimic human biological systems—are now becoming reality.

As AI becomes more autonomous and integrated into daily life, this is a reminder to use godly spiritual discernment in an age when deception may feel increasingly “alive.”

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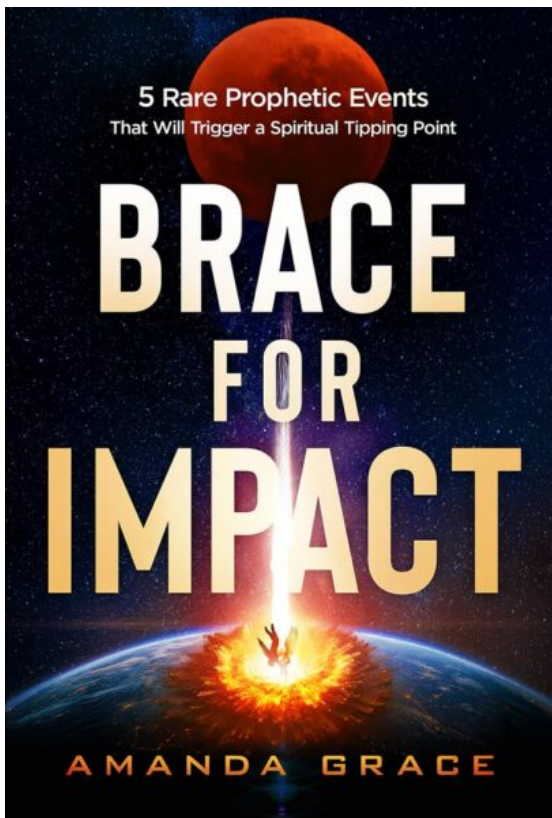
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## Supernatural Significance of 2026: The Prophetic Meaning Behind '26'

As we step into 2026, the number 26 carries powerful significance that cannot be ignored.

“Numbers are important in the Bible,” Rabbi Jason Sobel says in a recent video. He reminds viewers that 26 carries profound meaning because it is the numerical value of God’s divine name, Yod-Hey-Vav-Hey. Yod is 10, Hey is 5, Vav is 6 and Hey is 5—[together totaling 26.](#) This number is more than a symbol; it represents God’s revealed presence, covenantal faithfulness and active involvement in our lives. “The divine name is about presence,” Sobel explains.

In Scripture, names are revealed when relationships deepen, and destinies unfold. God first revealed His name to Moses at the burning bush in the 26th generation from Adam. “Moses wasn’t seeking promotion,” Sobel points out. “He was tending sheep. Identity comes before destiny. Resistance often follows revelation.” This prophetic pattern reminds us that 2026 is meant to be a year of definition—clarity about who God is, who we are and who we are meant to become.

Hebrews 12:2, the only verse in the New Testament that adds up to 2026 in Greek, calls us to focus on Jesus: “Looking unto Yeshua, the author and perfecter of our faith...” Here, Sobel emphasizes, “Focus on Him, Yeshua, who is the embodiment of the divine name of the Yud-He-Vav-He and 2026.”

This is a year to seek God’s presence above all else and align ourselves with His calling.

But 2026 is not only about revelation—it’s about weight. The

Hebrew word for glory, kavod also equals 26. “God wants you to prophetically carry His weight,” Sobel declares.

True glory is not about fame or applause; it is substance over spectacle, endurance over immediacy. “Light things attract attention,” he warns, “but heavy things shape history.” God is calling reformers and revivalists, those who will bear His name faithfully and carry His presence into the world.

Sobel reminds us that glory manifests where pressure does not collapse integrity: “Before increase comes, density is required. Before authority is given, gravity has to be formed.” This is the essence of spiritual weight—discipline, consistency and accountability. “Most people will never encounter the glory of God until they first experience the goodness of God.”

[2026 is a season to go from calling on God's name to carrying His name.](#) God is raising up modern-day Moseses—individuals who will be “weighty in the spirit,” walking in integrity, endurance and spiritual substance. As Sobel points out, it is a year of repositioning, realignment, revelation, renewal and revival.

This new year, the challenge is clear: seek God's presence above all else, carry His weight and allow His glory to define and refine you. “Call upon His name so you can carry His name. Carrying His name means carrying His kavod, carrying His glory. God wants to make you weighty. He wants to make you fat in the spirit,” Sobel exhorts.

Let 2026 be a year where revelation meets responsibility, where presence leads to glory and where we rise as weighty carriers of God's manifest presence.

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## **2026 Prophetic Dream Reveals a Coming Divine Shift**

Would you follow if a prophetic dream called you to action?

Through a series of prophetic dreams and confirmations, Rabbi Kirt Schneider explained how his path [2026 path has been shifted](#). Now, as he prepared to cut them off, he reflected on the biblical principle of costly obedience. “I’m not going to offer to the Lord that which cost me nothing,” he recalled from 1 Chronicles.

With a heart of faith and surrender, [Schneider recognized](#) that God’s new promises are better than what we leave behind. “If we’re going to enter into the new thing, we have to let go of the old thing,” he said.

This act marks not the end of a journey, but the beginning of a new one—a season where obedience, faith and divine opportunity intersect. “Let’s believe the new thing. The new thing is always better and greater than the old thing.”

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## Is the ‘6-7’ Era Ending? Why

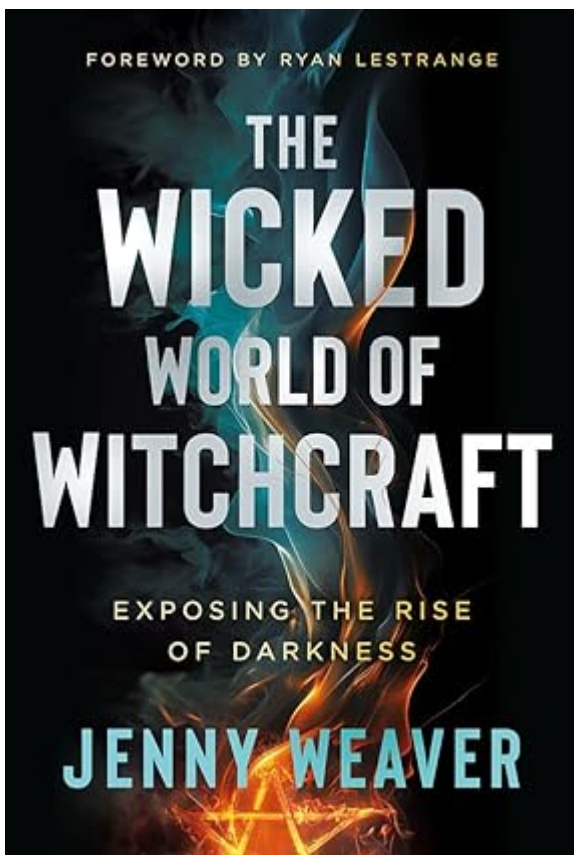
# the Trend May Soon Disappear

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## **Jack Hibbs Issues Urgent 2026 Warning: Why Bold Faith Is**

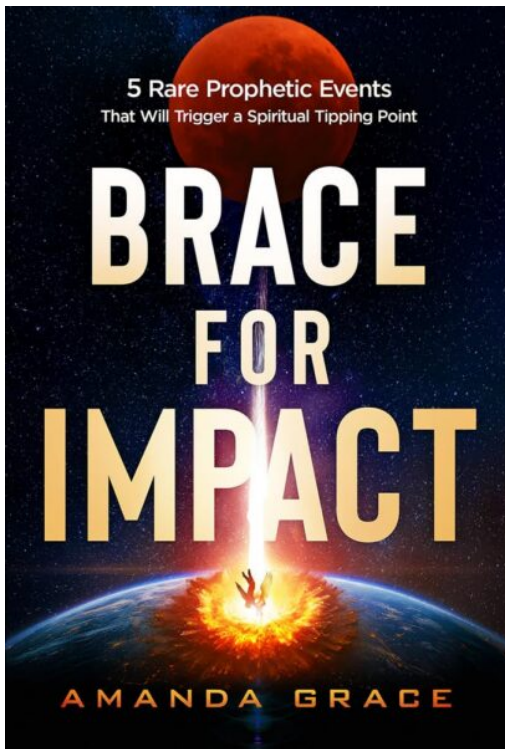
# Needed for the Year Ahead

Now that we are at the start of a new year, one of the big questions we must answer is this: Will we be strong and courageous when God calls us into new territory?

In a powerful message, Pastor Jack Hibbs delivered a faith-filled word that set the tone for 2026: Christians must reject fear, resist spiritual complacency, [and fully trust God's promises.](#)

The message, rooted in Numbers 13, challenges Christians to choose whether they would enter the new year with the mindset of Joshua and Caleb—or remain stuck in the wilderness like the other 10 spies who allowed fear to override faith.

Reflecting on a private email he had sent to staff, Hibbs revealed a burden he sensed during early morning prayer: “I sensed strongly that 2026 must be a year that we as individuals, as well as a staff, focus hard on being more like Mary and less like Martha.” He emphasized that private devotion must precede public ministry, warning that busyness without intimacy leads to spiritual dryness.

Quoting Jesus' words to the church in Laodicea, he cautioned against lukewarm faith: "Because you are lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will vomit you out of My mouth." He added, "We are a very blessed church, but we could wind up ruining everything by becoming more like a Martha."

Turning to Numbers 13, Hibbs then unpacked the familiar story of the 12 spies sent to survey the promised land. Although all agreed that the land was exactly as God promised—"flowing with milk and honey"—10 spies focused on the giants rather than on the promise.

"They said, 'We were like grasshoppers in our own sight,'" he noted. "But the giants never said that. The spies said it to themselves."

Only Joshua and Caleb saw beyond the opposition. "The land is awesome. Look at the evidence," Hibbs pointed out. "Let's do what God says."

Hibbs further explained why we need to look to Jesus above all

other things: He does what we cannot do. “You’re not the deliverer. [God’s going to be the deliverer](#)...There are no giants bigger than God,” he declared. “That ain’t going to happen.”

He gave a clear call to action, for people to turn away from fear: “I refuse to be a grasshopper before giants,” he said. “I will be a follower of Christ... and whatever comes into my line of sight as I follow Him—that’s God’s business.”

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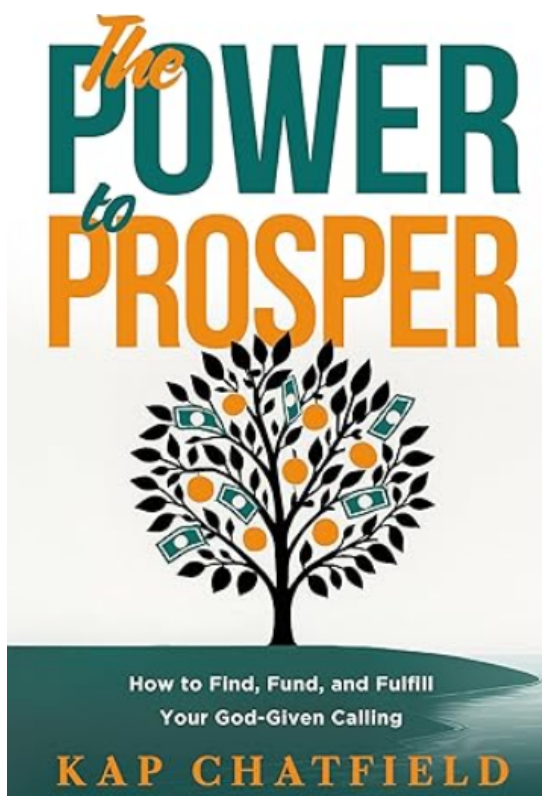
## **Unlock 2026: This God-First Blueprint Will Guarantee Your Breakthrough**

This principle became the foundation for Chatfield’s breakthrough. He explains, “You have believed in worldly wisdom that in order for you to earn the right to actually step into your assignment, you’ve got to get all your ducks in a row first. It’s the other way around. Seek first the kingdom of God, and then all [these other things are going to get added unto you.](#)”

He draws on Luke 5 to illustrate the power of surrender. Peter, fishing all night without catching anything, allowed Jesus to use his boat as a platform for ministry. “There’s a big difference between your business being available to God and your business being surrendered to God,” Chatfield said. When Peter obeyed, the miraculous happened: “Nevertheless, at Your word, I will let down the net. And when they had done this, they caught a great number of fish and their net was breaking.”

Ultimately, surrendering your business to God’s purposes allows Him to multiply it beyond what human effort can achieve. “If you build the thing that [God cares] about, [He will] build the thing that you care about,” Chatfield emphasizes. By aligning your work with God’s mission, your business becomes a vessel for kingdom impact, attracting provision and favor.

Chatfield also challenges business leaders to overcome fear and hesitation. “Most entrepreneurs don’t realize that the only thing holding you back from being obedient is fear. Fear of what people will think, fear of what they’re going to say if I use my platform for God.” Yet, when leaders step out in faith, God’s blessing overflows, impacting others and expanding influence.

He also left encouragement for those ready to yield their platforms: “If you would be willing to just lend Him your boat this year and say, ‘God, use it however you want to use it to get the word out as an amplification device for the gospel,’ you will experience the biggest breakthrough for your business.”

Put God first, surrender your work to His purposes and watch Him multiply your influence, resources and impact.

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## **Why This One Life-Changing Practice Could Transform Your 2026**
