

# The Temple Institute Makes Shocking Announcement: 'A Pure Red Heifer is Born'

A newly born red heifer in northern Israel is drawing global attention from researchers who study the biblical commandment outlined in Numbers 19 and from those watching developments surrounding the future of the Temple.

In a report published by the National Institute for Red Cow Research and shared by the Temple Institute, researchers announced the birth of a red heifer calf named Tamima on a dairy farm in the Galilee Mountains.

Long before Kathryn Krick's videos reached millions of viewers around the world, she was preaching to small crowds in Los Angeles parks, holding tightly to a promise she believed God had spoken over her life.

Now, in one of her most in-depth interviews to date, Krick sat down with Revival Nation host Bishop Alan DiDio to directly address the criticisms that have followed her ministry and to share the remarkable journey that led her from obscurity to global influence.

Krick's story did not begin with revival meetings or viral videos. Raised in a Presbyterian church, she says she always believed in Jesus but did not truly understand what a personal relationship with God looked like.

"I never remember a single day doubting that Jesus is my Lord and Savior," Krick said. "But I didn't know how to have a relationship with God until about my mid-20s."

After moving to Los Angeles to pursue acting, Krick says she

encountered the power of the Holy Spirit in a life-changing way through the baptism of the Holy Spirit.

“It was the first time I physically felt God,” she said. “My eyes instantly opened up to the love and majesty of Jesus.”

That encounter ultimately led her to abandon her dreams of a music career after receiving a prophetic word from Tanzanian minister Prophet GeorDavie, who told her she was called to ministry and would reach nations.

Yet the road was anything but easy.

Krick spent years preaching to tiny groups in Los Angeles. At one point, her church dwindled to just a handful of attendees meeting outdoors in a park during the COVID-19 pandemic.

“There was one person there, and she left in the middle of the message,” Krick recalled. “Then I turned and preached to the livestream, not even knowing if anyone was watching.”

Despite the discouragement, Krick says she held onto prophetic promises that revival would come.

That breakthrough arrived in early 2021 when a 59-second video featuring testimonies and prayer suddenly exploded online, generating more than a million views and thousands of comments from people claiming to experience healing, freedom and encounters with God’s presence.

The interview also tackled one of the most controversial clips associated with her ministry—a video in which she instructed a woman to sow a financial seed in connection with her son’s deliverance.

Critics accused Krick of teaching that deliverance could be purchased. Krick firmly rejected that interpretation.

“Every miracle from God is completely free,” she said. “You can never buy a miracle.”

Instead, she argued the instruction was a specific prophetic direction connected to surrender and obedience rather than a doctrine requiring payment for freedom.

DiDio also pressed Krick about widely circulated clips showing her honoring GeorDavie with language that many viewers found troubling.

Krick acknowledged that some of her words were poorly chosen and revealed that she had publicly denounced certain statements years ago.

“The way I said it was not good,” she admitted. “I wish I could go back and say it in a different way.”

She maintained that her comments reflected gratitude for a spiritual mentor who helped introduce her to the power of God.

Throughout the conversation, both Krick and DiDio repeatedly emphasized the importance of evaluating ministries by their fruit rather than internet criticism.

For Krick, the focus remains simple.

“Jesus deserves all the glory,” she said. “I’m truly just a mere vessel.”

# Pastors Tell Their Stories

What if the breakthrough you've been praying for isn't years away—but one divine moment away?

During a recent interview with Amanda Grace, Charisma Media reporter and author Abby Trivett shared the heart behind her new book, *The Power of Suddenly*, a message centered on how God often transforms lives in an instant after seasons of waiting, prayer and preparation.

Grace opened the conversation by noting her own familiarity with God's unexpected interventions.

"I am familiar with the power of suddenly in my life with Almighty God," Grace said. "What Almighty God can do suddenly in a moment."

For Trivett, the inspiration for the book emerged during a season of personal Bible study in 2024. As she reflected on Scripture, one theme repeatedly stood out.

"I said, 'Suddenly,'" Trivett recalled. "It is in the beginning of Scripture. It's in the end of Scripture. It is all throughout Scripture. And it's all about miracles."

That realization launched a deep exploration of biblical accounts where God intervened in extraordinary ways. From miraculous provision and healing to fulfilled promises and even resurrections, Trivett found a consistent pattern: God often moves swiftly when His appointed time arrives.

"It didn't matter how long people had been waiting for something like Abraham and Sarah," she said. "When God says it's time for something, He speaks, and it happens quickly."

One of the central themes of the book is what Trivett describes as the collision between "earth's not yet" and

“heaven’s already done.”

“God’s promises are yes and amen in Him,” Trivett explained. “Everything He’s already said in the heavenly realm, it’s already done. We’re just waiting for the manifestation of it to happen here on earth.”

While believers wait for those promises to unfold, Trivett encourages them to remain active in faith through prayer, Scripture and confession.

“It is their job to keep pressing in in prayer, to keep believing for it, to speak it out because there is power of life and death in the tongue,” she said.

The author pointed to the woman with the issue of blood as one of Scripture’s clearest examples of a “suddenly” moment. After 12 years of suffering and failed attempts to find healing, her faith produced an immediate miracle.

“She just believed that with a little bit of faith that if she just touched it, she would be healed,” Trivett said. “And as soon as she did, she was healed.”

Trivett also shared her own testimony of experiencing God’s sudden intervention. While preparing to graduate from college, she faced repeated disappointments in her search for employment. Then, after surrendering her plans to God’s will, everything changed.

“I said, ‘All right, Lord, I’m going to do the prayer of Your will for my life,’” she said. “Every single time that I did that... I would get a call back from these people at Charisma Media.”

Within weeks, she had accepted the position and moved 800 miles to Florida.

As the conversation concluded, Trivett addressed what she believes is one of the church's greatest misconceptions: that miracles have ceased.

"There's nowhere that tells us that He stopped doing it," she said. "I want people to walk away realizing that they can be completely free of absolutely anything and that He still is working and that He still wants to work in their lives."

For believers waiting on a promise, Trivett's message is simple but powerful: God has not forgotten. The same God who healed the sick, delivered the oppressed and fulfilled impossible promises in Scripture is still moving today. And when His perfect timing meets a believer's faith, a suddenly moment can change everything.

## **Jonathan Cahn Introduces 'The Dark Angel' in New End-Times Thriller**

Marilyn Hickey's life and legacy were honored in a powerful celebration of faith, remembrance and renewed spiritual commissioning as family members, ministry friends and church leaders reflected on the global impact of her decades-long ministry.

During the memorial service, Hickey's daughter, Sarah Bowling,

described her mother as a woman who lived with bold, barrier-breaking faith and an unshakable love for the Word of God.

“She carried the gospel to very difficult, unreached places,” Bowling said. Comparing her mother to the “crazy faith friends” in Mark 2 who tore open a roof to bring a paralyzed man to Jesus, Bowling added, “My mom ripped up the roof. She took off the limits.”

Bowling said countless women in ministry have shared how Hickey’s example gave them courage to preach and minister publicly around the world.

“So many people have said, ‘Because of your mom, she took off the roof, she took off the limits, especially for women and women sharing the gospel all over the world,’” Bowling said.

She also highlighted one of Hickey’s lifelong ministry mandates: “Cover the earth with the Word.”

According to Bowling, Hickey began by leading home Bible studies and eventually expanded into international ministry through radio, television and global evangelistic outreach.

“She loved the Bible,” Bowling said. “The love for the Bible began when she was about 11 years old. And it carried with her throughout her life.”

Bowling also shared deeply personal memories of her mother, describing her as both spiritually passionate and joyfully human. She recalled Hickey’s sense of humor, practical jokes and unwavering commitment to passing biblical truth down to future generations.

The service included several recorded tributes from longtime

ministry friends, including Rick Renner and Denise Renner.

Reflecting on Hickey's influence, Rick Renner said, "I believe that Marilyn Hickey is one of the most significant voices, female voices, that have ever spoken, maybe in the history of the church."

Renner emphasized the enormous reach of Hickey's ministry, particularly her evangelistic work in Muslim nations.

"Marilyn spoke to more people in person than anybody can comprehend," Renner said. "And she may, as a woman, have spoken to more people physically than any other woman in history."

He also reflected on Hickey's unusual favor among Muslim communities, recalling one of her well-known sayings: "Marilyn always said, 'I love Muslims, and Muslims love me.' And they did. They loved her."

Renner said Hickey remained committed to ministry until the very end of her life.

"Marilyn is an example of someone who gave every ounce of her life to fulfill her call to the very, very end," he said.

Throughout the service, speakers repeatedly challenged believers not simply to mourn Hickey's passing, but to continue the spiritual legacy she modeled through faith, evangelism and dependence on the Holy Spirit.

In a prerecorded message played near the end of the memorial, Marilyn Hickey offered a final gospel invitation, encouraging listeners to receive Jesus Christ and to commit their lives fully to God.

"I want you to have a supernatural life here and I want you to go to heaven and have a heavenly life," Hickey said in the recorded message.

As worship filled the sanctuary and ministers prayed over attendees, the celebration became more than a memorial—it became a call for believers to rise up again in faith, return to the Word of God and continue carrying the gospel to the nations.

Hickey's life now stands as a testimony that one surrendered life can shake nations, break barriers and inspire generations to boldly proclaim Jesus Christ around the world.

## **Ancient Biblical Warning Comes Alive as Kamala Harris Eyes Possible 2028 Run**

# **Gunshots Erupt Outside White House, Secret Service Shoots Armed Suspect**

A frightening scene unfolded outside the White House Saturday evening after gunshots rang out near the presidential complex, sending Secret Service agents, journalists and staff scrambling for safety.

According to Fox News, an armed male suspect was shot by Secret Service personnel after an exchange of gunfire near the White House grounds. The incident reportedly occurred near 17th Street and Pennsylvania Avenue in Washington, D.C., just outside one of the security checkpoints surrounding the executive mansion.

Fox later reported that authorities confirmed the suspect's identity as Nasire Best, 21, from Maryland. He reportedly died while being transported to GW Medical Center. He reportedly had mental health challenges and a history of encounters with the Secret Service.
