

'Praise God': The Defunding of Planned Parenthood Is a Major Spiritual Victory

In a chilling exploration of Revelation 13:14–15, Pastor Kap Chatfield issued a powerful warning about the direction of modern technology and its eerie alignment with biblical prophecy. The verse speaks of a time when the second beast, known as the false prophet, “was granted power to give breath to the image of the beast, that the image of the beast should both speak and cause as many as would not worship the image of the beast to be killed.”

“This scripture gives us one of the most mysterious and chilling details in all of Bible prophecy,” Chatfield said. “The first beast is going to say, ‘I need you to create something that will ... basically take me and codify me and make me an image.’”

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While early readers of Revelation may have struggled to envision such a reality, Chatfield argued that current technological advancements bring the prophecy into sharp focus. “We’ve created artificially intelligent avatars that can speak ... now they can think for you and they can interact in real time,” he said. “We have deep fakes ... holograms ... Tesla’s creating humanoid robots ... you can buy a robot for like, I think, 20,000 bucks that can ... be a robot butler for your house.”



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His tone grew more urgent as he connected this rise in artificial intelligence to a coming deception. “What if the image of the beast is not actually ... a golden statue like Nebuchadnezzar or a golden calf ... but is actually a globally accepted artificially intelligent representation of the antichrist himself?” he asked. “What if it’s something powered by a super intelligent system that can speak, influence and even make life or death decisions?”

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At the heart of Chatfield’s message is a call for spiritual awareness and biblical literacy in the face of emerging AI systems that mimic life and consciousness. “The more we build technology that mimics consciousness and the more society becomes conditioned to obey digital prompts without question, the easier it becomes for a powerful AI-driven system to be embraced as something holy and transcendent.”

Chatfield made it clear he is not claiming that AI is the beast itself, but warned it may be the very tool that fulfills the prophecy. “I’m not saying that AI itself is the beast,” he said. “But what I am saying is that AI may be the very tool used to give the image of the beast its voice, its life, its conviction and its terrifying authority.”

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As the lines between the spiritual and digital worlds continue to blur, this message from Chatfield stands as a sobering reminder: now more than ever, Christians must sharpen their discernment, not through speculation, but by anchoring themselves in the truth of God’s Word.

End Times Expert Reveals How Globalists Are Preparing for the Antichrist

As tensions escalate in the Middle East following a coordinated U.S. and Israeli military strike on Iran, bestselling author and prophecy expert Troy Anderson is calling the event a potential prophetic turning point.

President Donald Trump, who referred to the strike as Operation Midnight Hammer, may be stepping into a biblical role akin to the ancient Persian King Cyrus, Anderson said in a recent interview with Charisma Media.

“King Cyrus, in Isaiah 45, he’s a Persian king who didn’t know that God had called him His anointed,” Anderson said. “God raised him up to liberate the Jewish people, restore Jerusalem, rebuild the temple after decades of Babylonian captivity.”

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In a similar vein, Anderson said Trump has emerged as “a political disruptor, a spiritual defender,” and “an outsider raised up to stand with Israel, confront evil regimes like Iran and uphold the Judeo-Christian foundations amid this moral collapse we’re seeing in this country.”

Anderson pointed to the strike’s name and timing as filled with prophetic overtones. “Midnight is a consistent biblical sign of divine judgment and deliverance,” he said. “Think of

the plagues of Egypt in Exodus... the bridegroom in Matthew 25 arriving at midnight. The word hammer in Jeremiah 23:29 is symbolic of God's word breaking strongholds."

Adding to the significance, Anderson noted that "on the eve of the strike over the weekend, there was a major earthquake in Iran, which in biblical terms often symbolizes God shaking the nations before a decisive move."

He also highlighted Israel's role in the strike, referring to its counterpart operation known as Operation Rising Lion. "These two operations—Operation Roaring Lion and Operation Midnight Hammer—working together, America and Israel. It seems very prophetic to me," Anderson said.

In a speech following the strike, Trump declared, "We love you, God, and God bless Israel." For Anderson, this public acknowledgment of God carried major significance. "When a world leader like this says, 'We love you, God,' after launching one of the most daring, precise military operations in modern history, it's something to pay attention to."

He cited Jeremiah 49:35, where God declares, "I will break the bow of Elam," referring to ancient Iran. "Elam was an ancient kingdom located in southern Iran, very near where these nuclear programs that were destroyed over the weekend are," Anderson said. "God declared He'll break the bow... a metaphor for Elam's military strength."

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Anderson believes this event may be a "partial fulfillment or foreshadowing" of the biblical prophecy. "Could Operation

Midnight Hammer somehow prophetically be that this is a way to bring peace to the Middle East and revival?"

He added that spiritual revival is already sweeping across America. "We just went to the Baptize America event here in Pirates Cove in Corona del Mar where the Jesus Movement started. There's like a thousand people there... getting baptized," he said. "We're seeing all these prophetic things happening, but then this revival breaking out. It's really quite remarkable."

For Anderson, the event is a wake-up call to believers: "Are we living this Isaiah 45 moment? God is raising up leaders not just to preserve nations, but to prepare the church for what's coming."

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He urged Christians to take this moment seriously. "It's a time to pray. It's a time to fast. It's a time to draw close to the Lord," he said. "Just like Cyrus opened the gates for Israel's return, Trump may be opening a prophetic window for America's spiritual return."

Anderson warned that the window could close quickly if tensions escalate. "There's always a possibility of World War III breaking out... or of Gog and Magog," he said. "That's why it's so important to pray... that Russia, other countries won't give nuclear bombs to Iran and we could have a successful outcome here."

He concluded with a challenge to the body of Christ: "We all need to pray, fast and repent and intercede for Israel and for America and for the world in this situation."

Provision for the Vision: A Prophetic Dream About God's Faithful Giving

While much of the world's attention remains fixed on wars, economic instability and geopolitical unrest, a quieter but potentially prophetic development has unfolded in Rome. A recent high-level meeting between the Roman Catholic Church and the Eastern Orthodox Church may carry implications far beyond ecclesiastical unity, some believe it could be a step toward fulfilling end times biblical prophecies.

Pope Leo XIV recently welcomed a delegation from the Eastern Orthodox Church to the Vatican, marking another exchange in the long and complex history between the two branches of Christianity. However, this meeting bore a notable difference in tone. The pope expressed his clear desire to restore full visible communion between the Catholic and Orthodox churches—an unprecedented move if realized.

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Such a reunion would effectively reverse the 1,000-year-old divide that began with the Great Schism of 1054. That historical split was not merely theological—it stemmed from political and cultural tensions between Rome in the West and Constantinople in the East. Disputes over papal authority, the wording of the Nicene Creed, and liturgical practices drove a wedge between the two major centers of Christian influence.

Recent history had appeared to further stall any

reconciliation. In 2024, the Coptic Orthodox Church cut off dialogue with the Vatican due to Pope Francis's controversial stance on issues of gender and sexuality. But Pope Leo I 14th's arrival and his disassociation from those positions seem to have reopened the door to cooperation with the East.



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This latest move carries profound religious weight, but it may also echo themes found in biblical prophecy. In the book of Daniel, a statue representing a succession of empires ends with legs of iron and feet mixed with iron and clay—symbols long interpreted to represent a divided yet enduring Roman influence, both past and future. Some scholars see the Catholic and Orthodox churches as the religious counterparts of these iron legs—East and West.

The book of Revelation also references a powerful religious figure who promotes global unity under deceptive spiritual pretenses. Revelation 13 describes this individual as a second beast who works in tandem with a political leader, often identified as the Antichrist. Revelation 17 further describes a global religious system symbolized as "Mystery Babylon," which holds sway over the kings of the earth but is ultimately destroyed by the very powers it serves.

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While no definitive claim is being made that this current reunification effort fulfills prophecy directly, the alignment of events has raised questions. The possibility of merging the two largest historic branches of Christianity—against a backdrop of growing political unity in Europe and interfaith initiatives like the Abrahamic Family House—has led some to

wonder whether this is the beginning of a broader spiritual consolidation.

Critics warn against making rash conclusions, but many in the prophetic community urge discernment. These developments may not be the final fulfillment of end-times prophecy, but they could represent the architectural groundwork of systems described in Scripture.

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As ancient power centers reconnect and ideologies blend beneath banners of tolerance and peace, some are asking whether this movement is preparing the way for a global spiritual system that will eventually oppose biblical truth.

Whether this reunification proceeds or not, the unfolding events serve as a reminder: believers are called to remain watchful, rooted in Scripture and anchored in the eternal kingship of Christ, not in the shifting alliances of earthly institutions.

Dr. Ben Carson Reveals the War on Faith and Family

Rabbi Curt Landry is calling believers to examine their spiritual vision and align their focus with God's purposes during the Hebrew month of Tammuz, which he describes as a season of reflection, discipline and intentionality.

“Tammuz is the ‘Month of the Eye’ – a time focused on what you see, both physically and spiritually,” Landry said during a recent podcast episode. Referencing the biblical story of the 12 spies who scouted the Promised Land, he noted, “You have 10 that go out and see giants, and then you have two that see the fruit and the opportunity for harvest.”

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The rabbi emphasized the need to protect one’s eye gate and avoid consuming media or information that stirs fear or anger. “Keep your eyes on the promise – don’t be glancing off and looking at bad reports,” he warned. “This is the month where the 10 with the bad report caused 40 years of wandering in a wilderness.”

To practice what he preaches, Landry took a 45-day break from social media to reset spiritually. “I shut down for ... 45 days ... and I spent that time seeking the Lord,” he said. “I was struggling getting over [offenses], and I can’t do this – my ministry – if I’m not settled with the Lord.”

That period of consecration brought breakthrough. “I got healed from all offenses ... I learned how to soar above the circumstances,” he said. “I don’t wrestle against people ... these are spirits ... and I overcame it.”

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Landry encouraged listeners to not only guard their eyes but also cast vision for their future. “Create a vision board ... visualize yourself in that lifestyle,” he explained. “When you

do ... what you will look upon and think upon, it will happen.”

As men and spiritual leaders especially face increasing cultural pressures, Landry challenged them to rise with boldness. “Where are the men?” he asked. “Joshua and Caleb were men. The other 10 had no courage.”

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He concluded with a practical yet powerful reminder: “Little eyes, be careful what you see. Stay focused on what the Lord is asking you to go. This month is about vision, purpose and identity – and what you do with your eyes will shape your future.”

Troy Brewer Reveals Prophetic Meaning Behind July's Full Moon and Meteor Showers

Too often overlooked or misunderstood, the Sabbath is far more than an ancient tradition, it's a divine rhythm built into creation itself. Rabbi Kirt Schneider believes it's time for believers to reclaim this sacred day, not as a legalistic burden, but as a gift meant to refresh the soul and restore the body.

“The principle of the Sabbath and the law of the Sabbath was given before the Mosaic law,” Schneider said in a teaching on Decoding the Torah. “In fact, it's in the first chapters of

Genesis where the Lord created the world in six days, then He rested on the seventh day and hallowed it.”

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Many Christians, he explained, disregard the Sabbath because they view it as part of the Old Covenant. But Schneider emphasized that the Sabbath “predates the Ten Commandments” and is rooted in the very fabric of creation. “The Sabbath, beloved one, is a creation principle,” he said. “The Sabbath was given before there was a Jew or a Gentile.”

More than a day off, the Sabbath is a day to be set apart unto the Lord. “We’re staying close to home. We’re not exerting ourselves with responsibilities and burdens,” Schneider explained. “We’re sitting before the Lord, spending time with loved ones, enjoying meals together, taking a nap, listening to beautiful worship music, reading Scripture.”

The principle is simple, yet transformative: six days of work followed by one day of sacred rest. “It’s such a beautiful thing to have a reason to be irresponsible,” he said. “Nothing we have to do but rest in Him.”

Rabbi Schneider also addressed the confusion around the Sabbath’s timing, clarifying, “The Sabbath has never been changed by the way from Saturday to Sunday. Sunday is the first day of the week that we celebrate the Lord’s resurrection... but Sunday never replaced the seventh day of the week.”

He reminded viewers of Jesus’ words in Mark 2: “The Sabbath was made for man, and not man for the Sabbath.” Schneider echoed the point: “It was God’s gift to you... so that we could

be revived and refreshed and rejuvenated.”

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To observe the Sabbath well, he advised planning ahead: pre-cooking meals, finishing chores early, and even disconnecting from technology. “I’m so blessed to know that every week, I have a day come Friday at sunset that—bam—all my technology is disconnected,” he said. “Because it frees me from that addictive cycle that causes so much stress.”

In practicing Sabbath rest, Schneider said believers create space for God to move in their lives. “The Shabbat is a time, beloved, where the Lord... re-presents Himself to us when we make space for Him to do that.”

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He concluded with a reminder of God’s own example. “He created the world in six days and then He Himself rested and was refreshed. We’re created in His image. So if we want to walk out the image that we’re created in... we should work six days and rest one.”

By honoring the Sabbath, believers can find renewed strength, peace of mind and deeper intimacy with God.
