

Steven Spielberg Says Alien Disclosure Could Shake Christian Faith. But Why Is Christianity Always the Target?

Hollywood has been fascinated with the possibility of extraterrestrial life for a very long time. Now legendary filmmaker Steven Spielberg is taking that conversation a step further.

Speaking about his upcoming film *Disclosure Day*, Spielberg said the movie explores what would happen if evidence of alien encounters were suddenly released to the entire world.

“‘Disclosure Day’ is about how, if somebody had the power and if somebody had possession of the entire archive of visual evidence of what’s been happening for the last 80 years, what would happen if they decided to do a data dump across the entire world all at once?” Spielberg said.

Steven Spielberg says his new movie, Disclosure Day, about aliens will have Christians and people of faith second-guessing their own religion.

Spielberg says the movie will take the position of the Church.

He described the film as a chase story centered on efforts to stop that information from being revealed.

But the most revealing comments were not about government secrecy. They were about God.

“The movie takes the position of the believers, or the curious, the ones that have been deeply affected by this,” Spielberg said. “The movie also takes the position of the church. What does this do to the fundamental beliefs that many of us have?”

He then posed a question that has become increasingly common throughout the modern disclosure movement.

“Is God our God only on this planet?” Spielberg asked. “Or is God a god for every system where there’s civilization and intelligent life, and even developing life?”

It is a question that surfaces repeatedly whenever discussions of UFOs, aliens and disclosure enter the mainstream. Yet there is another question that deserves attention.

Why is Christianity so often the focus?



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The disclosure movement rarely centers on how alien life would affect belief in Hinduism, Buddhism or other world religions. Time and again, the conversation returns to Christianity, the Bible and the identity of Jesus Christ.

That is not an accident.

At the heart of Christianity is a claim unlike any other religious claim in human history.

Jesus did not present Himself as one path among many. He declared Himself to be the only path.

“I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me” (John 14:6).

Many religions teach that there are numerous roads leading to God. Jesus rejected that idea completely. His words leave no room for alternative paths, alternative saviors or alternative sources of salvation.

That reality helps explain why so much attention is devoted to Christianity whenever disclosure discussions emerge.

The central issue is not whether intelligent life exists elsewhere in the universe. The central issue is the identity of Jesus Christ.

The New Testament repeatedly warns believers about deception in the last days.

“Let no one deceive you by any means” (2 Thess. 2:3).

Jesus Himself warned, “Take heed that no one deceives you” (Matt. 24:4).

The biblical conflict has always been spiritual before it becomes physical. Scripture describes a battle for truth, a battle for souls and a battle over the identity of Christ.

Spielberg’s film raises questions about faith, God and humanity’s place in creation. Those questions will undoubtedly attract audiences around the world.

Yet the answer remains unchanged.

No disclosure event alters the gospel.

No new revelation replaces the cross.

No alleged higher intelligence changes who Jesus is.

Two thousand years after His resurrection, the claim of Christ stands exactly as it always has: He is the Way, the Truth and

the Life, and no one comes to the Father except through Him.

Rare 6.1 Earthquake in Gulf Shakes Florida, Prompts Evacuations

A rare 6.1 magnitude earthquake struck the Gulf of America on Monday, sending tremors across Florida and prompting evacuations in several buildings.

The earthquake was centered west-northwest of Mantua, Cuba, and was felt as far north as Tallahassee. The U.S. Geological Survey received more than 4,000 reports from people who felt the shaking.

In Seminole County, officials said, "Multiple calls have been received at the Emergency Communication Centers (9-1-1). Seminole County employees report feeling the tremor in multiple buildings."

The statement continued: "Emergency Management is coordinating with healthcare facilities and other critical infrastructure."



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Officials also noted that the fire department responded to "at least one building evacuated for safety."

Several buildings in the Miami area were evacuated as residents reported swaying structures and shaking furniture.

Walt Disney World Resort confirmed the earthquake was felt in Central Florida.

"An earthquake was felt this afternoon in Central Florida, including Walt Disney World Resort and Universal Orlando Resort," a statement said.

"There are no reports of injuries or major damage. Our teams are continuing to monitor the situation."

USGS Earthquake Hazards Program spokesperson Steven Sobieszczyk said aftershocks are possible.

"Given the size of the quake, we would expect further aftershocks over the coming days," he said.

Despite its strength, officials said the earthquake posed no tsunami threat. The quake is believed to be one of the strongest ever recorded in the Gulf region and the strongest ever recorded near Florida.

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Israeli Flags Fly Freely on the Temple Mount as Messianic Fervor Grows

The Temple Mount is changing.

Israeli flags now wave openly atop Judaism's holiest site. Jewish worshippers pray, sing and ascend the mount in growing numbers. Restrictions that once suppressed visible expressions of Jewish worship continue to fall away as religious fervor gains momentum in Jerusalem.

The Temple Institute celebrated the development in a June 7 social media post.

“SHAVUA TOV FROM THE TEMPLE MOUNT!

“Waving the flag of Israel on the Temple Mount continues unabated. Long forbidden by the police, who still seem to be trying to intimidate by filming the flag wavers, it has become common practice, alongside Jewish prayer and song.

“May the flag of the state of Israel yet wave, forever and ever, over the holy Temple Mount!

“Shavua tov! Have a good week!”

While most discussions surrounding Iran focus on nuclear negotiations, sanctions and military threats, two Israeli journalists say the deeper issue is spiritual.

During a recent episode of Watchman Newscast, host Erick

Stakelbeck spoke with Yair Pinto and Mati Shoshani, co-hosts of TBN Israel's Boots on the Ground, about the ongoing conflict involving Iran, Israel and Tehran's regional proxies.

Pinto argued that Iran's actions cannot be understood through politics alone.

"I would start with it's a spiritual war," Pinto said.

According to Pinto, Iran's leaders view regional conflict through a religious lens.

"According to their radical Shiite doctrine, they need to just open the gates of hell towards everybody around them, especially Israel and the United States," he said.

Pinto contended that the regime's worldview makes lasting peace difficult because conflict itself serves a larger purpose.

"They don't care about peace. They think this is an opportunity to actually fulfill their prophecies," he said.



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The comments came during a broader discussion about stalled negotiations between the United States and Iran. Pinto argued that Western leaders often assume peace and stability are the desired outcomes, while Iran's leadership may be operating from a completely different set of motivations.

"If you come from this understanding, then they don't care about peace," he said.

Shoshani echoed the belief that diplomacy has reached a dead end.

"I think at this point it should be clear to many people that there's a reality in which there is no agreement. Not today,

not tomorrow, not in the foreseeable months,” he said.

The interview concluded with a message of hope regarding Israel’s future despite ongoing wars and regional instability.

“I think that God is using Israel today to show the world that He’s still faithful,” Pinto said.

Pointing to Israel’s economic strength and military resilience, he added, “We need to praise God for being faithful and for being able to turn a rough situation into an amazing testimony that he’s in control.”

Stakelbeck echoed that sentiment as the segment ended.

“The God of Israel, the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob neither slumbers nor sleeps,” he said.

Many believers have entered this season carrying a weight they cannot fully explain. The pressure has intensified. The

opposition feels relentless. The battle has become exhausting.

During a recent broadcast, Amanda Grace delivered a message that explains why.

“The reason many of you feel such heaviness and oppression attempting to bear down on you is because you are on the brink of having one of the largest, most powerful breakthroughs in your life,” Grace said.

Rather than retreating under the pressure, she urged believers to recognize what may be happening beneath the surface.

“And the enemy is attempting to bear down as much pressure, exhaust you, weigh you down, distract you, cause those who are chained in the flesh to act up around you and disrupt your peace.”

Grace said the answer is not to quit but to press forward.

“Now says the Lord is the time to press in, contend,” she said. “My strength is made perfect in your weakness, where you are weak, I the Lord am strong.”



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Divine Helpers and Dormant Promises

Throughout the message, Grace repeatedly emphasized that God is positioning His people for breakthrough, restoration and fresh provision.

“As you focus, put your hand to the plow and commit to my way, my purpose and my plans, I the Lord shall fortify the weaknesses,” she said. “I shall cleanse the compromise.”

She also declared that some relationships and assignments are shifting as God prepares believers for a new season.

“The portioned stealers are being removed,” Grace said.

At the same time, she said new people are being brought into place.

“The divine helpers who have been assigned are coming in.”

Grace pointed to what she described as a coming harvest from prayers, sacrifices and acts of obedience that may have seemed forgotten.

“My system of seed time and harvest says the Lord is now awakening seeds planted years ago,” she said. “That have lain dormant shall now be awakened and produce.”

She added, “I am speaking to the harvest and commanding it to accelerate into the hands of those I have found worthy.”

One statement in particular stood out as she described what she believes is ahead for many believers.

“What was delayed a decade shall now come to pass within a year.”

A Call for the Daniels to Rise

Grace also pointed to the biblical example of Daniel, saying God is raising up men and women of wisdom, integrity and spiritual discernment for strategic positions of influence.

“Call in the Daniels says the Lord,” she said. “Call them into the capital, call them into ministries, call them into the corporate arena.”

She said believers should not be intimidated by the shaking taking place around them.

“As the nation shakes, as the nation sifts, the faithful shall rise,” Grace said. “Their influence shall carry.”

The message centered on a recurring theme: God is still in control.

“I the Lord am high above every principality power and might,” Grace said. “I do not bow nor do I concede to the systems of men.”

For believers who have spent months—or even years—waiting for answers, the message carried a clear challenge. Stay faithful. Stay focused. Keep moving forward.

“Walk circumspectly before me. Humble yourselves,” Grace said.

No matter how intense the pressure may feel today, Grace’s message pointed to a hope-filled reality: breakthrough may be far closer than it appears.

For those who have been standing, praying and believing, the encouragement is simple: Don’t quit now. Keep pressing in. Keep trusting God. The seeds are awakening, the harvest is accelerating and the breakthrough may already be at the door.

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Doctor Warns Hellish Near-Death Experiences May Be Far More Common Than Reported

A medical scientist who studied near-death experiences says frightening encounters of Hell during clinical death may be more common than many people realize.

Dr. Orson Wedgwood, a New Zealand-based healthcare researcher and author, told the Daily Mail that negative near-death experiences are likely underreported because many people either do not share them or cannot remember them.

“Some people may not report them because they are ashamed, or some may not remember due to dissociative amnesia, [that is] the experience was so horrific the brain stops them remembering it to avoid reliving the trauma,” Wedgwood said.

According to Wedgwood, only a percentage of people who are clinically dead report near-death experiences. Of those, a smaller percentage describe encounters marked by fear, dread and torment. He believes the true number is much higher.

“Dissociative amnesia due to the experiences being so bad may mean that as people age they are more likely to have a negative experience but are unable to remember – this is psychological not physiological,” he said.



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Wedgwood's research examined scientific studies alongside testimonies from people who reported out-of-body experiences during medical emergencies. His work led him to conclude that reports of both heavenly and hellish encounters deserve serious attention.

One recurring theme in negative experiences involved encounters with hostile beings. Wedgwood recounted testimony from one individual who described hearing voices beyond an open door while outside his body in a hospital room. The voices initially appeared welcoming before becoming violent.

“The pain felt real, and the fear was absolute,” Wedgwood said while recounting the testimony.

He also pointed to research involving consciousness during cardiac arrest. Wedgwood cited a study led by Dr. Sam Parnia that found bursts of brain activity associated with higher cognitive function during extended CPR efforts.

Wedgwood said many researchers have dismissed negative near-death experiences while accepting positive ones. He pointed to a 2019 study published in the journal *Memory* that found positive and negative near-death experiences shared many of the same characteristics.

“[They] concluded that they share the same set of traits as positive NDEs such as feeling more real than life, timelessness, 360 degree vision and heightened senses, except positive feelings were replaced by dread, fear and horror,” he said.

Discussions about hellish near-death experiences bring to mind the testimony of Bill Wiese, author of the bestselling book *23 Minutes in Hell*.



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Wiese has shared for years that he was shown a place of torment that included overwhelming darkness, extreme heat, demonic creatures, screams of agony and a crushing sense of hopelessness. He described being confined in a prison-like chamber and witnessing suffering beyond anything experienced on earth.

At the center of Wiese's message is the conviction that hell is real and that Jesus Christ provides a way of salvation through His death and resurrection.

The Bible repeatedly warns about eternal judgment while also proclaiming God's offer of redemption through Christ. Jesus spoke of both heaven and hell, calling people to repentance and faith.

We do not respond to these accounts with fear. We respond with gratitude for the grace of God and renewed urgency to share the gospel. The same Savior who warned of judgment stretched out His arms on the cross so that no one would perish but have everlasting life.

These testimonies remind us that eternity matters, every soul matters, and the message of Jesus Christ remains humanity's greatest hope. Our calling is clear: remain faithful, share the gospel boldly and point people to the One who conquered sin and death.

"For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life" (John 3:16).
