

Tom Horn's Prophetic Warnings Ring Louder in the Chaos of 2025

Christian apologist Ken Ham recently addressed a question that has perplexed believers and skeptics alike: What happens to those who die without ever hearing the gospel? He offers a message that is both sobering and hope-filled, reminding listeners that while we are limited in our knowledge, God is not.

"We are finite, fallible human beings who know nothing compared to God," Ham said. "God is infinite knowledge, infinite in wisdom. He knows everything." He emphasized that while we don't know every detail, we can trust God's justice and sovereignty: "Shall not the Judge of all the earth do what is just?"

Ham pointed to Scripture to support the idea that God makes Himself known to all people. "God has made it evident to everyone that He's the Creator," he said, citing Romans 1:20. He also noted Romans 2:15, stating, "We all know what's right and wrong," because God has written His law on human hearts.

When addressing the fate of children who die, Ham referenced 2 Samuel and David's statement: "I shall go to him, but he will not return to me," suggesting a biblical hint that children are with the Lord.

Ham stressed that those who seek truth will receive it: “If you want light, God will give you light.” He supported this with the story of the Queen of Sheba and her pursuit of wisdom, saying, “She wanted light. God gave her light.”

He concluded by affirming both human responsibility and divine sovereignty. “Faith comes by hearing and hearing by the Word of God,” Ham said. “God is the one who saves people by opening their heart to the truth.”

Ultimately, Ham urged listeners to trust God’s character: “Make sure that you open your heart to the Lord and say, ‘I want that light,’ and He will give you that light and save you for eternity.”

We Are Closer Now to the Third Temple Than Ever Before

In a recent message, Amir Tsarfati of Behold Israel urged believers to anchor their hope in the promises of Scripture, especially in the face of death and uncertainty. He reminded listeners that the Christian faith isn’t built on wishful thinking, but on solid, inerrant doctrine.

“The entire book of Romans is pure doctrine,” he said. “The doctrine of the hope that we must have... that our body is going to be redeemed out of this world.” His teaching focused on the rapture—not as a fringe belief, but as a vital part of Christian hope.

Quoting 1 Thessalonians 4, Tzarfati made it clear that this promise comes directly from God. “For this we say to you by the word of the Lord,” he read. “The Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a shout... and the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air.”

For Tzarfati, this isn't a vague future events, but is instead a source of daily comfort. “You have heavenly citizenship,” he said. “When you die, you don't die. You go home.”

Anticipating pushback, he confronted the common skepticism surrounding the rapture. “Why is the rapture your only problem?” he asked. “Was the parting of the Red Sea not something else? Isn't God the God of miracles?” Tzarfati called on believers to stop listening to mockers and instead hold tightly to the truth. “Comfort one another with these words,” he said.

What Does the Bible Say About Supernatural Encounters?

What if the stories of paranormal abductions weren't science fiction—but a dark, spiritual reality hidden in plain sight?

In an eye-opening interview with Charisma Media, author and supernatural researcher L.A. Marzulli joins abductee Karin Wilkinson to expose the disturbing truth behind her lifelong encounters with what the world calls “aliens,” and what Scripture may actually identify as fallen entities participating in a modern-day version of the “seed war” from Genesis 3:15.

Wilkinson's testimony is raw, emotional and unlike anything you've likely heard. Taken since early childhood, she describes screen memories, missing time and the chilling presence of non-human intelligences that threatened her family and tormented her for decades.

Demons are real, and according to Christian speaker Kap Chatfield, they're hoping you ignore that truth. In a recent video, Chatfield tackled a difficult but necessary topic in spiritual warfare—unmasking demonic tactics that keep people bound and misled. He explained that rather than blaming God

during painful life moments, believers should recognize the enemy's deception.

As Chatfield put it, "God was never the problem. The enemy was." Drawing from Scripture, he unveiled four biblical truths that he says demons hope Christians never realize.

1. Not Every Problem Is Natural

Chatfield began by breaking down a story from Mark 9 where a boy suffers violent episodes resembling a physical illness. But his father doesn't describe it medically—he says it's a spirit.

"The father didn't say his son had a neurological condition," Chatfield noted. "He said it was a spirit."

He pointed to Acts 10:38, where Scripture says Jesus healed "all who were oppressed by the devil."

The takeaway? "We're not denying physical sickness exists. But the Bible makes it clear. Some problems are not merely physical. They're spiritual. And if I can say it plainly—they are demonic."

2. Jesus Gave You Authority Over Demons

While many think deliverance is reserved for spiritual elites, Chatfield stressed that Jesus expected His followers to act with boldness.

"Jesus doesn't say, 'Oh, it's OK, only I can do this.' He says, 'You should have been able to handle this.'"

Referencing Luke 10:19, he said, "His name isn't a magic phrase. It's a delegated authority... The name of Jesus tells hell you're outnumbered."

Chatfield urged believers to stop outsourcing spiritual

battles, declaring, “If you call upon the name of Jesus, you have His authority in His name to cast that sucker out.”

3. Demons Fear Jesus’s Presence

Demons can hide in religious circles, but not when Jesus truly shows up.

“Demons can fake it around religion... but when Jesus shows up, demons panic,” Chatfield warned. “Even the demons believe—and tremble.”

He added, “If you can create an atmosphere where the presence of God can dwell, you’re going to make any demon in that territory very uncomfortable.”

4. Faith Breaks the Chains

Deliverance doesn’t require perfect strength—but it does require real faith.

“Jesus doesn’t say, ‘Try harder.’ He says, ‘Believe,’” Chatfield emphasized.

Even when faith feels weak, Chatfield reminded viewers that growth is possible. “Maybe I didn’t have enough faith for that battle... but maybe Jesus can give me enough faith for the next.” He cited Romans 10:17: “Faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the Word of God.”

Chatfield closed by reminding viewers that spiritual warfare is not a fantasy—it’s real.

“If you’re dealing with demonic oppression... you’re not crazy. You’re under attack. But here’s the best news—you’re not alone and you’re not powerless.”

He encouraged viewers to walk in their God-given authority, filled with the Holy Spirit and grounded in Scripture, declaring, “The devil should be underneath your feet and not the other way around.”

Prophetic Warning: Major Spiritual Shifts Coming in April, July and October

In a recent teaching, Apostle John Eckhardt brought fresh insight into the often misunderstood realm of personal prophecy, drawing from Dr. Bill Hamon’s foundational book *Prophets and Personal Prophecy*. What he shared wasn’t mystical or speculative—it was deeply scriptural, practical and, according to Eckhardt, essential for the church today.

A Word With Direction

“Personal prophecy is God’s specific word to an individual about their life purpose, direction or destiny,” Eckhardt said. He reminded listeners that prophecy should never replace Scripture, but must be understood “in light of Scripture, not

as a replacement for it.”

Eckhardt shows that the prophetic is not a thing of the past, but very much a New Testament reality. “Jesus Christ operated prophetically, and the prophetic continues through His body, the church,” he said. For those who feel uneasy around the idea of personal prophecy, Eckhardt clarified: “It is biblical, necessary and for edification, exhortation and comfort.”

Not Fortune-Telling—But Faith Building

According to Eckhardt, personal prophecy is far from mysticism or mere prediction. “Prophetic words are not fortune-telling; they are divine communications given for growth, alignment and activation.”

He teaches that prophecy often reveals God’s thoughts and intentions for an individual’s life, calling it “really what Jesus is thinking about you.”

However, he cautioned that many prophetic words are conditional, depending on obedience and alignment with God’s will. “If you’ll fast, if you’ll pray, if you’ll submit yourself to Me... then I will,” he quoted. “Conditional prophecy. Many prophecies are conditional.”

A Helper, Not a Dictator

Eckhardt also spoke about how prophecy can guide believers through major life decisions—whether it’s in marriage, career or relocation—but never in a way that violates biblical wisdom. “Never receive prophecies from people who are

controlling, manipulative, want to control your life through prophecy,” he said. “Prophecy will never tell you to marry someone that is already married.”

He encouraged believers to always be led by the Holy Spirit. “You’ll bear witness with prophetic words even though it’s something new, something different,” he said. “If it’s not of God, you’ll feel uneasy, you’ll feel a check in your spirit.”

Partnering With the Word

Eckhardt emphasized that prophecy requires action, not passivity. “Personal prophecy is not automatic. It is an invitation to partner with God through faith, prayer and obedience,” he said. “Avoid passivity. Do not wait passively for fulfillment.”

He also warned not to elevate prophets above God’s Word: “Don’t worship prophets. This is very important: don’t lift prophets up above what they are. The prophet is a vessel.”

What Prophets Do for the Church

“They actually help us in the prophetic, help train us, activate us to hear God’s voice,” he said, referencing Ephesians 4:11. “Prophets stir up spiritual gifts and callings through prophetic impartation and declaration.”

Eckhardt called prophets “builders who lay foundations for revival, reformation and apostolic expansion.” He continued, “They can speak concerning now, but they even speak concerning

things from the past. They're reformers and equippers in the body of Christ."

And when the prophetic is handled rightly, Eckhardt said, it brings lasting fruit: "Revelation, impartation, activation, edification, exhortation, comfort, encouragement, courage, boldness, life, healing, deliverance."

As more churches embrace prophetic ministry with humility and scriptural grounding, Eckhardt believes the Church will continue to grow in power and clarity: "We've seen the water level of the prophetic rise, and more people are now flowing in the prophetic probably than any other time that I've known in history."

Jack Hibbs Issues Blunt Warning: Not All Spiritual Awakenings Are From God

Evangelist Perry Stone has issued what he says is a direct prophetic warning from God to the nation of China. The warning, he said, was birthed in prayer, steeped in Scripture and confirmed in his spirit through the Holy Spirit.

"A warning to China from the Lord," Stone began in his latest video message. "Someone says, 'Well, how does a person know when the Lord speaks to them?' First of all, you can know from

Scripture, which is the inspired Word of God.”

Stone emphasized that he doesn't take messages like this lightly. “Anytime I say that the Lord has given me something to share, I never ever take it lightly,” he said. “I sort of do it in fear and trembling, but I do it knowing that the Holy Spirit birthed it in my spirit.”

Stone quoted James 5:1–6 as the Scripture the Lord gave him for China's communist leaders. “‘Go to now, ye rich men, weep and howl for your miseries that shall come upon you... ye have heaped treasure together for the last days... the cries of them which have reaped are entered into the ears of the Lord of Sabaoth.’” He explained that the passage describes the judgment of the wealthy who oppress laborers – and he believes that judgment is coming to the Chinese regime.

“Christians being tortured in China,” he said. “Again, this is not about the common people who are working hard... but listen to me carefully. God is going to judge nations' idols. I'm going to say it again. God is going to judge nations' idols.”

Stone issued a specific and chilling prophetic sign tied to what he believes will be divine judgment. “Down the road, there will be a huge earthquake in China,” he warned. “And that earthquake, it'll have its impact in several different layers, in several different ways. But when it comes, it is a sign from heaven of God's displeasure... just the corruption. It'll be a sign.”

While delivering a strong word against the government of China, Stone made clear he was not condemning the Chinese people. "This is not... an attack at all on the Chinese people who are some caring, loving people. We love the people there... So many wonderful Christians are in that country as well."

He ended the message with a heartfelt call to prayer and evangelism. "Even when you have to teach something prophetically that's this strong, I ask you to pray for the people," he said. "They need Jesus. They need salvation. They need eternal life... the biggest thing is having your heart ready that Christ is in your heart and you're serving Him and following Him."

"This word burned in me," Stone shared. "I couldn't even get involved with preparing for the final notes of the conference till I shared this with you."
