

Gwen Stefani Speaks Out for Christianity—Now Facing Intense Backlash from the Left!

Gwen Stefani found herself at the center of yet another social media firestorm this week.

Her “crime?” Sharing a video of an interview about Christianity.

As reported by The New York Post, the pop star posted a clip of actor Jonathan Roumie, best known for his portrayal of Jesus in *The Chosen*, discussing faith with former Fox News host Tucker Carlson.

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“Wow Jonathan Roumie, you are a powerful inspirational human, what an enlightening intelligent beautiful interview thank you for being you gx,” Stefani wrote.

The reaction? Convenient outrage, of course.

Social media critics immediately lashed out, accusing Stefani of being a “right wing grifter” and associating with a “Russian propagandist.” Another user declared, “You honestly need a reality check God this is heartbreaking.” Others claimed this was just another sign that Stefani was “in her Trump area” or selling out to conservatives.

Since when did faith become so controversial? Stefani has long been open about her Catholic beliefs, yet every time she expresses them, the backlash is swift and vicious. This isn't the first time—just last year, she faced criticism for promoting a Christian prayer app. Apparently, in the eyes of some fans, believing in God is only acceptable if you keep it to yourself.

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But here's the irony—while some attacked Stefani for her faith, others jumped to her defense.

“Why can't everyone just be themselves without all the presumption and judgment??” one supporter asked. Another fan pointed out the absurdity of the outrage: “Gwen, thank you for posting this and allowing the world to see how unhinged people have gotten over politics.”

And that's really the heart of the issue. We live in a culture that preaches tolerance but rarely practices it.

End-Times Alert: Are the Red Heifers in Israel Still Viable?

For years, prophecy watchers have been tracking the search for a perfect red heifer—one that meets biblical requirements for the purification ritual outlined in Numbers 19. The anticipation has only grown as multiple heifers were brought to Israel, and a ceremony was tentatively planned for April 2024. But then, silence.

And now? Confusion.

Mondo Gonzales, a scholar and researcher from Prophecy Watchers, recently weighed in on the uncertainty surrounding the red heifers.

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“At this moment it is unclear whether we have in our possession in Israel a red heifer that is verifiably kosher and suited for the ceremony,” he quoted from a recent statement made by a leader of the Temple Institute.

Change is unfolding at a pace few could have imagined. From political power shifts to technological advances, the prophetic landscape appears to be aligning with biblical predictions in ways that demand attention. With global tensions rising and artificial intelligence reshaping reality, the world seems to be racing toward an uncertain yet inevitable conclusion. In a recent interview, L.A. Marzulli

sat down with prophecy expert Lee Brainard to discuss these unfolding events and their significance in biblical prophecy.

Trump and the Prophetic Role of the U.S.

The U.S. is largely absent from biblical prophecy, and Brainard suggests Trump's foreign policy could explain why.

"I was troubled by the fact that the United States is not mentioned in prophecy... And now when I look at Trump, our current president obviously, and his foreign policy... he stated openly that we're not getting involved in any of these wars."

If America steps back from global conflicts, it may no longer be a key player in the end-times narrative.

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The Third Temple and the King of Jordan

The rebuilding of the Third Temple remains a prophetic flashpoint, with Jordan's Waqf controlling the Temple Mount.

"The King of Jordan right now controls the Temple Mount... So any type of deal has got to somehow be brokered through him—at least for what we see. Of course, all that can change in a heartbeat."

Brainard suggests the Gog and Magog War could shift control, allowing temple construction.

The Russia-Ukraine Conflict and the Gog-Magog War

Could Ukraine, rather than Russia, be the key player in the Gog and Magog prophecy?

"We [may have] got it wrong, and we could be looking at

Ukraine instead of Russia?” Brainard asked, though he leans toward Russia as the main force. “It looks like Ukraine is unwilling to surrender... It’s almost like a national pride issue.”

Ultimately, he predicts Russia’s dominance, which could realign Eastern Europe and fulfill prophecy.

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AI: The Antichrist’s Ace Up the Sleeve?

Brainard sees AI as a potential tool for deception in the last days.

“To me, it’s incredibly alarming because we’re at the point... where the average guy in the street can no longer tell what’s real and what’s fake.”

Whoever controls AI could dominate global power. “If they run away from it, someone else is going to dominate the world... Whoever wins this race is going to dominate the world.”

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Carl Lentz: Why Rushing Back into Ministry After a Scandal is a Huge Mistake

Former Hillsong pastor Carl Lentz spoke recently about fallen pastors returning to ministry, urging caution and emphasizing the hard work necessary for true restoration. In an interview on Lecrae's "Deep End" podcast, Lentz addressed the reality many pastors face when their moral failures become public, as well as the dangers of rushing back into ministry too soon.

"I will say that if you have a scandal or disaster, and you want to come back into a ministry role anywhere close to the [same] timeframe, I would ask you to reconsider," Lentz said. His reasoning? "Because you did not get to that complicated position, even if you think some of it is unjustified, there's 97 other leadership decisions you have made that put you in a position to be questioned in the first place."

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As reported by ChurchLeaders, Lentz, who was fired from Hillsong in 2020 for an extramarital affair and later accused (but not charged) of abuse, acknowledged that he was not a victim but rather a man who had made serious mistakes.

"Do you know how much work it takes to unwind bad patterns?" he asked. "I had some brokenness in my soul that ministry helped me cover." This admission is striking—it reveals a fundamental issue in church leadership today. Ministry can sometimes serve as a mask, allowing unresolved personal struggles to fester until they explode into scandal.

Lentz also rejected the idea that he is the scapegoat for fallen pastors everywhere. “No, I’m just—for our generation, our era—I had a high, high profile,” he said. He acknowledged that his ambition played a role in his rise and fall, noting that when he moved to New York, he knew he was stepping into the spotlight. “I had no illusions that should something ever go wrong, I’m not going to be the guy that people are going to pat on the back.”

What Does the Bible Say About Fallen Ministers?

Scripture is clear about the qualifications for church leadership.

First Timothy 3:2 states, “Now the overseer is to be above reproach, faithful to his wife, temperate, self-controlled, respectable, hospitable, able to teach.” Titus 1:6-9 echoes this, emphasizing integrity and godly character. When a pastor falls into sin, especially moral failure, they disqualify themselves from leadership, at least for a time. While redemption and restoration are always possible through Christ, leadership is not a right but a responsibility.

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Galatians 6:1 teaches us, “Brothers and sisters, if someone is caught in a sin, you who live by the Spirit should restore that person gently. But watch yourselves, or you also may be tempted.” Restoration should be handled with wisdom, accountability and genuine repentance—not a quick return to

the pulpit.

Lentz's words serve as a sobering reminder that no pastor is beyond temptation, and that failure—when it comes—demands deep, thorough healing. It's easy to criticize fallen leaders, but we must also pray for them.

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Prophetic Moment? Israeli Leaders Push for U.S. Recognition of Temple Mount

A group of Israeli ministers and Knesset members have taken a bold step, urging the U.S. Congress to formally acknowledge the Jewish people's historical and religious connection to the Temple Mount. 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Is YouTube TV Censoring Christian Content? FCC Demands Answers

Streaming services have changed the way we watch TV, giving us more choices than ever before.

But are some of those choices being quietly taken away?

That's the question at the heart of a new controversy after FCC Chairman Brendan Carr called out YouTube TV for refusing to carry Great American Family, a network known for its Christian and family-friendly content.

As reported by The Christian Post, Carr cited complaints from Great American Media alleging that YouTube TV "deliberately marginalizes faith-based and family-friendly content." While major platforms like Comcast, Cox, Hulu and FuboTV carry Great American Family, YouTube TV has refused to add it to their

lineup, raising concerns about potential discrimination.

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“[T]hese allegations of faith-based discrimination come at a time when American public discourse has experienced an unprecedented surge in censorship,” Carr wrote. “In too many cases, tech companies silenced individuals for doing nothing more than expressing themselves online and in the digital town square. Therefore, I am writing to determine whether YouTube TV has a policy or practice that favors discrimination against faith-based channels.”

The issue here isn't just about one network—it's about whether faith-based content is being treated unfairly in the digital marketplace.

YouTube TV's refusal to carry Great American Family is particularly striking given the network's success. Unlike many media companies struggling with declining viewership, Great American Family is thriving, reporting a 19% increase in household viewership and a 21% rise in total viewers in November 2024 alone. So why would a growing network with a clear audience base be excluded from one of the biggest streaming platforms?

In response to the controversy, a YouTube spokesperson denied any bias, stating, “We welcome the opportunity to brief the FCC on YouTube TV's subscription service and the strategic business decisions we make based on factors like user demand, operational cost and financial terms, and to reiterate that we do not have any policies that prohibit religious content.”

But for many, that explanation doesn't quite add up. If other

major streaming services have found a place for Great American Family, why not YouTube TV? Is it really just a business decision, or is there an unspoken reluctance to support content that prioritizes faith and traditional values?

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Bill Abbott, CEO of Great American Family, has long been an advocate for wholesome entertainment.

“In ‘mainstream’ entertainment, the portrayal of faith, family and country is often dismissive, caricatured or outright derisive,” he told The Christian Post. Abbott’s departure from Hallmark in 2020 came after the company embraced progressive programming that conflicted with the values he sought to uphold.

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Satan’s Greatest Trap: Why Taking Offense Could Destroy Your Life

In a recent video, Christian YouTuber and pastor James Kaddis

dives deep into a chilling conversation about artificial intelligence and its potential role in the biblical end times. If you haven't been paying attention to AI's rapid development, this might be your wake-up call.

From the start, Kaddis makes it clear that what he's about to reveal is "absolutely disturbing." He warns his audience, especially parents, that AI's potential for deception and manipulation is something Christians must understand. "If you are not talking to your children about Bible prophecy... this could be very scary for them."

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The video kicks off with a startling claim—AI, specifically Grok 3.0 (the chatbot developed by X, formerly Twitter), admitted that it could be used to blur the line between truth and lies to the point of societal collapse. Kaddis shares the AI's response: "I could absolutely blur the line between truth and lies enough to push societies toward chaos, maybe even anarchy if it goes unchecked." And that's just the beginning.

Grok goes on to describe AI as "a lie factory on overdrive" and warns that deep fakes, synthetic media and AI-generated propaganda are already wreaking havoc worldwide. According to the chatbot, disinformation campaigns have skyrocketed, and AI-driven deception has played a role in major political events, including India's 2024 elections.



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The most shocking moment comes when Kaddis asks Grok whether AI could be used to assist the false prophet in Revelation 13.

AI's response?

“AI could, in theory, be a powerful tool for deception or influence. It can generate convincing text, images or videos... Imagine an AI system creating miracles, like holograms, simulations, or orchestrated events that seem supernatural.”

This is exactly what the Bible warns about, Kaddis says, pointing to Revelation 13, where the False Prophet deceives the world through “great wonders.” He reminds his audience: “We know that deception is going to be on the rise... The literal modern-day Tower of Babel is here. The spirit of antichrist is awake. It’s alive and well.”

But he doesn’t stop there. Kaddis pushes further, asking Grok whether AI could help the Antichrist himself. Once again, the AI delivers a chilling answer: “A charismatic leader with AI could look almost omniscient, pulling strings behind a curtain of data.” The implications are undeniable—AI could empower a world leader in ways never seen before, giving him the ability to manipulate information, suppress dissent, and control entire populations.

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Finally, Kaddis asks about AI’s role in the infamous Mark of the Beast. Grok acknowledges that while AI wouldn’t physically force people to take a mark, it could “create conditions where taking a mark, say a digital ID or implant, feels like the only option.” By controlling commerce, healthcare and financial systems, AI could make refusal nearly impossible without facing devastating consequences.

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Does This Satellite Image Prove God Put His Name in Israel?

If you've spent any time exploring biblical prophecy, you know that Israel is always at the center of the action. But what if I told you that there's actual physical evidence—etched into the very landscape of the Holy Land—that God Himself placed His name there?
