“We’re living in a historic moment,” Chesnut remarked. “This is the first generation that can say, ‘This could happen in our lifetime.’”

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And what a moment it is. Schneider identifies key indicators that humanity is living in prophetic times. These signs include:

- **Moral Decay:** “The breakdown of the family, the increase of divorce, the increase of adultery, the increase of immorality... this trajectory cannot be brought back to the center.” Brokenness within society continues to perpetuate itself, creating further instability.
- **Cultural Divisions:** Referencing Matthew 24:7, Schneider highlights, “Nation will rise against nation,” explaining that the Greek word *ethnos* refers to people groups. He observes, “One people group will arise against another people group... the rights and the lefts, the liberals and those that stand for biblical morality.”
- **Loss of God’s Created Order:** Shifts in societal norms reflect a departure from divine design. Schneider warns,

“Parents are in jeopardy of losing custody of their children if a 12-year-old says that he thinks he’s a woman... it’s mind-boggling.” This signifies that “God’s created order of mankind has been abandoned.”

- **Unprecedented Technological Change:** The rapid advancement of artificial intelligence poses profound cultural challenges. Schneider observes, “Who among us could have imagined 10 years ago the AI culture that we’re living in right now?” The development of AI relationships, especially romantic ones, is a sign of cultural disintegration.
- **Global Instability:** Wars and shifting alliances contribute to worldwide unrest. Schneider states, “The division and the hatred in the world right now... it’s irreconcilable.” He describes society as being in “a whirlwind down into the pits of hell.”

## Be Alert and Ready

While these signs are sobering, the message emphasizes vigilance rather than despair. Schneider explains, “We’re not in the darkness as the rest. In other words, if you and I are taking a hold of God’s Word and we’re standing on God’s Word, we’re not in darkness. We’re in light.”

Most importantly, Schneider reminds believers of Jesus’ words: [“When you see these things happening, do not be afraid.”](#) Although the world may seem out of control, redemption is near.

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It is essential to live with intentionality and devotion. Schneider emphasizes the need to “pick up our cross, bring our soul’s impulses under the subjection of the blade of God’s Word and of the Holy Spirit.” This preparation ensures readiness for Christ’s return.

The escalating chaos in the world aligns with biblical prophecy, serving as a reminder to remain steadfast. During these times, the words of Jesus offer clarity to all believers: “Behold, I come quickly, and My reward is with Me to give to each one, every one of us... according to what we have done” (Rev. 22:12).

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# **Pastor Samuel Rodriguez: A Biblical View on Sanctuary, Justice and Immigration Reform**

Pastor Samuel Rodriguez, a prominent voice in the Hispanic Christian community and president of the [National Hispanic Christian Leadership Conference](#), recently spoke with CBN about the Trump administration’s directive allowing ICE agents to target traditionally protected spaces, including churches, schools and hospitals.

This decision has sparked significant debate, especially within faith communities that are deeply concerned about its potential impact on illegal immigrants. Rodriguez's perspective offers a nuanced balance between supporting justice and advocating for compassion, rooted in biblical principles.

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Rodriguez made it clear that the administration's focus is not on deporting individuals who have lived law-abiding lives for decades. "They're coming after the pedophiles, they're coming after the gangbangers, they're coming after the cartel, the coyotes, the human traffickers. That's who they're coming after," he said. For Rodriguez, this targeted approach aligns with the biblical mandate for justice, as seen in Romans 13:3-4, which reminds us that authorities are meant to be "a terror" to wrongdoers, not those who do right.

However, Rodriguez expressed deep empathy for the individuals who might feel collateral fear. "I want to make sure they don't cross the line," he said of the administration's actions, emphasizing that churches should remain places of sanctuary for law-abiding individuals.

One of the most significant concerns Rodriguez shared is the potential impact on Hispanic congregations. He highlighted reports from pastors who said their church attendance dropped by "15-20%" due to fear. "There is a concern that these areas now will be targeted," he acknowledged. Yet, he also addressed the importance of countering misinformation with truth, as Ephesians 4:25 urges us to "put off falsehood and speak truthfully to your neighbor."

[Rodriguez's support for removing sanctuary policies](#) stems from his belief in the moral responsibility to hold criminals accountable. "Can you believe that there are states and mayors who have rapists and pedophiles in their prisons, undocumented, and they refuse to give ICE direct access or information? To me, I find that to be morally reprehensible and illogical," he stated.

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At the same time, Rodriguez reminded listeners that the administration must tread carefully to avoid harming innocent families. "I do not believe this administration will in any way form or shape work to jeopardize churches and communities that undergirded his election," he said, referencing the significant Latino support for President Trump.

Pastor Rodriguez's insights remind us of the delicate balance between enforcing the law and using discernment for the days we live in. By rooting these actions in biblical principles, he hopes to protect the law-abiding while ensuring justice for those who exploit and harm others. His prayerful hope is that accurate information and measured policies will prevent unnecessary fear and maintain the sanctity of churches as places of worship and reverence.

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# Biblical Truth vs. Apostasy: Amanda Grace Stands Up Against Rogue Preacher

In another controversial moment [from an apostate teacher](#), Jeff Hood, a Little Rock preacher and theologian-in-residence at Quapaw Quarter United Methodist Church, used his pulpit during a service called “Resistance Sunday” to sharply critique and even curse President Donald Trump.

The event, held a day before Martin Luther King Jr. Day and just before Trump’s second inauguration, was marked by Hood’s fiery rhetoric, calling for active resistance to Trump’s policies.

Speaking from a pulpit adorned with a banner reading “RESIST,” Hood addressed the congregation: “Who is ready to go to prison?” he asked, before describing Trump as the “big orange elephant in the room.” Hood’s words left little room for neutrality: “People say ‘Is Donald Trump Hitler?’ I don’t know, but I sure...know he ain’t Jesus.” Hood’s homily critiqued Trump’s policies, including immigration enforcement and the death penalty, and condemned wealthy oligarchs like Elon Musk and Jeff Bezos for allegedly pulling the strings of power.

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The service also featured speeches from activists representing various causes, including Palestinian rights, LGBTQ+ advocacy and criminal justice reform. Hood closed his homily with curse words directed at Trump, further cementing the event’s unbiblical stance.

Amanda Grace, a prophetic voice and head of Ark of Grace

Ministries, quickly responded in a video, condemning Hood's actions as "charismatic witchcraft" and an abuse of spiritual authority. "A pastor in Little Rock from the pulpit took it upon himself to have something called Resistance Sunday... and attempted to [curse] Donald Trump," Grace said. "When preachers operate from the pulpit like this and attempt to curse someone... you are operating in charismatic witchcraft, you are operating in rebellion."

Grace passionately argued that Hood's actions represented a dangerous twisting of Scripture, [akin to the serpent's deception in the Garden of Eden](#). "The word of God says resist the enemy and he shall flee from you," she said, "and just as Satan loves to do, he loves to take Scripture and twist it and mangle it to try to deceive the people." She described Hood's sermon as the work of the "serpent" infiltrating the pulpit, calling it a "hostile takeover" of God's house.

Grace also took action against Hood's words through prayer, declaring in the name of Jesus Christ that every curse and word of darkness spoken against Trump be broken, nullified, and rendered powerless. "Father, break the delusion in the name of Jesus Christ of the people that were in that pulpit agreeing with such a word," she prayed. "Let those words be neutralized in the name of Jesus Christ and let them be cast off and away from Donald Trump."

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Despite her strong criticism, Grace expressed hope for Hood's repentance and redemption. She prayed that he would recognize his actions as aligning with the "song of the serpent" and

turn back to the true teachings of the gospel. “Father, I pray You deliver him from the spirit of deception, delusion and the doctrines of devils that he has been fed in his life... bring him into true repentance.”

Grace’s response extended beyond condemning Hood’s actions, calling for a broader spiritual renewal within churches. “The hostile takeovers of the house of God in the pulpit are coming to an end this year in the name of Jesus Christ,” she declared. “Let it no longer be ‘Resistance Sunday’ but Sundays of rejoicing in what Almighty God is doing from heaven for this nation.”

This incident serves as a call to action for Christians to follow Grace’s example of standing firm against apostate preachers who misuse the pulpit for unbiblical purposes. By responding with prayer and truth, believers can counter such actions and pray for the repentance and restoration of those who have strayed. It is through this kind of bold yet compassionate response that the gospel’s transformative power can shine, guiding both the church and the nation back toward biblical principles.

In a recent interview with Charisma Media, Rabbi Jason Sobel offers a fascinating exploration of the prophetic significance of our current times, weaving together biblical narratives, the Hebrew calendar and modern-day events. 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Sobel believes this window signals an opening for spiritual renewal, personal breakthroughs and global shifts. “For a lot of people in this last season, they’ve been waiting for God to open the door, but the doors haven’t opened, and we’re like, ‘God, why aren’t you opening this door?’ We feel kind of stuck,” he notes. “What’s interesting is that biblically, last year was the four. Four is the door in Hebrew, [it] was the ‘year of the door.’ Doors represent transition. So last year

was a transitional year, but actually windows are better than doors. And I believe what's going to happen in the season is...we're so focused on wanting God to open the doors, and God is saying, 'Listen, I'm going to open windows.'" Sobel elaborates on this theme with a testimony from his own life, recounting how firefighters once climbed through a window to rescue his locked-out family. "God often works in unexpected ways," Sobel says. "When doors seem closed, He'll open a window and make a way where there seems to be none."

### **Lessons from Joseph: A Season of Promotion**

Central to Sobel's message is the connection between the current season and the story of Joseph. He highlights Joseph's journey from being falsely accused and imprisoned to his eventual rise to power. "This is a season of promotion," Sobel declares. "I believe it's a season that God is going to take people from the prison to the palace. I believe it's a time when those that have been falsely accused, that the false accusations that have been made, just like they were made against Joseph, they're going to be exposed for what they are." Sobel also ties this narrative to current events, likening Joseph's trials to the challenges faced by leaders like President Donald Trump, who, Sobel says, has a "prophetic role to play in this season."

### **Gog and Magog: Prophetic Insights for the End Times**

Sobel's insights also touch on the end times, drawing from Ezekiel's prophecy about the battle of Gog and Magog. He identifies Turkey, rather than Russia, as a key player in this future conflict. "Turkey's actions in the Middle East are significant," Sobel says, warning of its growing military

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# Has the ‘Great Reset’ Reached Its Breaking Point?

The annual World Economic Forum in Davos, Switzerland, has long been a gathering of global elites pushing their vision for a one-world government. This year, Erick Stakelbeck’s Watchman Newscast [laid bare all the dangers of this movement](#), connecting it to biblical prophecy and warning of its profound implications for faith, freedom and sovereignty.

## The Great Reset: A Secular Tower of Babel

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# The Globalist Vision vs. Biblical Sovereignty

The WEF's agenda is a sharp contrast to the biblical model of national sovereignty and divine authority. Stakelbeck describes their ultimate goal as a "world run by bureaucratic elites... a secular, socialist world." This includes a cashless society, digital currency and surveillance systems reminiscent of China's social credit system, where citizens are rewarded or punished based on their allegiance to the state.

"National sovereignty? Gone. Personal privacy? Gone," Stakelbeck states. He highlights how [biblical prophecy warns of such developments](#), citing Daniel 2:43 ("They shall mingle themselves with the seed of men") and Revelation's description of a Beast system where no one can buy or sell without a specific mark.

## Trump, Netanyahu and the Fight Against Globalism

Stakelbeck contrasts the WEF's vision with leaders like Donald Trump and Benjamin Netanyahu, who have stood firm against globalist agendas. "Donald J. Trump keeps standing in the way of their larger ambitions," he notes. During his remote address to Davos, Trump emphasized nationalism, patriotism and a Judeo-Christian worldview—values that are anathema to the Great Reset crowd.

"He laid down the gauntlet," Stakelbeck says, recounting Trump's commitment to America-first policies and his rejection of the Paris Climate Accord and the Green New Deal. "The Davos crowd... sees that Great Reset vision slipping away." Netanyahu, similarly, is described as a strong, patriotic leader who prioritizes Israel's interests and defies the globalist push.

# The Biblical Prophecy Connection

Stakelbeck repeatedly ties these global developments to end-times prophecy. “The Antichrist will eventually take power of a one-world government,” he explains, calling the Great Reset a prophetic signpost. “Wars, rumors of wars, famines, pestilences... and a deception so great that it could deceive even the elect if that were possible.”

He points to the rise of technology and artificial intelligence, the push for global governance, and secularism as fulfillment of these warnings. “The Bible is clear: there will be a global government in the last days. What we’re seeing now is the infrastructure being built before our eyes.”

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## The People Push Back

Despite the WEF’s ambitions, Stakelbeck highlights a growing shift away from leftist policies worldwide. “Conservatives won more than half of elections in 2024,” he notes, citing the UK’s Telegraph study. This global rejection of wokeness, socialism and godlessness is what Stakelbeck calls “The Shift.”

Leaders like Giorgia Meloni in Italy, Viktor Orbán in Hungary, and Javier Milei in Argentina are part of this movement. “It’s a return to common sense,” Stakelbeck says, urging viewers to pray and support these efforts. “But ultimately, this shift goes nowhere if it doesn’t turn back to God.”

Stakelbeck’s message is clear that Christians must stay vigilant, informed and prayerful. “The Great Reset crowd is cunning,” he warns. “They will recalibrate, strategize and try again.”

He urges believers to recognize the spiritual dimension of this battle. “We’re seeing prophetic events unfold before our eyes. It’s not just political; it’s biblical.” And as the WEF’s vision faces resistance, he reminds us of the ultimate goal: “A world turned back to God.”

New advancements in artificial intelligence are capturing headlines, but for Z, they're also ringing alarm bells. He refers to these developments as a “mark of the beast precursor.” While the term may seem dramatic, Z's concerns stem from a prophetic viewpoint. He warns that such technologies could eventually pave the way for systems of control foretold in biblical prophecy.

“Just because there's something good today doesn't mean it'll be used for good things later,” he reminds us. This statement underscores the dual nature of innovation: while AI might bring benefits now, it could also hold potential for misuse. The takeaway? Stay informed, question narratives and remain spiritually grounded.

## **Trump's Hand on the Bible: A Moment of Oversight or Significance?**

During Donald Trump's inauguration, an unusual incident occurred: he was sworn in before his family could gather and without his hand properly placed on the Bible. For some, this moment sparked speculation about hidden meanings or conspiracies. But Z is quick to dismiss such theories.

“I don't believe in any way that there was some strange nefarious plot behind that,” he says, explaining that the event was likely an oversight. However, Z does see a symbolic takeaway: “Don't let those that are around you distract you from the main thing.” In a world full of distractions, staying focused on what truly matters is key.

## **The Call to Storm Babylon**

One of Z's central messages is [a rallying cry for believers to "storm Babylon."](#) He explains this as standing firm against the rise of an antichrist system. While governments and leaders have their role, Z emphasizes the responsibility of the church: "Just because we got a victory in November... doesn't mean there's going to be perfection."

He urges Christians to hold the line in their generation, warning that systems of control and spiritual opposition will always seek to rise. "It is up to us to hold our ground in our generation," he states. His message resonates as a reminder that faith isn't passive—it requires action, discernment and perseverance.

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## **Unrest and Prophetic Warnings**

Z also delves into concerns about societal unrest, cautioning about potential coordinated disruptions in major cities. "They really do want to have a decapolis... 10 cities burning simultaneously all across the land like a birthday cake," he prophesied. While such imagery may seem startling, Z's intent is clear: to urge preparation and prayer.

Interestingly, he views this as a pivotal time of spiritual significance. "We're in the eye of the hurricane," he says, suggesting a period of relative calm before more significant challenges arise. His prophetic warnings are not meant to instill fear but to encourage vigilance and hope. "I pray to God we shut it down... by God's favor, we'll see another round of goodness."

In Z's view, these unfolding events—weather phenomena, technological advances, political moments and societal unrest—are interconnected within a larger prophetic framework. Whether you see his insights as divine revelation or

cautionary perspective, his message is one of preparation, faith and perseverance. In a world that feels increasingly uncertain, perhaps that's a message we all can reflect on.

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## **Biblical Prophecy and UFOs: The Great Deception Churches Won't Talk About**

L.A. Marzulli's latest presentation is a stark wake-up call to churches everywhere.

In his video titled "Why Doesn't the Church Address Any of This?!", Marzulli challenges church leaders to grapple with what he describes as one of the most significant spiritual battles of our time: [the resurgence of UFO phenomena](#) and its connection to biblical prophecy.

"UFOs are real, burgeoning and not going away," Marzulli declares. He links these phenomena directly to a "coming great deception" prophesied in Scripture. Marzulli argues that while the signs are increasingly evident, many pastors and church leaders remain silent, either out of ignorance or fear of driving away their congregations.

### **The Bible's Basis for Understanding UFOs**

## and Nephilim

Marzulli's approach is deeply rooted in Scripture. He points to Matthew 24, where Jesus warns that even the elect could be deceived, and draws parallels to the days of Noah, a time marked by unprecedented evil and the presence of Nephilim. "The gods of Nimrod, the pantheon of Greek mythology, and the so-called aliens of today are all manifestations of the same fallen angels," Marzulli explains.

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He emphasizes that the deception has persisted throughout history, with incursions continuing after the flood. "Daniel 2:43 says, 'They shall mingle themselves with the seed of men,' but they shall not cleave. This is happening now," he asserts, suggesting that current UFO phenomena and abduction stories are part of this ancient pattern.

## The Modern Resurgence of Deception

Marzulli identifies 1948 as a pivotal year, citing the establishment of Israel as a nation and a concurrent explosion of UFO activity. "The entire UFO phenomenon as we know it took off in ways that are unprecedented," he says. Events like the Roswell incident the year before in 1947, and the beginning of widespread abduction phenomena, cattle mutilations and crop circles, are not isolated occurrences but signs of a coordinated spiritual deception.

"This is how you get a one-world government and a one-world religious system that the Bible tells us will happen in the last days," Marzulli warns. He sees these phenomena as precursors to a global delusion that will draw people away from a Christ-centered worldview and toward a pantheon of "extraterrestrial" beings that are, in reality, fallen angels seeking worship.

## The Church's Reluctance to Engage

A recurring theme in Marzulli's critique is the church's failure to address these issues. "Many wonderful, good-hearted pastors don't touch the subject," he laments. The common fallback position—"We're just here to teach the Bible"—falls woefully short, according to Marzulli. "If you want to teach the Bible, then teach the parts that talk about end-time delusion. Teach why Jesus warned us about days like these."

Marzulli also highlights the fear that drives this avoidance: "Are pastors afraid of losing numbers in their congregations if they start speaking about it? Absolutely. People will just get up and walk out of the room." But he argues that this fear is no excuse for neglecting a topic that is both biblically significant and culturally relevant.

## Ignorance and Arrogance: A Deadly Combination

One of Marzulli's most pointed critiques is reserved for those who dismiss these topics without investigation. "Ignorance and arrogance is a deadly combination," he asserts. "If you've never studied Roswell, abduction phenomena or who the prince of the power of the air is, then you're ignorant. And that ignorance [will leave you unprepared for the deception that's coming.](#)"

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Marzulli's message is a clear warning that the church must wake up and engage with these issues before it's too late. He encourages believers to educate themselves through scripture and research. "This is the beginning of a strong delusion," he

warns. “We are connected in ways that are historically unprecedented, and it’s critical for pastors to start dealing with this.”

He calls for a proactive approach: “Equip yourself. Do your homework. Study.” He urges church leaders to not only teach the Bible but to address how biblical prophecy connects with current events. “Why is Jesus warning us about the last days? Wars, rumors of wars, famines, pestilences—and a deception so great that it could deceive even the elect if that were possible.”

## **The Stakes Couldn’t Be Higher**

Marzulli’s critique is not just about UFOs or Nephilim; it’s about the church’s responsibility to prepare its flock for spiritual warfare. “This is happening,” he insists. “The deception is here, and it’s only going to grow stronger. If the church doesn’t address it, who will?”

In a world increasingly captivated by the supernatural, Marzulli’s call to action is a timely reminder that the church cannot afford to remain silent. The stakes are eternal, and the time to act is now.

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
