

A Shocking New Change on the Temple Mount Is Sending Prophetic Shockwaves Across the World

A growing shift on the Temple Mount is sending shockwaves through the prophetic world as expanded Jewish prayer permissions at the holy site accelerate the restoration of worship in Jerusalem and move biblical prophecy closer to fulfillment.

As reported by Israel National News, the Temple Mount Yeshiva announced that Israeli authorities had approved expanded prayer sheets containing “the special and dedicated prayer liturgy for the Temple Mount,” marking another major step toward the restoration of Jewish worship at the site.

The yeshiva also thanked Itamar Ben Gvir and Israeli officials “for their many efforts, and for the privilege of taking part in the process of restoring the Divine Presence to Zion.”

Scripture reveals a consistent pattern throughout Israel’s history: repentance, prayer and restored worship lead to national restoration and major prophetic events. Under Hezekiah, temple worship returned, and the nation was revived. Under Josiah, the rediscovery of God’s law brought repentance and renewal. After the Babylonian exile, Ezra and Nehemiah led Israel back to God before Jerusalem and the Temple were

restored.

That same pattern is unfolding again.

The rebirth of Israel in 1948 restored the nation. The reunification of Jerusalem in 1967 restored Jewish control of the holy city. Expanding Jewish prayer rights on the Temple Mount now continues the restoration process Scripture prophesied thousands of years ago.

Jesus warned in Matthew 24 about the coming “abomination of desolation” spoken of by Daniel, a prophecy requiring a functioning temple in Jerusalem during the last days. The apostle Paul wrote in 2 Thessalonians that the man of sin will sit in the temple of God, declaring himself to be God. Those prophecies point directly to a restored temple system in Jerusalem.



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Every movement surrounding the Temple Mount carries prophetic significance because Jerusalem stands at the center of God's prophetic timeline.

The Bible also reveals that restoration comes alongside shaking. Zechariah prophesied that Jerusalem would become “a burdensome stone for all people.” Ezekiel foresaw massive conflict surrounding Israel in the last days. Revelation describes a world moving toward unprecedented upheaval before the return of Jesus Christ.

The restoration of worship on the Temple Mount points directly toward earth-shattering events ahead. The nations are moving toward confrontation over Jerusalem exactly as Scripture says they will.

What began as approval for expanded prayer sheets is part of something far larger. The prophetic stage is being set in real

time.

Did Katy Perry Just Flash a Nephilim Symbol at the Met Gala?

For years, the UFO conversation lived on the outer edges of American culture. Late-night radio. Grainy footage. Government denials. Conspiracy forums buried deep in the internet. Now the discussion has moved into Congress, the Pentagon and primetime television.

That shift became impossible to ignore during a recent interview on Fox News when Peter Doocy sat down with investigative journalist Jeremy Corbell to discuss the growing pressure surrounding classified UAP files and the Pentagon's refusal to release dozens of videos Congress wants declassified.

Corbell did not dance around the issue.

"Here is what I know for a fact, Peter," Corbell said. "There are machines, craft of unknown origin that fly with impunity in our restricted air space, and our government has been

investigating this for decades.”

That sentence alone tells us how far this conversation has moved.

Not long ago, a statement like that would have ended a television segment. Instead, it became the centerpiece of a serious national discussion on one of the largest news networks in America.

Corbell pointed to 46 videos lawmakers are demanding the Pentagon release to the public after missing a congressional deadline.

“These 46 videos are really important,” Corbell said. “I think the American public should be able to see them and so does Congress.”

According to Corbell, the videos are already designated as UAP material by U.S. military and intelligence agencies. Some, he said, allegedly show craft performing maneuvers beyond known human capabilities.

That is where the conversation turns from curiosity to something much heavier.

Corbell described objects capable of “instantaneous acceleration” and movement patterns that appear to defy conventional aerodynamics. He referenced footage from Syria in 2021 that allegedly showed a craft accelerating away moments after a U.S. Reaper drone achieved a weapons-grade lock on it.

“So its ability to maneuver is far beyond anything that China, Russia or the U.S. has,” Corbell said.

He also claimed these objects routinely appear near sensitive military locations and critical infrastructure inside the United States.

"This is not me saying this," Corbell added. "This has been admitted by our own administration and government."

That is the part many Americans are struggling to process.

Because whether someone believes these objects are extraterrestrial, experimental military technology or something else entirely, the disclosure movement has undeniably crossed into the mainstream. Former presidents joke about it publicly. Congress is demanding answers. Fighter pilots testify under oath. Military footage is released to the public.

The world is being conditioned to accept that humanity may not be alone.

And that is exactly why many Christians are paying close attention.

While secular analysts frame the phenomenon through the lens of aliens or advanced civilizations, Christian author and UFO researcher L. A. Marzulli has spent years warning that the explanation may be spiritual rather than extraterrestrial.

Marzulli argues the phenomenon is ancient. The modern term "UAP" may be new, but manifestations in the sky, supernatural entities and deceptive signs have existed throughout human history. He points readers back to Genesis 6, the Days of Noah and biblical accounts of fallen angels interacting with humanity.

From that perspective, the UFO conversation changes completely.

The issue stops being about little green men crossing galaxies and becomes a question of whether the world is witnessing the

rebranding of an old deception in modern technological language.

That possibility becomes even more unsettling when you listen closely to how officials now describe the phenomenon. The phrase “non-human intelligence” appears repeatedly. Government agencies discuss craft with no visible propulsion systems. Pilots describe objects hovering motionless before accelerating instantly beyond visual range.

Corbell himself admitted there are questions nobody can yet answer.

“Who are flying these machines?” he asked. “Who made these machines that can outpace, outmaneuver and outperform our greatest war fighters?”

That question sits at the center of this entire story.

And perhaps more importantly, why does the world suddenly seem so eager to prepare humanity for the answer?

Jesus warned us that deception would intensify in the last days. Scripture repeatedly describes lying signs and wonders that can mislead the world. Paul wrote in 2 Thessalonians about a coming strong delusion tied to humanity’s rejection of truth. Revelation describes supernatural manifestations unlike anything civilization has experienced before.

The concern is not fascination. It is discernment.

Because something is happening.

Even the government admits that.

The real battle now is over interpretation.

Are these secret military programs? Visitors from another world? A psychological operation preparing humanity for a new worldview? Or are we witnessing the early stages of a

spiritual deception the Bible warned about thousands of years ago?

That question no longer belongs to conspiracy documentaries and fringe websites. It is now being debated in Congress, discussed on Fox News and pushed directly into the public square.

And the deeper this story goes, the more the world seems determined to look everywhere for answers except the one place that explains it best: Scripture.

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5 Signs You're Ignoring Your Conscience and Becoming Spiritually Numb

A Florida police officer's faith-filled response during a life-or-death moment on Jacksonville's Dames Point Bridge is drawing national attention after body camera footage captured him talking a man out of suicide through prayer, compassion and persistence.

As reported by Fox News, Jacksonville Officer Antonio Richardson spent nearly 40 minutes speaking with a man

standing on the edge of the bridge on April 12 as patrol lights flashed behind them and officers worked to keep the area secure.

Richardson, who also serves as a pastor with more than 30 years of ministry experience, spoke calmly to the man throughout the tense encounter.

"Whatever you're going through, man, you can get through it," Richardson told the man in footage released from the scene.

"Now listen, man. Listen. Listen. You can get through this."

As the conversation continued, Richardson reached out his hand and urged the man to pray with him.



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"Let's talk about it for a minute.... You believe in prayer, I know that.... Just touch my hand. Just touch my hand, man, I'm praying with you," he said.

The officer also reminded the man that his life carried value far beyond the pain of the moment.

"If you jump, you're going to hurt other people. And they're going to be hurting just like you're hurting now.... The cycle's gotta stop," Richardson said.

The breakthrough finally came after nearly 40 minutes of conversation and prayer. The man stepped away from the edge of the bridge and walked directly into Richardson's arms as the two embraced. Other officers then moved in to help secure the scene safely.

Appearing later on "Fox & Friends," Richardson explained how the encounter unfolded.

"When I got the call... I was just there to stop the traffic," Richardson said. "And then a couple of other officers who knew my position as a pastor asked me to come over and talk with the guy."

"Nothing was scripted.... I did not want to see him jump," he added.

Richardson credited God for the outcome of the encounter.

"I just felt within myself that God was going to spare his life – and he did," Richardson said.

"I was praying. And God spared his life. And we connected. And as a result of that connection, he didn't jump."

The officer also revealed the emotional weight of the moment after the rescue was over.

According to Fox News, Richardson said that after the man was brought to safety, he called his wife, sat alone in his patrol car and "wept like a baby."

The divine encounter served as a powerful reminder that prayer is not empty words thrown into the air during a crisis. Faith reaches into places where fear, hopelessness and despair try to take hold. One officer willing to pray, listen and stand beside a hurting man changed the course of a life that day.

Moments like this remind us that God still moves through compassion, courage and people willing to extend a hand instead of turning away.

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13 Injured in Oklahoma Campground Shooting as Police Hunt Suspects

A weekend gathering at an Oklahoma campground turned into chaos after gunfire erupted near Arcadia Lake, leaving at least 13 people injured and launching a massive search for suspects by law enforcement authorities.

The shooting happened Sunday night during a large party at Spring Creek Park near Arcadia Lake in Edmond, just outside Oklahoma City. Authorities said emergency crews rushed to the scene after multiple 911 calls reported shots fired around 9 p.m.

Edmond Police spokesperson Emily Ward described the scene as terrifying as investigators worked through the night to identify those responsible.

"This is obviously a very terrifying situation and we understand the concern from the public and those involved and we are working extremely hard to find the suspects," Ward said during a press briefing.



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Ten victims were transported to metro-area hospitals by

ambulance while others arrived in private vehicles seeking treatment. Hospital officials confirmed patients were taken to both Integris Health Baptist Medical Center in Oklahoma City and Integris Health Edmond Hospital. Victims remained in “various conditions,” according to police.

Authorities from the Edmond Police Department, Oklahoma Highway Patrol and Oklahoma City Police responded to the wooded campground area as investigators interviewed witnesses spread across the metro. No arrests had been announced as of Monday morning.

Social media flyers circulating after the shooting showed the event had been promoted as a “Sunday Funday” gathering featuring food, drinks and music at the lake.

As this investigation continues, we join together in prayer for every victim recovering from this tragedy, for the families carrying fear and heartbreak and for the emergency responders, nurses, doctors and law enforcement officers working through the aftermath of this violence. We pray for healing, protection, wisdom for investigators and peace over a shaken community.

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Ancient 'Lamb of God' Coins Linked to Revelation Prophecy Discovered After 1,000 Years

Ancient silver coins carrying powerful biblical imagery connected to the Book of Revelation have resurfaced more than 1,000 years after they were first minted, offering another remarkable glimpse into the enduring influence of Christianity throughout history.

As reported by the Daily Mail, the rare "Lamb of God" coins were discovered in Denmark and date back to around A.D. 1009, a period when England faced relentless Viking attacks. The coins feature the Alpha and Omega symbols beneath the image of the Lamb of God, a direct reference to Jesus Christ in the Book of Revelation.



The book of Revelation describes the Alpha and Omega as "the Beginning and the End," while the Lamb represents Christ's sacrifice, resurrection and ultimate victory over evil.

Only around 30 examples of the Agnus Dei pennies are known to exist worldwide, making the discovery especially significant for historians and believers alike.

Researchers at the National Museum of Denmark said the coins were originally created as a spiritual defense during a chaotic season in England's history.

"We know that in 1009 the English king, Aethelred, took all means necessary to ward off attacks from the Vikings," a museum researcher said in a statement quoted by the Daily Mail. "He demanded fasting and alms, but also got coins printed with Christian motives, which were supposed to protect the English."



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The researcher added that the Vikings likely found value in the deeply symbolic coins and carried them back to Denmark.

"What fascinates me most is how from such a small coin you can unfold a story about the English kings and Christianity in England, which draws threads to the Danish Viking kings, the Danish monetary system and even the establishment of the Danish state," museum inspector Gitte Tarnow Ingvardson said.

The imagery engraved into the coins reflects some of the most powerful themes in Revelation.

Scripture presents Jesus Christ, the Lamb of God, as the only One worthy to open the seven seals and bring about God's final victory over evil, death and suffering. The book also describes the coming marriage supper of the Lamb and the establishment of a new creation, a new heaven and earth, where God will reign on high with His people for eternity.

Discoveries like these serve as reminders that the Bible is not disconnected from history. Time and again, archaeology continues uncovering artifacts, cities, inscriptions and historical records that align directly with the people, places and events recorded in Scripture. From ancient coins to buried ruins, the evidence continues to point back to the reliability and enduring truth of God's Word.

Cruise Ship Hantavirus

Outbreak Leaves 3 Dead as WHO Investigates Atlantic Voyage

Three passengers are dead and several others are sick after a suspected hantavirus outbreak aboard the Dutch-operated cruise ship MV Hondius in the Atlantic Ocean, according to the World Health Organization and South African health officials. The ship remains anchored off Cape Verde as health authorities investigate the source of the outbreak.

The outbreak began during a weekslong expedition cruise that departed from Argentina and included stops in Antarctica and the Falkland Islands before heading across the Atlantic. South Africa's Department of Health said the first victim, a 70-year-old passenger, died aboard the ship. His wife later collapsed at an airport in South Africa and died at a nearby hospital. A British passenger remains in intensive care in Johannesburg after testing positive for hantavirus.



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The World Health Organization confirmed at least one laboratory-confirmed hantavirus case while additional suspected infections remain under investigation. WHO said, "Detailed investigations are ongoing, including further laboratory testing, and epidemiological investigations."

Oceanwide Expeditions, the company operating the vessel, said two crew members onboard also developed symptoms requiring urgent medical attention. Cape Verde authorities have not yet allowed passengers or crew to disembark as officials work to contain the situation.

Hantavirus is a rare but dangerous virus typically spread through exposure to infected rodent urine, droppings or saliva. The disease can trigger severe respiratory illness

and, in some cases, kidney failure. The CDC says there is no specific cure, though early treatment can improve survival chances.

As fear spreads alongside reports of the outbreak, we should continue lifting up in prayer the families grieving loved ones, the passengers and crew still stranded aboard the ship, and the medical teams responding to the crisis. We should pray for healing for those battling sickness and ask God to calm the fear and anxiety that health emergencies like this can stir across the world.

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Vermont Pays Christian School After Federal Court Sides With Biblical Beliefs

The state of Vermont's athletic association has agreed to pay \$566,000 to Mid Vermont Christian School after the school was banned from state competitions for refusing to play against a team with a transgender athlete. The settlement closes one chapter in a legal battle that became a national flashpoint over religious liberty and women's sports.

The dispute began in 2023 when Mid Vermont Christian School

forfeited a girls basketball playoff game because the opposing team included a biological male competing in the girls division. Vermont officials responded by banning the school from all state-sponsored athletic and academic competitions, including spelling bees and science fairs.

According to WCAX, the Vermont Principals' Association claimed the school violated the state's anti-discrimination policy.

The school, represented by Alliance Defending Freedom, sued Vermont officials and argued the punishment violated the First Amendment and targeted the school's biblical convictions regarding male and female distinctions. A federal appeals court later ruled in favor of the Christian school and ordered its reinstatement into Vermont athletics while the case continued.

"This settlement is a giant win not only for the 1st Amendment but obviously for the school itself," Alliance Defending Freedom attorney David Cortman told WCAX.



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Cortman also told VTDigger that Vermont officials "denied Mid Vermont Christian School a public benefit available to all other schools in Vermont just because it stood by the widely held, biblical belief that boys and girls are different."

Fox News reported the school endured two years of exclusion from both sports and academic activities, forcing students to travel out of state to compete. Coach Chris Goodwin described the emotional toll on students after the school chose to stand by its beliefs.

"We were all in agreement that the right decision was to not compromise our beliefs," Goodwin told Fox News Digital.

The Vermont Principals' Association denied wrongdoing but

agreed to the settlement following the appeals court ruling. Executive Director Jay Nichols said the organization “will continue to follow Vermont law and advocate for all Vermont children,” according to WCAX and VTDigger.

The broader legal fight is still ongoing. Mid Vermont Christian School continues challenging Vermont’s exclusion of religious schools from certain public tuition programs, arguing the state is discriminating against Christian institutions because of their faith-based beliefs.

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
