

5 Ways the Devil Attacks Your Mind Every Day

Christians are facing a moment that demands discernment and clarity. As UFO and UAP reports move from the fringe into government hearings and mainstream discussion, the pressure to explain what is happening is growing. Scripture warns that deception will rise in the last days, and the church must be grounded in truth as these narratives take shape.

Pastor Jack Hibbs addressed this issue in a recent video reacting to comments from Vice President JD Vance, who said he believes alleged alien encounters are demonic. Hibbs laid out a detailed, Bible-centered framework explaining how the UFO and UAP phenomenon could unfold as a global deception and why believers must be prepared to answer it.

Here are Hibbs' key points on how this deception could take place:

- **A rise in unexplained activity is conditioning the world**
Hibbs pointed to the growing number of credible reports as a setup for what is coming.
"There's no doubt about it. It's not just Hollywood. We are seeing an increase of reports of UAPs... things that cannot be explained."
With thousands of cases under investigation, the public is being trained to accept that something unknown is present.
- **People will be forced to adopt an explanation**

Hibbs said the increase in sightings will push society toward forming conclusions.

“Everyone’s going to have their response... the response is global... people are going to craft that... based upon what is being revealed.”

- **The alien narrative will hide a spiritual reality**

He warned that calling these encounters extraterrestrial masks what is truly happening. “The desire to describe everything celestial... everything that is otherworldly... to describe it as aliens...”

Hibbs pointed to Scripture as the correct lens. “Deceiving spirits and doctrines of demons. I think we’re seeing an increased manifestation.”

- **Jesus will be redefined to fit the narrative**

Hibbs warned that this deception will target Christ’s very identity. “I believe you’re going to hear more and more of the excuse that Jesus was an alien.” This explanation would attempt to reduce miracles to something other than divine power.

- **Encounter accounts will reinforce the deception**

He highlighted patterns in reported experiences. “By far, overwhelmingly so, most of them say that they were tampered with sexually... probed... examined in their reproduction areas.” Hibbs connected this to Genesis 6 and warned that it reflects a deeper agenda.

- **A major global event could be reinterpreted through UFOs**

Hibbs described a scenario where a sudden disappearance is explained away. “What if... a whole lot of people are instantly gone and somebody comes along and says, ‘See, told you... They came to rescue us from these... Christians.’”

- **A false next step for humanity will be introduced**

He warned that a new belief system could follow. “Our next evolution... we’re all going to become gods... say the aliens.” This would directly oppose the truth of Scripture.

- **The deception will be global and targeted**

Hibbs made clear this is not random confusion. “I believe that this increase will be part of a vast and massive form of deception that will be used by Satan to dupe the world.”

Hibbs’ warning drives toward a clear conclusion. The rise in UFO and UAP activity is shaping a narrative that will demand an answer from every person. That answer will either align with Scripture or be shaped by deception. We, the church, must be ready. Truth is not evolving with culture or technology. It is already established, and in this moment, knowing it is the difference between standing firm and being led astray.

China Defies US Blockade as Tanker Passes Through Strait of Hormuz

A Chinese tanker sailed through the Strait of Hormuz on Tuesday in open defiance of a sweeping U.S. naval blockade, escalating tensions in one of the world’s most critical oil chokepoints.

The vessel, Rich Starry, which is under U.S. sanctions, had

initially turned back late Monday before completing its passage a day later. The tanker is owned by Shanghai Xuanrun Shipping Co. Ltd. and is carrying roughly 250,000 barrels of methanol after loading cargo in Hamriyah in the United Arab Emirates, according to shipping data cited by the Daily Mail.

The move comes just days after U.S. President Donald Trump announced a sweeping military action targeting Iranian shipping routes.

Trump said Sunday the U.S. Navy would block “any and all ships trying to enter, or leave, the Strait of Hormuz.”

He doubled down Monday, declaring the U.S. would blockade vessels “entering or exiting Iranian ports,” according to the Daily Mail report.

China quickly condemned the move, warning it could destabilize an already fragile situation in the region.

“The US increased military operations and took a targeted blockade action, which will only exacerbate tensions and undermine the already fragile ceasefire agreement and further jeopardize [the] safety of passage through the Strait,” Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesman Guo Jiakun said at a news conference. He added the blockade was “dangerous and irresponsible behavior.”

The confrontation is raising alarm across the Middle East. Saudi Arabia is pressing Washington to abandon the blockade and return to negotiations, fearing the move could provoke Iran into retaliating against other vital shipping lanes.

The passage of the sanctioned tanker marks a direct challenge to U.S. enforcement in the region and signals a potential flashpoint as global powers clash over control of the Strait

of Hormuz, a critical artery for the world's energy supply.

4 Reasons America Is Missing From Bible Prophecy in the End Times

The signs are no longer subtle. Global tension, chaos around Israel and a culture drowning in confusion all point to one reality. The last days are here and deception is accelerating.

In a powerful sermon, Pastor Philip Anthony Mitchell of 2819 Church delivered a direct warning to Christians, calling out spiritual blindness and exposing the battle between truth and lies unfolding in real time.

Mitchell described the current moment with a striking image.

He warned that many are distracted by things that will not matter in light of eternity. “The things that we are busy running after... do they really matter right now?”

The call is not casual. It is a demand for repentance, prayer and realignment with biblical truth.

Deception Is a Strategy

Using the resurrection account, Mitchell exposed how truth can be buried under lies.

“They both got the same facts... but they're both running with different motives.”

Religious leaders in Scripture paid to spread a false story. Mitchell drew a sharp parallel to today.

“Manufacturing lies to cover the truth about God's Word.”

Deception is not random. It is deliberate and it is spreading.

Spiritual Warfare Starts in the Mind

Mitchell said the battle is deeply personal.

“Always trying to suppress truth in your heart, engineering lies in your mind.”

This is how spiritual warfare operates. Truth is presented. Lies are offered as alternatives. Many accept the lie.

“It’s easier for us to believe lies than the truth.”

The Final Call: Stand on Truth

Mitchell ended with a charge that cuts through the noise.

“Jesus came. Jesus lived. Jesus died. Jesus rose. Jesus is coming back again.”

In an age of deception, the mission is simple. Stand on biblical truth. Reject false narratives. Proclaim the Gospel without compromise.

Time is not slowing down. The church must wake up now.

A surge of prophetic voices is moving through the church, but not all of them are from God. The real issue is not activity. It is discernment.

Evangelist John Ramirez warns, “we got more fake prophets in the house of God than any time in this lifetime today.”

Many believers are engaging these voices without testing what they hear.

“You Drink the Kool-Aid” Instead of Trusting the Holy Spirit

Ramirez challenges how Christians respond to prophecy.

“You drink the Kool-Aid. You believe him, but you don’t believe the Holy Spirit when He talks to you because you got doubt.”

Instead of trusting the Holy Spirit, many are drawn to outside voices that sound confident and detailed.

“Your ears are flickering like two antennas sucking up the lie.”

Spiritual Language Without

Scripture Is a Red Flag

Ramirez makes it clear that tone is not proof of truth.

“Just because it sounds spiritual, it doesn’t mean that it’s biblical.”

False prophets can sound convincing, but their words are not anchored in Scripture.

“The word of God don’t live in them.”

Test the Spirit, Not the Delivery

Discernment is not optional.

“Did you test the spirit?”

Ramirez points believers back to the only standard that matters.

“You test it by the Holy Spirit, and you test it by the Word of God.”

If it does not align with Scripture, it is not from God.

Control, Pressure and Fear Expose the Source

False prophecy carries a pattern.

“They want to create fear. They want to put pressure and they want you to depend on them.”

These voices pull people away from prayer and into dependence on a person.

“They don’t want you to go to your prayer closet... they want you to depend on them.”

By contrast, “True prophecy will not control you... it will build you up in the faith.”

When False Words Fail, Faith Suffers

The impact of false prophecy can be severe.

“What breaks my heart is when Christians get a word and it doesn’t come to pass, you leave the faith.”

The failure was never God’s voice.

“It was never from God. It was from the witch or the warlock.”

Return to God, Not Man

Ramirez closes with a direct challenge.

“Why would you have to run to flesh when you can run to God?”

God is already speaking. The responsibility is on us to listen, test and remain grounded in His Word.
