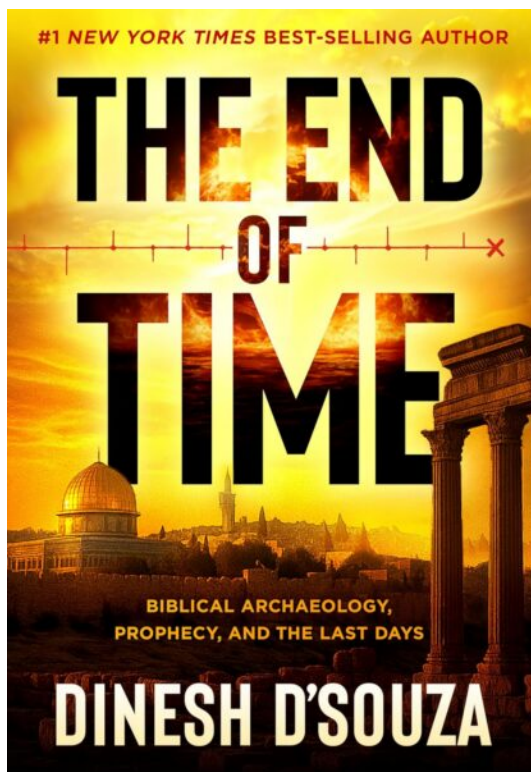


Ancient Christian Monastery Discovered in Egypt Sheds Light on Life of the First Believers

A newly uncovered monastery in Egypt is [shedding fresh light on the earliest days of Christianity](#), revealing how believers lived lives marked by prayer, sacrifice and unwavering devotion to God.

As reported by the New York Post, Egypt's Ministry of Tourism and Antiquities announced the discovery in Wadi El-Natrun, a historic region widely known as a cradle of Christian monastic life. The site dates back to the fourth through sixth centuries A.D., placing it among the earliest organized communities of Christians who chose to step away from society to pursue holiness.

Life Inside One of Christianity's Earliest Communities

The structure itself is expansive, covering more than 21,000 square feet and built from mudbrick with thick fortified walls. At its center sits an open courtyard, surrounded by living quarters and functional spaces that supported daily life. Archaeologists identified monks' cells alongside kitchens, ovens and storage rooms, painting a clear picture of a disciplined, self-sufficient community.

Excavators also uncovered human remains believed to belong to the monks who once lived there, along with inscriptions that include their names and written prayers asking God for mercy and forgiveness. These details offer a rare and personal glimpse into the spiritual rhythms that defined their lives.

The interior walls carry strong Christian symbolism. Covered in white plaster, they feature crosses, palm imagery and intricate patterns, all pointing to themes of victory, endurance and eternal hope. The use of domes and vaulted roofing systems shows thoughtful construction, reflecting a setting designed not only for survival but for worship.

A Living Reminder of Devotion and Surrender

[This discovery brings renewed clarity](#) to how early believers responded to the call of Scripture. These men lived out the command to remain steadfast in prayer and devotion (1 Thess. 5:17; Acts 2:42), separating themselves from worldly distractions to focus fully on God. Their lives reflect a level of surrender that still challenges and inspires us today.

Another striking feature is the presence of burial spaces within the monastery itself. This reveals a community that remained united in faith even in death, holding tightly to the promise of eternal life in Christ.

The find is part of a broader pattern of recent discoveries across Egypt, including additional monastic sites in the same region and in Sohag. Together, they continue to confirm Egypt's central role in the spread and development of early Christianity.

This is more than an archaeological milestone. It is a reminder of what it looks like to pursue God with full commitment. The same call to prayer, repentance and devotion that shaped the early church still stands, inviting us to walk in deeper surrender and faith as we follow Jesus Christ.

Jaden Ivey Fired for Christian Beliefs? The Truth Behind the NBA Controversy

An NBA controversy surrounding [Jaden Ivey](#) is igniting a much

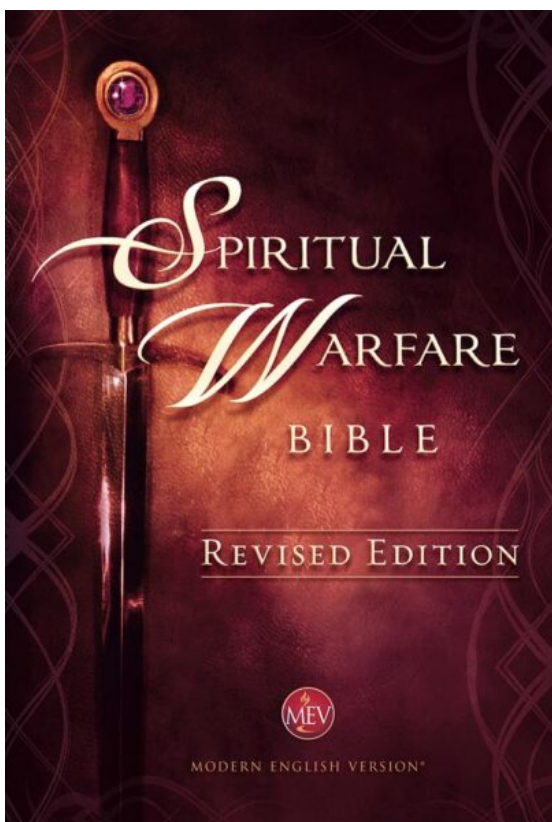
deeper conversation than basketball. It is forcing believers to confront a question many would rather avoid: What happens when following Jesus collides with cultural expectations?

On a recent episode of his podcast, Pastor Josh Howerton addressed the situation head-on, framing it as a real-world test of Christian conviction in an increasingly hostile culture.

Ivey reportedly faced swift consequences after speaking out against the league's Pride Month celebrations, calling them unrighteous. Within hours, he was gone. The speed of the fallout sent a clear message that in today's environment, certain convictions are no longer tolerated in the public square.

Howerton pointed to the deeper issue behind the headlines. This is not just about one player or one comment. It is about a growing expectation that believers must not only tolerate cultural values but actively affirm them.

That is where the tension becomes unavoidable.



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Across industries, not just in the NBA, Christians are being asked to participate in messaging that directly conflicts with Scripture. For many, that moment becomes a line in the sand. It is no longer about staying quiet. It is about whether we will compromise.

And that is why this moment resonates far beyond sports.

[Howerton also highlighted](#) what many see as a clear double standard. Public figures have been given space for a wide range of expressions, political stances and even serious personal failures. Yet when a historic Christian belief about sexuality is voiced, the consequences come swiftly and decisively.

For believers, this should not come as a surprise.

Scripture has always prepared us for this reality. Faithfulness to Christ has never been measured by cultural approval. It has been measured by obedience. When the early church faced pressure to conform, their response was clear: obey God rather than men (Acts 5:29).

That same tension now shows up in workplaces, schools and even professional sports.

Howerton urged Christians to approach these moments with both courage and wisdom. Believers are called to speak truth with grace, not hostility. But there is a difference between being wise and remaining silent. There is a difference between showing compassion and abandoning conviction.

At some point, every believer faces a moment where faith is no longer theoretical.

Ivey's situation is a reminder that standing for biblical truth may come with a cost. But it is also a reminder of something greater. Approval from culture is temporary.

Faithfulness to Christ is eternal.

This is bigger than one player. It is a glimpse of what many believers are already navigating every day.

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How Holding a Grudge Is Destroying Your Health and Blocking God's Peace

What if one hidden habit is quietly wrecking your health, disrupting your sleep and opening the door to disease?

[According to Dr. Don Colbert](#), it is not diet or exercise alone. It is unforgiveness.

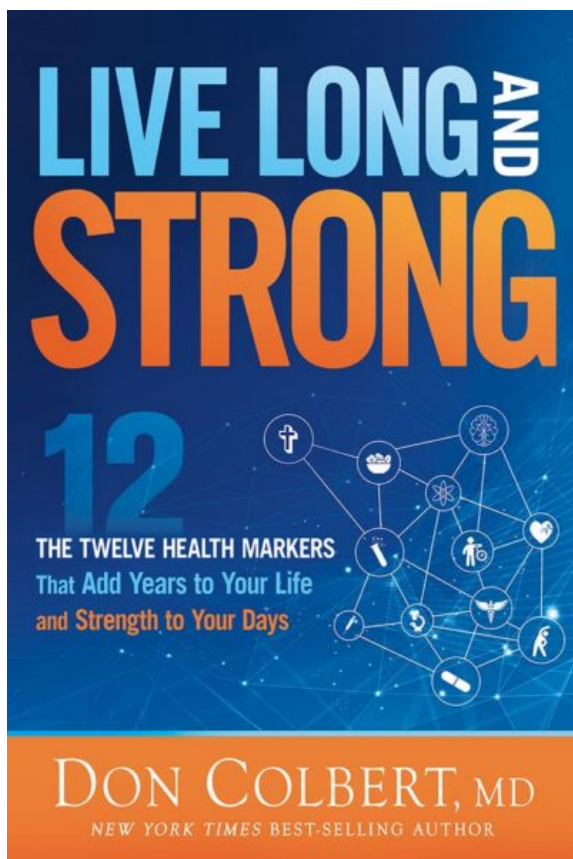
In a recent video, Colbert returns to a foundational truth: grudges are not just spiritual issues; they are medical ones. When a person holds onto bitterness, resentment or offense, the body enters a constant stress response. Cortisol, adrenaline and other stress hormones flood the system and never fully shut off.

That chronic activation takes a toll. Blood pressure rises.

Belly fat increases. Sleep becomes restless. The immune system weakens. Inflammation spreads. Over time, the body begins to break down under the weight of unresolved stress. What was meant to protect us in moments of danger becomes a slow, internal attack when it never turns off.

Scripture speaks directly to this. Jesus commands forgiveness without limits, telling His disciples to forgive “seventy times seven” (Matt. 18). He makes it even more direct in Matthew 6:14-15, linking our forgiveness of others to our own. Paul echoes this in Ephesians 4:31-32, calling believers to put away all bitterness, rage and anger and to forgive as God has forgiven us.

This is not a suggestion. It is a command tied to freedom.

A grudge keeps the past alive in the present. It replays the offense, deepens emotional wounds and strengthens stress

patterns in the brain. Many carry these offenses for years, allowing a single moment to shape their health, relationships and spiritual life.

Forgiveness breaks that cycle.

It begins with a decision. Not a feeling. A choice to release the offense and refuse to rehearse it. It means bringing the hurt before God, surrendering the need for personal justice and trusting Him as the true judge. It also means setting healthy boundaries when necessary while still letting go of bitterness.

This kind of forgiveness is not weakness. It is strength. It frees the mind, restores peace and [allows the body to come out of survival mode.](#)

Colbert makes it clear: holding a grudge is like drinking poison and expecting the other person to suffer. The damage stays within. But when we forgive, everything shifts. Sleep improves. clarity returns. The body begins to heal.

We are not called to carry offense. We are called to walk in freedom.

When we release the weight of unforgiveness, we step into the peace of God and align our lives with the way He designed us to live.

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Shroud of Turin Breakthrough: Scientists Admit Technology Cannot Recreate Image

Scientists experimenting with powerful ultraviolet light say they have uncovered a stunning clue tied to one of Christianity's most debated relics. [The image on the Shroud of Turin](#), believed by many to be the burial cloth of Jesus, continues to defy modern explanation.

Italian physicist Paolo Di Lazzaro led a team that spent years attempting to recreate the faint image using advanced laser technology. Their approach focused on firing intense bursts of ultraviolet light onto untreated linen in controlled conditions. The goal was simple. Reproduce the same surface-level discoloration seen on the Shroud.

The results were striking. Researchers managed to create small patches that mirrored key features of the cloth, including faint yellowing limited to the outermost fibers. The image on the Shroud itself shows no trace of paint or dye and exists only at the microscopic surface level.

But the experiment hit a wall.

Even with cutting-edge lasers, scientists could not produce a full human image. The energy required to do so far exceeds anything available today.

Biblical scholar Jeremiah Johnston highlighted the staggering implications during a recent discussion on The Shawn Ryan Show.

"Paolo told me it would take 34,000 billion watts of energy traveling in one 40th of a billionth of a second to change the chemical makeup of a fine linen shroud to leave that image," Johnston said. "We don't have that power on Earth."

That level of intensity, delivered in an instant, would alter the chemical bonds of the linen without burning it. Any longer exposure would have destroyed the cloth entirely.

Johnston pointed to the nature of the image as evidence of something extraordinary. "There's no pigment, there's no dye, there's no paint," he said. "Science has to ask how this image

is there?"

He added that the precision of the event stands out. "If it had lasted longer than one 40th of a billionth of a second, it would've just burned up. It would've been gone."

[The Shroud of Turin](#) stretches about 14 feet long and bears the faint front and back image of a man. It first appeared publicly in the 14th century, sparking centuries of debate among scientists, historians and theologians.

What remains undeniable is the challenge it presents to modern science. Even with decades of research and the most advanced tools available, the full image remains beyond replication.

10 End-Times Signs Christians Cannot Ignore Happening Right Now

Bible prophecy is no longer a distant topic reserved for theologians. It is unfolding in real time all around us. Scripture calls us to study the full counsel of God's Word, so we are not caught off guard by deception but instead walk in truth, discernment and readiness.

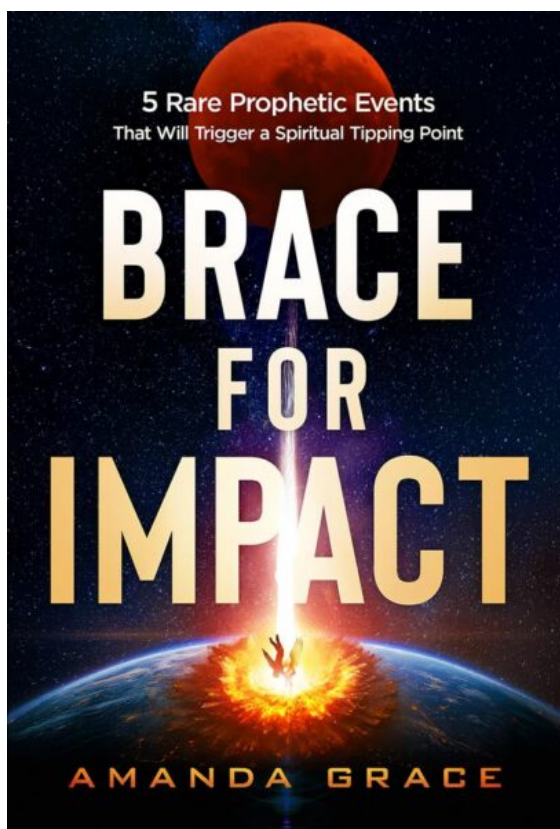
2. Jerusalem Restored to Jewish Control

4 Critical Warnings to the Church in a Time of Prophetic Deception

A steady voice is rising in the middle of growing tension surrounding Israel, calling believers back to clarity, prayer and spiritual discernment.

As conversations around [anti-Semitism and anti-Zionism](#) intensify across the world and within the church, prophetic minister Mike Thompson is urging Christians to return to what God has already revealed and to stand firm without confusion.

Thompson, known for his measured and prayerful delivery, shared that after weeks of seeking the Lord, he received a simple but direct instruction. "Lean to the prophetic. Lean to your gift. And those who have ears to hear will receive what the Spirit is saying." With that, he set aside a traditional teaching approach and instead began sharing what he has seen and heard in the Spirit.

God's Hand Remains on Israel

At the center of Thompson's message is a clear conviction. "The hand of the Lord is still on Israel. He is protecting Israel." He points back to a foundational truth that continues to guide his understanding. "Those who bless Israel will be blessed and those who curse Israel will be cursed."

Rather than framing this only through Scripture, Thompson opened up about personal encounters that have shaped his perspective over the years.

A Prophetic Encounter: Protection Over Israel

He recalled a moment from October 2014 while praying in the Spirit. "Suddenly, He brought me into the spiritual realm." During that encounter, he said the Lord spoke about the importance of intercessory prayer and ongoing spiritual conflict involving both Israel and the United States.

In that same experience, Thompson said he was shown the archangel Michael. "I observed him positioned in the atmosphere over Israel protecting it." He then heard the Lord say, "He will protect Israel by defeating its enemies, even those who are in political office in the United States."

That moment established a connection between spiritual activity, prayer and real-world events that continues to unfold.

A Call to Prayer in a Time of Spiritual Conflict

Thompson emphasized that believers are not passive observers. He pointed to what he describes as “third heaven authority” and urged Christians to remain active in prayer. “If you will do your job in third heaven authority and in prayer, [Michael will do his job in protecting Israel.](#)”

He also warned of spiritual deception clouding discernment in the United States. Referring to a previous vision, he said, “The fog machine that is in America still needs to be destroyed.”

Four Warnings for the Church

1. False prophetic voices

“This anti-Zionism doctrine that’s going around right now is a false voice of prophecy.”

Thompson warns that this movement is not simply a difference in opinion but a spiritual influence introducing doctrinal error into the church. He identifies it as a deceptive voice that sounds spiritual while leading believers away from truth.

2. Jezebel’s influence

“Jezebel will operate anywhere, but she is most comfortable in the prophetic.”

He explains that this spirit seeks to manipulate, control and distort spiritual understanding, often targeting prophetic environments where sensitivity to the Spirit can be exploited if believers are not grounded.

3. The necessity of knowing the Word

“If you don’t study the word of God for yourself and walk in truth, deception waits around the next corner for you.”

Thompson emphasizes that a lack of personal engagement with Scripture leaves believers vulnerable. Knowing the Word provides stability and acts as a safeguard against spiritual confusion.

4. The importance of discernment

“Discerning of spirits is one of the most important but least sought-after gifts.”

He highlights discernment as essential for recognizing the true source behind spiritual activity. Without it, believers may mistake deception for truth or fail to recognize the work of God.

He explained that discernment goes beyond identifying evil. It involves understanding the origin and operation of what is happening in the spiritual realm, whether demonic, angelic or the work of the Holy Spirit.

Discerning the Times We Are In

Thompson’s message consistently returns to the need for clarity in a time of competing voices. He cautioned that deception often targets those who are not grounded in truth and encouraged believers to remain anchored in both the Word of God and the leading of the Spirit.

“We must reject the false voice of prophecy. We must reject Jezebel’s deception. We must study the word of God and walk in truth.”

A Call to Stand, Pray and Expect God’s Glory

In closing, Thompson called believers to take an active role in what is unfolding. “We must be ardent supporters of Israel and bless Israel. Pray for the peace of Jerusalem.”

He also pointed to a larger picture that extends beyond present conflict. “This is about the glory of God. The glory of God coming upon both nations. The glory of God coming into the earth.”

With a calm but unwavering confidence, Thompson left listeners with a forward-looking hope rooted in God’s movement. “The greatest revival and spiritual awakening that planet earth has ever seen. God is moving. Don’t be deceived.”

As Christians, we are invited into that moment not with fear or confusion, but with clarity, prayer and a renewed commitment to walk in truth.

Wars, Oil and Prophecy: The True Meaning Behind Today’s Global Conflict

Global tensions are rising at a pace that is hard to ignore. War headlines dominate the news cycle, instability is spreading across regions, and uncertainty is shaping conversations around the world.

The Nuclear Threat and Rising Fear

One of the most sobering elements Marzulli addresses is the growing conversation around nuclear weapons. With multiple nations signaling escalation, the potential consequences are staggering.

“Iranian hardliners ramp up once taboo calls to seek a nuclear

bomb.”

He warns that a single nuclear event would reshape the emotional and psychological state of the entire world.

“If you have a nuclear bomb going off anywhere on the planet, this creates the greatest climate of fear that the world has ever experienced collectively.”

Spiritual Forces Behind World Events

Marzulli does not separate the physical from the spiritual. He makes the case that what we see in the natural world is deeply connected to unseen realities.

“The current political landscape is in direct correlation to supernatural events that happened, in some cases, millennia ago.”

He contrasts worldviews, pointing to the foundation of the United States as rooted in a Judeo-Christian framework shaped by the resurrection of Jesus Christ, while other nations operate from entirely different spiritual foundations.

For us as Christians, this reinforces that history is not drifting. It is moving according to God’s design.

Signs of the Last Days

Marzulli ties today’s conditions directly to the words of Jesus, pointing to a convergence of warning signs.

“We are in the last of the last days because we see wars and rumors of wars.”

He also highlights the rise in global earthquakes as a measurable and undeniable trend.

“Jesus warns us there will be earthquakes in diverse places... now we get this list every single week.”

Beyond natural events, he points to growing lawlessness and rapid technological change, especially in artificial intelligence, as further indicators that the world is shifting at an unprecedented pace.

“This is why, in my opinion, we are in the last of the last days.”

As we take in these developments, we are not called to fear but to awareness. Marzulli’s message presses us to recognize the moment we are living in and to anchor ourselves in God’s truth.

The headlines may shift by the day, but the foundation remains steady. We stand together, watching, praying and discerning, knowing that what looks like chaos to the world is not outside the hand of God.

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7 Biblical Keys to Growing in

the Gift of Tongues That Many Christians Miss

For many Christians, praying in tongues feels distant, inconsistent or even confusing. Some experience only a few repeated syllables, while others seem to flow freely. Scripture makes it clear this gift is meant to build us up, yet many never move beyond the starting point.

[Pastor Vlad Savchuk of HungryGen Ministries](#) lays out a clear, practical path rooted in the Word of God. His teaching cuts through the confusion and brings the focus back to what actually produces growth in a believer's prayer life.

1. Start with Scripture so your faith has a foundation

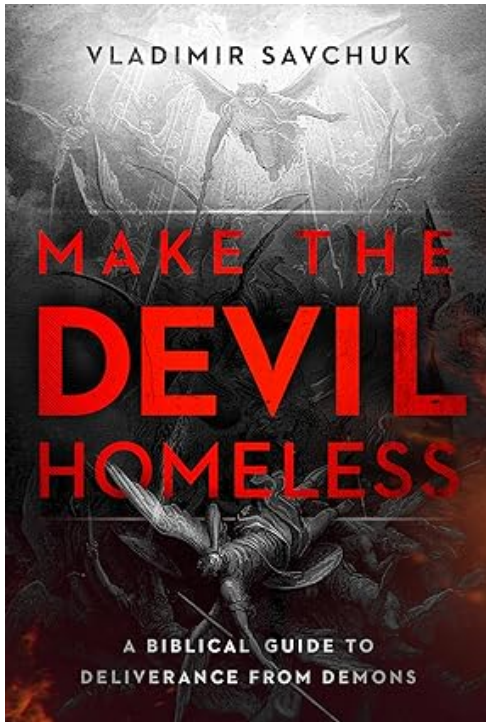
Savchuk emphasizes that growth begins with the Word. "If you want to grow in your prayer language, feed your faith with what God already said."

He points to passages like 1 Corinthians 14 and Jude 20, explaining that faith becomes active when Scripture moves from concept to conviction. Before trying to feel anything, we must choose to believe what God has already spoken.

2. Create a private place and a predictable time

Consistency is not optional. "If the only time you practice your prayer language is at church, it will be inconsistent."

Savchuk urges believers to build a daily rhythm, even if it starts with just five minutes. A repeated time and place trains both the spirit and the habits, turning something occasional into something steady.

3. Begin with worship, then shift into tongues

Many struggle because they jump in cold. Savchuk offers a simple pattern. "Worship in your language that you understand for 60 seconds... and then shift praying into tongues."

Worship stirs the spirit, creating a natural flow into tongues. He also highlights that tongues can magnify God, even becoming a form of singing.

4. Yield your mouth

One of the biggest misunderstandings is passivity. "The Holy Spirit gives us the utterance, but we have to speak."

Savchuk challenges believers to stop waiting for a dramatic takeover. Whether it begins with a few syllables or a soft flow, the key is yielding your voice in faith and letting it grow from there.

5. Pray in tongues through pressure, not just peace

Tongues are not reserved for calm moments. They are most powerful in the middle of pressure. “Your weakness... is not a disqualifier, it’s an invitation.”

When the mind is overwhelmed, Savchuk says to keep praying. Instead of retreating into anxious thoughts, we step into the Spirit and allow prayer to stabilize what feels chaotic.

6. Mix tongues with understanding

Savchuk follows Paul’s model of balance. “I will pray with the spirit and I will also pray with the understanding.”

Rather than separating the two, he encourages a rhythm. Pray in tongues, then pray in your known language, then return again. This keeps both the spirit and the mind engaged in a healthy, active prayer life.

7. Ask God for interpretation and write what comes

Growth deepens when we listen as well as speak. “Let him who prays in a tongue pray that he may interpret.”

Savchuk teaches believers to pause after praying in tongues and ask the Holy Spirit what is being emphasized. Writing down impressions, Scriptures or names helps develop sensitivity to God’s leading.

[Savchuk’s message is deeply needed.](#) Tongues are not a performance or a spiritual badge. They are a gift meant to build us from the inside out. When we stop treating this as something occasional and begin to cultivate it in the secret place, everything changes.

What feels small and uncertain at first can grow into a steady, powerful current that shapes how we pray, how we think and how we walk with God every day.

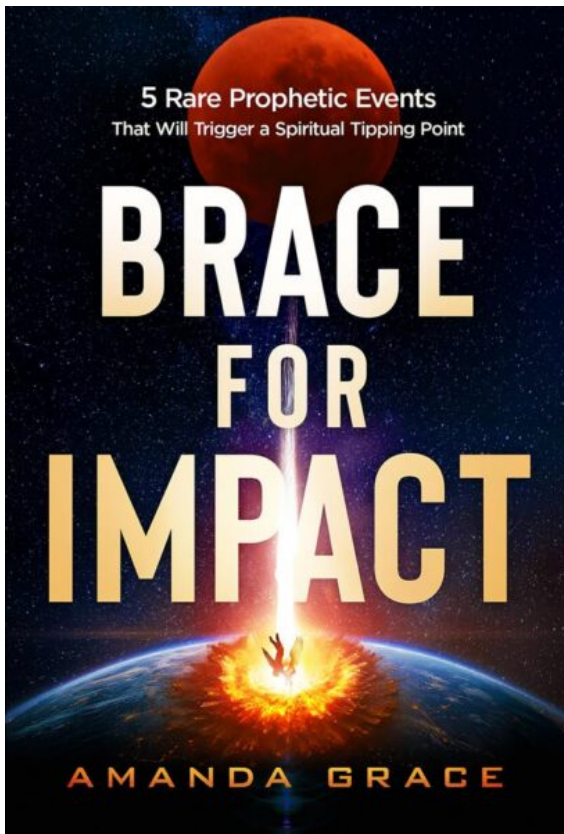
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9 Prophetic Warnings From the 1800s That Are Unfolding Now

A collection of warning dreams recorded in the late 1800s is drawing new attention as current events begin to mirror what was seen generations ago.

[Evangelist Perry Stone](#) points to these accounts as evidence that God still reveals what is ahead, saying, "Surely the Lord God does nothing unless He reveals His secret to His servants, the prophets."

These dreams were reported shortly after the Civil War and documented by a New York journalist. They outlined nine specific developments tied to America's future. Stone brings them into the present with a direct challenge: "These nine things that I have just told you were predicted in the 1800s. Now look at America's condition right now."

Here are the nine warnings from days long gone:

1. Division Inside the Home

"There will be internal fighting among families as predicted by Christ in the New Testament."

The breakdown begins at the most personal level. Homes that once carried shared values now reflect sharp disagreement. Parents and children move in opposite directions. Marriages strain under competing beliefs. This shift removes stability at the foundation of society.

2. Conflict Without a Single Battlefield

"There will not be one big war, but fighting spreading out to states, cities and neighborhoods in America."

The dream describes scattered unrest rather than a single war. Conflict appears in different places at different times. One

city settles while another ignites. This pattern creates ongoing instability instead of a defined crisis.

3. Hidden Forces Draining Strength

“A secret band, which is a secret organization, will sap the life out of this nation.”

This points to influence that operates out of sight. Decisions and systems move in ways that weaken the nation over time. The effect is gradual but consistent, wearing down strength from within.

4. Nature Turning Violent

“The sea will heave beyond its bounds, engulfing cities, quakes, hail, rain and destruction.”

Water, land and sky all reflect disruption. Rising seas, earthquakes and severe storms impact entire regions. These events are not isolated but part of a broader pattern of instability.

5. Lawlessness in the Streets

“Mobs will roam the cities looking for money and food and destroying anyone opposing them.”

Order breaks down as groups move through cities unchecked. Businesses are targeted. Public safety becomes uncertain. Authority struggles to keep pace with the scale of the unrest.

6. Pressure From the Southern Border

“The Indians in the south of the border will raise up and challenge America.”

Using the language of its time, the dream points to tension from Mexico. That pressure now shows up at the southern border, affecting security and national stability.

7. Government Overreach and Instability

“The government will abuse the Constitution, go into severe debt, and you will see politicians flee for their safety.”

Foundational principles are strained. Debt rises sharply. Leadership faces growing pressure. The structure meant to provide order begins to show visible cracks.

8. Economic Strain on Work and Production

“Manufacturing will cease for a time. Even farmers will allow land to remain unfarmed.”

Production slows across industries. Factories shut down. Farmers step away from planting as costs rise. This affects supply, jobs and long-term sustainability.

9. Collapse Driven by Internal Conflict

“Internal fighting will cause collapse of the federal and state governments.”

Division at every level leads to dysfunction. Cooperation fades. Systems stall. The result is a structure that cannot hold under constant conflict.

A Nation Under Pressure

Stone ties these warnings directly to current conditions. “There’s 104 million people that right now are not working. There’s 1 in 8 that use food stamps.” Rising debt and struggling cities point to growing strain across the system.

[He also explains why nations fail.](#) “Democracies fail because of high taxes, trade wars, corruption in politics, and wars.” Each factor is already visible.

History shows repeated attempts to predict exact prophetic dates, all of which fell short. “If the Bible is talking about

1,260 days, it is talking about days.” The message is to stop forcing timelines and read Scripture plainly.

Stone points to Jesus’ words as the clearest guide. “The real clues in the New Testament to the return of the Lord will be found in Matthew chapter 24, Luke 21, and Mark 13.”

He ends with a direct warning. “When all the prayer warriors, all the people that are maybe strong prophetic teachers, are beginning to tell you the same thing, or they are seeing the same thing, that is real proof that something big is about to happen.”

The pattern is visible. Are you paying attention?

Is the Antichrist Economy Already Taking Shape?

A global system is tightening its grip on buying, selling and control. Scripture already warned it would come. The question is not if it arrives, but whether believers recognize the difference between that system and God’s.

In a recent interview with Rebecca Lamb Weiss, [Kap Chatfield](#)

[delivered a direct challenge](#) to how Christians view money, provision and power, pointing to a growing dependence on systems that compete with God's design.

God's Economy vs. Babylon's System

"What the devil wants to do in Christians is he wants us to come out of agreement with the Word," Chatfield said. "What we're subtly doing is we're putting our trust in Pharaoh and King Nebuchadnezzar and the Babylonian economy and an antichrist agenda."

Revelation describes a system where participation in the economy requires submission. Chatfield pointed to Deuteronomy, where God commands His Word to govern both thought and action.

"What is the Antichrist trying to do? It's a mockery of an allegiance to an economic covenant," he said.

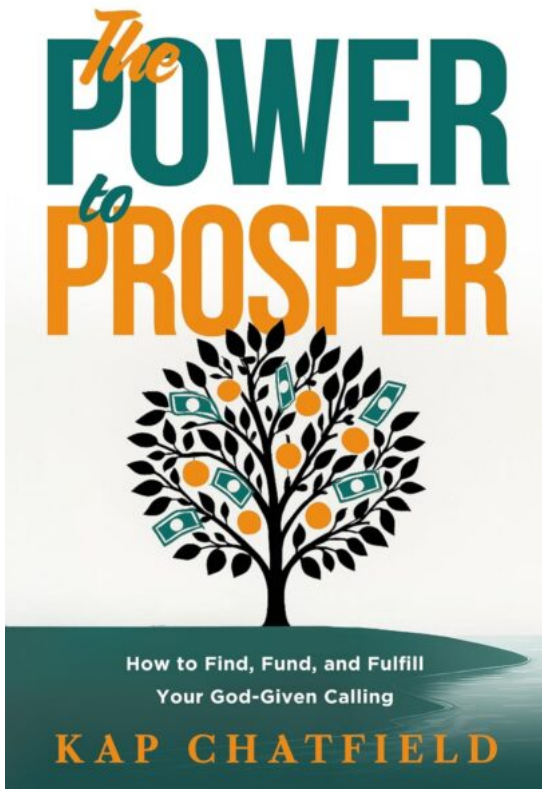
This is not about money. It is about allegiance.

A Different Source of Provision

"We operate from a different economy," Chatfield said. "My king owns the cattle on a thousand hills. He is El Shadai, the all-sufficient one. He is Jehovah Jireh. He is my provider and my prosper."

Economic instability loses its grip when provision is rooted in covenant.

"It doesn't matter what's going on in the economy," he said.

What Prosperity Really Means

"God would allow you to abound and be all sufficient in all things and have an abundance left over for every occasion of generosity," Chatfield said, referencing 2 Corinthians 9.

Prosperity is not excess for self. It is provision for purpose. It is having what is needed to fulfill God's assignment and more than enough to bless others.

Scripture shows this pattern again and again. [God provides and that provision fuels purpose.](#)

The Heart Follows the Treasure

"Wherever my money is sent is where my heart will follow," Chatfield said.

Giving aligns the heart with the kingdom. Without it,

alignment never fully happens.

Breaking the Cycle of Lack

“God’s people are destroyed for a lack of knowledge,” Chatfield said.

Misunderstanding keeps believers stuck, limits the Church’s impact and silences teaching on biblical stewardship. When truth is restored, provision grows and the mission moves forward.

“You never have a fixed income with God,” he said.

Built to Build, Not Beg

“Christians were made not to beg but to build,” Weiss said.

Giving is not about meeting a need. It is about what is added to the giver’s account and how the kingdom advances.

A Call to Realignment

Old mindsets must be laid down. Traditions that contradict Scripture must go. God’s Word must take final authority.

The choice is clear. Trust the system of Babylon or align with the economy of heaven.

One leads to control. The other leads to freedom.

And in a world moving toward total economic control, that choice carries weight now more than ever.

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
