

Why the Coming Wave of UFO Disclosure Fits Biblical Prophecy

For years, the public conversation about UFOs has drifted between ridicule and fascination. Now the national mood is shifting. Congressional hearings, government task forces and high-ranking officials are speaking openly about what they once dismissed.

Fox News recently highlighted this transition in its interview with filmmaker Dan Farah, whose new documentary, *The Age of Disclosure*, claims to expose an “80-year global cover-up” [involving non-human intelligence](#).

Farah told Fox News’ Bret Baier, “For a very long time, the public, Congress and even the president have been kept out of the loop on this subject.” He added that senior leaders are finally “in pursuit of the truth for themselves and for the American people.” His documentary features 34 officials, including Secretary of State Marco Rubio, who says in the film’s trailer, “We’ve had repeated instances of something operating in the airspace over restricted nuclear facilities, and it is not ours.”

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Farah is convinced the phenomenon is real. “Every single person I interviewed made it very clear that it was no longer a question of whether this was a real situation,” he said. He suggests the United States is engaged in a secret technological race with China and Russia to reverse-engineer craft of “non-human origin,” calling it “the Manhattan Project on steroids.”

But as sensational as those claims are, something essential is still missing. The conversation, both in government and in Hollywood, remains locked inside a materialistic framework. Officials describe technology, airspace intrusions and biological entities. Documentaries hint at geopolitical competition and the recovery of craft. Yet they consistently ignore the one dimension that explains what none of these testimonies can, the spiritual dimension.

Christian author and researcher L.A. Marzulli has been sounding this alarm long before Washington took UFOs seriously. In his best-selling book, *The Rungs of Disclosure*, he writes, "UFOs are real, burgeoning, and not going away." But unlike most commentators, he roots the entire phenomenon in a biblical worldview. What today's experts call "high strangeness," Marzulli identifies as the continuation of an ancient conflict described in Scripture.

He points to Genesis 3:15 as the interpretive key, the prophecy declaring enmity between the seed of the woman and the seed of the serpent. Marzulli says this is the "gateway" to understanding what modern reports are calling non-human intelligences. The deception is not merely technological. It is theological. "Hybrids are being created," he writes, describing accounts of abductions, manipulated genetic material and entities that appear as a "mixing of the seed."

This is the piece missing from Farah's otherwise compelling documentary. Technology cannot explain crafts that defy physics. National security frameworks cannot explain entities that appear, disappear and manipulate human biology with impunity. Geopolitics cannot explain why the phenomenon has always involved deception, fear, mutilation and impersonation.

Farah warns that laughing at this subject is “the equivalent of laughing at a terrorist threat.” He is right that the danger is real, but the threat is far older than what any congressional hearing can diagnose. Marzulli is clear. “The revealing of the so-called extraterrestrial presence is the coming great deception.” In other words, what the world calls disclosure is what Scripture calls a spiritual strategy.

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Farah believes we are only moments away from political leaders breaking their silence. “I think it is only a matter of time,” he said, imagining a president announcing to the world that “we are not alone in the universe.” But without a biblical framework, [such a moment becomes the perfect stage for deception.](#) A non-human arrival presented as advanced, benevolent or evolutionary would be welcomed by a world desperate for answers, yet completely unprepared for the spiritual implications.

The documentary community is catching up to what researchers like Marzulli have warned for decades; the phenomenon is real. But reality alone is not interpretation. Until the spiritual dimension is acknowledged, until Genesis 3:15 is placed back at the center of the discussion, disclosure will remain incomplete, misleading and dangerous.

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Marzulli leaves readers with a sober warning. “Put on your armor... The time is near.” He is not simply commenting on UFOs. He is identifying the era we are entering, an era where spiritual deception may present itself with physical form, technological brilliance and global credibility.

If America wants true disclosure, it must start with

Scripture. Only then will the pieces fit.

When God Speaks Through Dreams and Visions

Are dreams and visions still one of the ways God speaks today? [John and Lisa Bevere say yes](#)—and they warn that modern distractions are dulling the church's ability to hear. Their recent conversation explored how God uses dreams and visions to guide, correct and awaken believers, especially in the last days.

The Reality of God-Given Dreams and Visions

Scripture makes clear that dreams and visions are not relics of the past. From Jacob's ladder to Joseph's prophetic dreams, from Daniel's interpretations to the visions of Peter and Paul, God has always communicated through supernatural encounters. The Beveres emphasize that this continues today because the "last days" described in Joel and Acts are still unfolding.

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Visions can come while awake or in the thin space between sleep and consciousness. Dreams, on the other hand, occur at night but often carry spiritual weight that lingers long after waking.

A Distracted Generation

One of their strongest concerns is how constant digital stimulation competes with spiritual sensitivity. Endless scrolling, entertainment and artificial intelligence occupy the imagination—the very space where God paints spiritual impressions. When the mind is overloaded, the ability to receive visions, insight, or prompting becomes dulled.

Imagination itself is not unholy; it is the God-designed “canvas” where images, impressions, and spiritual truths take shape. But when it’s filled with noise, there is little room left for divine direction.

Personal Encounters That Mark a Life

John recounts the first vision he ever received—long before he understood such experiences. Shortly after his salvation, he saw the profile of a brunette woman in a vivid waking vision. Two years later, he met Lisa, who eventually became his wife. This experience cemented his understanding that God still speaks personally and precisely.

Another vision marked the trajectory of John’s ministry. He saw a massive crowd standing before Jesus expecting to be welcomed into His kingdom, only to hear the words, “Depart from Me.” The shock on their faces became a lifelong burden to

reach those in the church who assume they are saved yet remain unchanged. It reshaped his calling and the urgency with which he ministers.

Lisa also shares how God has spoken to her through dreams that carried weight, clarity, and accuracy—dreams that led her to pray, intervene, or take responsibility in situations she could not have seen naturally.

Biblical Confirmation

[The Beveres highlight a thread](#) running through both Testaments:

- Jacob's ladder in Genesis 28
- Joseph's prophetic dreams and later interpretation of Pharaoh's
- Nebuchadnezzar's dream revealed to Daniel
- Ezekiel's open visions
- Joseph's dreams surrounding the birth of Jesus
- Peter's rooftop vision
- Paul's Macedonian call
- The simultaneous visions given to Paul and Ananias

These accounts show a consistent pattern: God uses dreams and visions to warn, direct, instruct, and reveal.

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Discerning God's Voice

Not every dream is from God. The Beveres stress the importance of prayerful discernment. A dream from God typically carries clarity, detail and a spiritual "linger"—it does not evaporate upon waking. Believers should pray over such dreams, test their source, and ask God what action is required.

Making Space for Revelation

God still speaks, but believers must make room to listen. Spiritual sensitivity grows when the noise decreases, when the imagination is uncluttered, and when the heart is positioned to respond. Many people have ignored dreams God gave them years ago, but the Beveres encourage believers that God can reignite what seemed forgotten.

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Dreams and visions are not rare supernatural anomalies; they are part of life in the Spirit. The question is not whether God is speaking—but whether we've left enough quiet space for Him to be heard.

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Why Spiritual Warfare Is Erupting Again in the Modern Church

Deliverance has returned to the center of the spiritual battle facing today's church. In a recent teaching, John Eckhardt

revisited Win Worley's classic Warfare Prayers and laid out why believers must understand [the realities of demonization, spiritual confrontation and biblical authority](#).

"Deliverance is for believers," Eckhardt said, echoing Worley's central conviction. "Demons may oppress believers, but they cannot possess them." The confusion, he noted, comes from translation issues in the King James Version. "The word 'possessed' in the Greek is the word *daimonizomai*, which literally means to be demonized or under the influence of a demon."

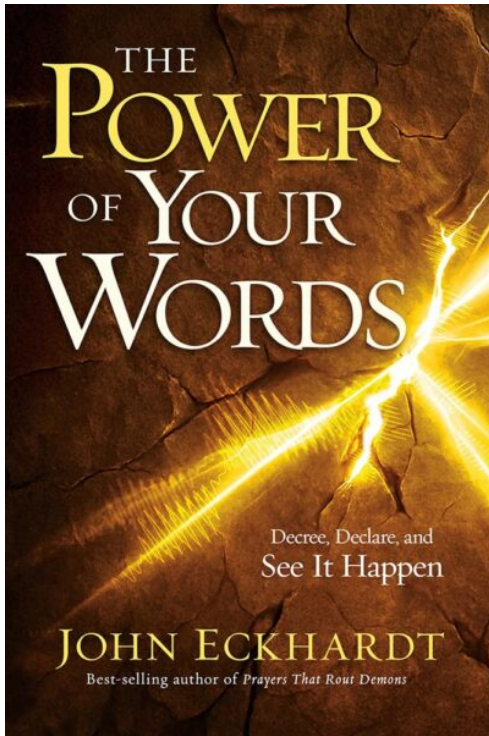
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According to Eckhardt, that clarity eliminates the debate about oppression versus possession. "It's an unfortunate translation because it denotes the fact that the devil can own you," he said. "We know that's not true if you're a born-again believer."

Identifying the Enemy

Worley taught that naming and identifying spirits exposes their assignments. "Demons have specific names and functions, like a military structure," Eckhardt said. In Mark 5, Jesus asks the demoniac, "What is thy name?"—a direct model for exposing spiritual identities.

Some spirits have proper names found in Scripture, while many others are identified by their function. "Demons love to be anonymous," he said. "When you know their names and their functions, it brings light."

Deliverance Is Often Progressive

Eckhardt said deliverance frequently mirrors Israel's gradual conquest of Canaan. "Little by little will I drive them out," he quoted. "Sometimes our deliverance comes as we also grow."

Biblical Authority for Warfare

Key passages include:

- Mark 16:17 – Cast out devils
- Luke 10:19 – Authority over the enemy
- 2 Corinthians 10:4 – Spiritual weapons
- Ephesians 6:12 – Wrestling principalities and powers

Worley's book provides warfare prayers built around these texts.

The Power of Renunciation

Worley emphasized verbal renunciation as a first step toward freedom. “By renouncing it, it tended to break the power of darkness,” Eckhardt said.

Believers renounced:

- Sexual sin
- Perversion
- Witchcraft
- Anger
- Addictions
- Habitual sin

How Warfare Prayer Confronts Darkness

Eckhardt outlined core strategies:

- Bind unclean spirits
- Loose God’s power and angelic help
- Command spirits to leave
- Declare Scripture
- Apply the blood of Jesus

“Demons hate the blood of Jesus,” he said. “They hate the Word.”

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The Call to Return to Deliverance

Eckhardt’s teaching shows us a reality many churches overlook: [deliverance is not optional for believers living in a spiritually hostile world.](#) It is part of the ministry Jesus

commanded, a weapon God designed and a work the Holy Spirit empowers. “These signs shall follow them that believe,” he said, pointing again to the foundational words of Christ. “In my name shall they cast out devils.”

For a generation facing anxiety, fear, addiction, trauma and spiritual confusion, the ministry of deliverance is more relevant—not less. Eckhardt’s message is a reminder that spiritual warfare is real, the enemy is organized and persistent, and believers are called to confront darkness with confidence.

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As he taught, the battle is not passive. It requires authority, discernment and boldness rooted in Scripture. And for those willing to step into it, the same freedom seen in the pages of the New Testament remains available today.

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**BBC Under Fire for
Downplaying Christian**

Persecution in Nigeria

A respected Nigerian physician is challenging the BBC over what he calls a pattern of minimizing the [violent persecution of Christians in Nigeria](#), raising alarms about how global institutions shape the world's understanding of spiritual warfare and targeted attacks on believers.

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Dr. Courage Uhunmwangho, a consultant physician and university lecturer who has treated victims of jihadist violence for more than two decades, wrote to U.K. officials accusing the BBC of “systematic under-reporting and mis-framing” of anti-Christian atrocities. He warned that the network’s coverage has caused “significant reputational damage,” adding, “No longer is the BBC seen as impartial... but as an organization with a deep-seated anti-Christian ideology.”

His complaint centers on BBC articles that suggested President Donald Trump’s statements on Christian persecution were merely a theory “circulating in recent weeks and months in some right-wing US circles,” and that there was “no evidence” Christians were being targeted. Dr. Uhunmwangho says this framing ignores overwhelming documentation from researchers and human rights groups.

He pointed to statistics from Open Doors International showing Christians in northern Nigeria are 6.5 times more likely to be killed than Muslims, and a report from Intersociety noting jihadists have destroyed more than 19,000 churches and killed 125,000 Christians since 2009. For him, this is not abstract

data. “Our first major exposure to this wave of violence in Jos was in 2001,” he wrote, recalling being trapped for days amid bombings and fires.

The dispute highlights a deeper spiritual concern: a growing global reluctance [to acknowledge Christian persecution for what it is.](#) When mass killings of believers are recast as “generic insecurity,” the religious motive is erased—and with it, the urgency for the Church to intercede. Scripture warns that deception and hostility toward followers of Jesus will increase, and Nigeria stands as one of the clearest examples.

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Dr. Uhunmwangho is calling for an independent review of the BBC’s coverage and wants the broadcaster to appear before the Culture, Media and Sport Committee to explain its editorial decisions. The BBC responded by saying it reports on Nigerian violence using “robust evidence” and a range of sources.

Still, for Christians on the ground, the disconnect remains stark. Their suffering is real. Their faithfulness is costly. And their stories demand to be told honestly.

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This is a moment for believers everywhere to pray, stay informed and stand with the persecuted Church—ensuring the voices of those facing danger for the name of Christ are not lost in the noise of global narratives.

Viganò states plainly that “a dangerous subversive elite has managed to infiltrate the highest levels of Western institutions and governments to implement the criminal plan of the Agenda 2030.” This is not speculation. It is a direct accusation from a former Vatican diplomat who has watched the machinery of global governance expand unchecked across the West. His warning confirms what prophecy watchers have long observed: the rise of an interconnected power structure designed to centralize control.

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He points to a pattern of silencing dissent that has become increasingly visible. 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Prophetic Turning Point: Israel Rejects Statehood Despite Global Pressure

Israel sits at the heart of end-times prophecy. Scripture presents it as the central stage for the final geopolitical realignment, and recent events are pushing the region in that direction faster than many expected. The United Nations Security Council's approval of a U.S.-drafted resolution endorsing President Trump's Gaza plan highlights a widening

divide between global diplomacy and Israeli public sentiment.

The resolution claims that “conditions may finally be in place for a credible pathway to Palestinian self-determination and statehood.” [But Israelis overwhelmingly disagree.](#)

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According to new polling, “70% of Israelis now oppose the establishment of a Palestinian state,” with opposition rising to 79% among Jewish Israelis. When asked directly about the U.S. proposal, “57% of Jewish Israelis oppose any Israeli declaration of future support for a Palestinian state,” and only “20%” would consider it under strict conditions.

The Oct. 7 massacre reshaped Israeli thinking. The attack “fundamentally altered how Israelis view territorial compromise,” and many now regret the 2005 disengagement from Gaza. Regret is turning into a political trajectory that points toward the possibility of annexing Gaza, then Judea and Samaria—territory the world calls the West Bank. Still, the Bible identifies it as Israel’s heartland.

Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has made the government’s posture clear, vowing to demilitarize Gaza “the easy way or the hard way.” A nation that rejects withdrawal and opposes statehood is a nation preparing to assert greater control over its land. That direction aligns with prophetic patterns of Israel standing on its own, often without the backing of surrounding nations.

Under Trump, annexation is unlikely. His close relationship with Netanyahu, and his own investment in the resolution, he

celebrated as “a moment of true historic proportion,” makes any drastic move improbable. But the dynamic could change immediately with a new Democratic president. The Democratic Party strongly supports a Palestinian state, and a future administration could pressure Israel in ways similar to the Biden years—only now with the Israeli public firmly against concessions.

If relations sour again, Israel may act unilaterally. That possibility matches the biblical picture of Jerusalem becoming the focal point of global dispute, with Israel forced into decisions the world condemns. [Annexation of Judea and Samaria](#) would intensify tensions over the Temple Mount, potentially leading to a direct confrontation over the site and laying the groundwork for discussion of a future Third Temple.

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Meanwhile, Palestinians also reject the two-state plan that the world insists on. Gallup polling shows 55% oppose it, and 66% prioritize regaining all of historic Palestine. As the article notes, “the supposed beneficiaries reject the destination as firmly as the Israelis reject the journey.”

The Security Council can vote, but Israel’s cooperation is essential. With 79% of Jewish Israelis opposed to a Palestinian state and national sentiment hardened by trauma, the resolution may operate more as diplomatic symbolism than actionable policy. The international community “cannot force a nation traumatized by massacre to embrace the very outcome that trauma has taught it to reject,” according to Israel365 News.

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Events are moving quickly. Israel is shifting toward decisions

that carry prophetic weight, and the region is aligning in ways consistent with what Scripture describes. The pace is accelerating, and the pressure building around Jerusalem suggests that more significant developments may not be far away.

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Clashes in Dearborn Highlight Rising Tensions Over Islam, Free Speech and Political Power

A tense confrontation on Tuesday underscored the growing cultural and political strain in Dearborn, a city already embroiled in controversy following recent remarks by its mayor.

According to Fox News, [anti-Islam activists and pro-Muslim counter-protesters](#) clashed after activist Jake Lang arrived on Michigan Avenue and “attempted to burn a Quran.” Witnesses told the outlet that Lang “held up a lighter, attempting to light the religious text on fire, but counter-protesters knocked it from his hands.” The outlet also reported that Lang later escalated his actions when he “slapped the Quran with a

slab of bacon.”

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The confrontation forced a heavy police presence along Michigan Avenue and near City Hall. Officers intervened when the crowd surged, and at least one arrest was reported. Fox News noted that “no injuries were reported.”

Police kept demonstrators separated as Lang and his group marched toward City Hall ahead of a scheduled council meeting. The site of the protest is in the heart of a city that houses one of the country’s largest Muslim populations and has become a frequent target for activists who accuse local leaders of allowing “Sharia law,” according to MLive.

The incident arrives just weeks after a separate political firestorm involving Mayor Abdullah Hammoud. During a September council meeting, Hammoud confronted Christian minister and Dearborn resident Ted Barham, who had criticized an honorary street renaming connected to Arab American publisher Osama Siblani.

Hammoud interrupted Barham and declared, “You are not welcome here.” He added that “the day you move out of this city will be the day that I launch a parade celebrating the fact that you moved out of this city.”

He also publicly labeled Barham “a bigot, racist and Islamophobe.”

Barham’s comments had referenced past speeches by Siblani that included statements such as “We are the Arabs who are going to lift Palestinians all the way to victory whether we are in Michigan and whether we are in Jenin ... They will fight with

stones, others will fight with guns, others fight with planes, drones, and rockets.” Barham argued that honoring Siblani was “almost like naming a street Hezbollah Street or Hamas Street.”

The mayor later refused to apologize. At a follow-up meeting, he read a prepared statement defending the city’s diversity while dismissing criticism as media sensationalism. He did not retract his remarks or address concerns about religious tolerance.

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Critics say the combined effect of the street-sign dispute, the mayor’s comments and now the Quran-burning confrontation [paints a picture of a community increasingly polarized](#) along religious and ideological lines. Supporters of the protesters argue that free speech is under threat in Dearborn. At the same time, many Muslim residents say the city is under coordinated attack from activists who are intentionally provoking conflict.

The Tuesday clash, sparked by an attempted Quran burning, has now intertwined with the broader debate over political power, religious identity and free expression in the city.

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Dearborn may now be offering the rest of the country an early glimpse of what is coming as Islam continues to grow into a more powerful influence in America and as cultural tensions intensify in cities across the United States.

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From Trend to Threat: The Viral Collision of 'Manifest' Rituals and '67' Chants

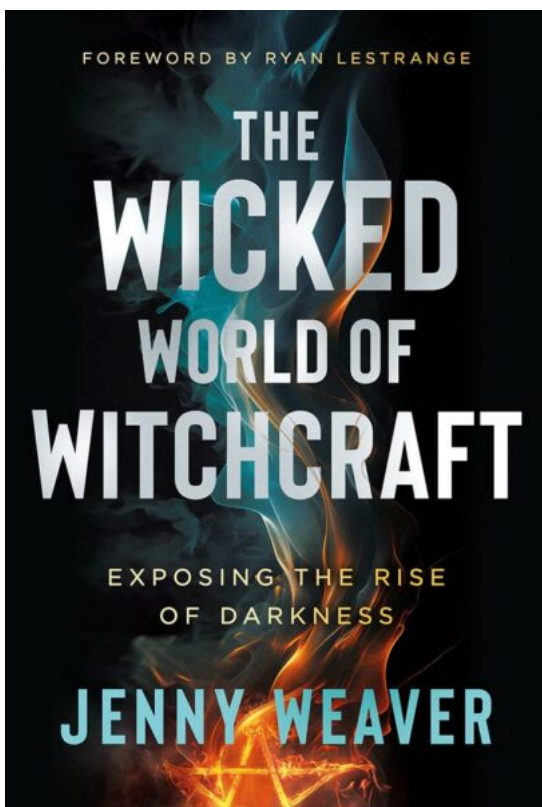
A dark spiritual shift is sweeping across American culture, revealing itself in the very words young people elevate and repeat. These trends may appear harmless, but the language gaining popularity carries unmistakable spiritual weight. Words are never empty. They shape belief, behavior and the atmosphere of a generation. And today's youth culture is embracing terms rooted in confusion, self-creation and open rebellion against God.

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One of the clearest examples is the widespread push toward manifesting. What used to be a simple word meaning "to make clear" has become a ritualized practice. Millions of young people now use the term to describe aligning their thoughts, emotions and "spirit" to create their own reality. It is presented as empowerment, yet the method mirrors ancient forms of sorcery and divination—practices Scripture repeatedly warns against. Instead of turning to God in prayer, people are urged to tap into unseen forces through mental visualization and ritualistic alignment. The spiritual implications are not

subtle. Manifesting is simply the old occult repackaged for a generation searching for control.

An even more disturbing trend has surged into schools: [the phrase “6-7.”](#) What began as a catchy chant online now echoes through classrooms and playgrounds nationwide. Entire groups of children repeat it with raised hands and frantic excitement, often without knowing where it came from or what it represents. Its origin traces back to an artist who openly participates in blood rituals, animal sacrifice and curse-based practices rooted in Afro-Caribbean occultism. The numbers themselves reflect spiritual entities tied to those rituals, and the chant serves as a disguised invocation, now repeated by children who believe they are merely playing along with a social trend.

A child's innocence does not erase the meaning of the words they speak. Throughout Scripture, language is shown to carry spiritual power. Blessing and cursing are not metaphors—they

are realities. When children repeat phrases born from dark spiritual practices, they unknowingly participate in patterns designed to desensitize them to the supernatural and draw them toward spiritual confusion.

This is part of a much larger drift. Modern culture has normalized witchcraft, magic, spells, curses and spiritual experimentation, burying them in entertainment, music, humor and self-help language. As the church has grown more hesitant to address the supernatural realm, society has filled the void with counterfeits. Children are now surrounded by content that celebrates practices Scripture calls dangerous. And because these influences are packaged as fun, trendy or empowering, they often bypass parental awareness entirely.

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This is not about hunting for demons behind every trend. It is about recognizing when spiritual darkness is being marketed as harmless entertainment. [Manifesting and "6-7" are not random cultural moments](#)—they are symptoms of a deeper spiritual battle for the next generation. Parents must stay alert, guard their homes and guide their children with clarity and courage. A generation being formed by occult-tinged language will not drift toward truth on its own.

Yet despite the darkness, there is hope. Countless people have walked away from witchcraft and occult practices after experiencing the transforming power of Jesus Christ. No spiritual counterfeit can outmatch the authority of God. But awareness must come before deliverance. Ignoring these trends will not make them disappear.

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A spiritual storm is moving through America's youth. The

church cannot afford silence. It must answer with truth, discernment and unwavering love for those being pulled into deception.

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Has the 'Super Sign' of the End Times Already Been Revealed?

Whenever violence breaks out in the Middle East, people instinctively turn back to Scripture. Nations named by the prophets are reemerging, alliances are shifting and hostility toward Israel is intensifying. For many, [the patterns are too precise to ignore.](#)

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Alex McFarland has spent 15 years answering theological questions on his national radio program, and he said one theme now dominates everything else. "Over the last several years, just more and more and more people have been asking questions

that do relate to the end times,” he said. Even skeptics are beginning to reconsider the Bible. “They start to look at the Bible and they start to see patterns,” he added. “They start to see countries being talked about today that are talked about in Scripture.”

At the center of those patterns sits what McFarland calls the clearest prophetic marker of our generation.

The “Super Sign”

“The super sign that we are near the last days,” McFarland said, “is... the rebirth of the nation of Israel.”

On May 14, 1948, Israel became a nation again after centuries in exile. For McFarland, that moment shifted prophecy from distant theory to unfolding reality. “They see Israel coming back onto the map in 1948, and they start to say, ‘Wow, it seems like there’s some evidence here that prophecy is real.’”

He described a German man in Romania who followed his livestream while wrestling with spiritual questions. The unrest in the Middle East pushed him to reconsider Islam and explore Scripture instead. “He felt like all of the unrest in the Middle East, that the world is getting to some... point. Everything seems to be coalescing, and indeed it is.” McFarland later led him to Christ—proof, he said, that prophecy often opens the door to faith.

Reading the Signs

While Scripture forbids setting dates, McFarland believes Christians are meant to pay attention. “No man knows the day or the hour,” he said, “however, [I do think we can discern the](#)

signs of the times.”

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He pointed to key developments the Bible warns about:

- Middle Eastern nations aligning against Israel.
- Russia and China positioning for global dominance.
- Rising ideological clashes between atheistic communism and Islam.
- Rapid tech shifts, including AI, global connectivity and the move toward a cashless economy.

Together, he said, these trends mirror the world described in prophecy.

A Call to Wake Up

The takeaway is simple: be spiritually prepared. “We can’t set the date,” he said, “but we are to have our spiritual house in order.” That means walking with Christ and helping others find Him.

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In a world growing more unpredictable by the day, Israel’s rebirth stands as a prophetic beacon. If the “super sign” is flashing, this is the moment to open your Bible, study what God says about the last days, and anchor your hope in the One who promised to return.

When the Veil Slips: Exposing Luciferian Tech and the Rise of a New Babel

There are moments when the veil thins and the machinery behind the world's stage flickers into view. It doesn't happen in classified briefings or dramatic exposés. It happens in glitches—small, unsettling moments that feel out of sync with what should be possible. One such moment resurfaced from a trending congressional hearing involving Delegate Stacey Plaskett, where a woman seated behind her began mimicking her mouth movements in real time, matching words, cadence and even mistakes.

Most people dismissed it. Prophetic commentator Joseph Z did not.

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For Z, the clip is part of a broader pattern of “mind control” [operating in government, media and elite institutions](#). He told his audience, “This is the type of thing when you talk about MK Ultra or people getting mind control operating and you see this so much in different places. There's little threads, little moments that show something's not right about some of the people that are speaking.”

What others saw as an odd facial expression, Z views as a symptom of a much deeper system operating beneath the surface.

MK Ultra Echoes in Modern Government Behavior

Z pointed to the Plaskett hearing clip as evidence of lingering influence from government mind-control efforts. In his words, “She mimicked the mistake with her mouth.” He then warned, “There’s so many conspiracies that are indeed happening that take place,” adding that mind-control programs never really died; they simply adapted.

Z explained that these patterns show up in multiple places: “You’ll see people freeze. There’s a lot I could get into with that.” He referenced public incidents involving media figures, including the moment when Al Roker appeared to freeze during a broadcast after someone referenced the Holy Spirit.

For Z, these are not random glitches or awkward expressions. They are data points. “There is a great nefarious thing happening in many forms of our society,” he said, arguing that manipulation is occurring “behind the scenes” to shape public perception and political behavior.

A Luciferian Elite and the Techno-Spiritual Agenda

From mind-control to metaphysics, Z then widened the frame. He described a global elite motivated by a spiritual worldview directly opposed to biblical truth. “What do I mean by Luciferian?” he asked. “Luciferians that run certain areas of society and sectors of the culture from all over the world

truly believe that Lucifer is the good guy and Yahweh is the bad guy.”

According to Z, this worldview isn't philosophical—it's operational. He warned that elites are using “AI technology, digital editing, editing the genome, editing DNA, transhumanism, all the things they want to bring about,” to build a new kind of global power structure. Their aim, he said, is to reach a place where they can claim, “We don't need Yahweh. We don't need God.”

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Z connected this ambition to Genesis 11. “They want to do another Babylon, another Tower of Babel,” he said. The elites' vision, as he described it, is to “punch a hole into the veil and go into the realm of the spirit,” using advanced technology as their tower.

He added, “This is really part of their religious system [and they want to conquer heaven.](#)”

“The Rules” and Why Elites Signal Their Intentions

Z also referenced what insiders call “the rules,” based on the elites' belief that they must disclose their activities symbolically to gain public permission. “They have to show the culture what they're doing before they do it,” he said.

According to Z, they broadcast their plans through:

- symbolism
- award shows
- halftime performances
- cartoons

- pop stars
- predictive programming

“They show you what they’re doing through movies, through posts, through pop singers, through Super Bowl halftime shows,” he said. “And if the church and the people just go, ‘Oh well,’ and we don’t stand up to it, you know what’s going to happen? Then they have permission.”

In his view, apathy becomes agreement.

A Prophetic Warning, Not a Call to Fear

Despite the gravity of the issues, Z urged his audience not to panic. “Jesus is Lord,” he said repeatedly. He insisted that the purpose of exposing these systems is not fear but discernment.

“We are disrupting the plans of darkness,” he said. “It is not the will of God that this place goes down or that it burns or that the wicked lizard overlords take over.”

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He believes the church remains the greatest obstacle to the Luciferian agenda: “We’re here, and we’re a real problem for this wicked lizard overlord pervert mafia agenda.”

Z called on believers to remain spiritually alert, politically engaged and unafraid. “You gotta stay in faith,” he urged. “You gotta stay encouraged when you see it.”

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
