

Brooklyn Tabernacle Choir Raises \$80K for Haiti Relief

✖ The Grammy-winning Brooklyn Tabernacle Choir raised \$80,000 for Haiti earthquake relief efforts during a concert Sunday at the Brooklyn Tabernacle church in New York.

The donations will benefit two daily feeding programs the Brooklyn Tabernacle has supported in the Haitian cities of Port-au-Prince and Jacmel for several years.

The fundraiser followed a march Saturday across the Brooklyn Bridge, during which the 300-member choir sang and waved purple flags to proclaim that Christ reigns.

The purple flags represent royalty in the Bible, said choir founder Carol Cymbala. "We want to present a symbol of hope to a hopeless world," she said.

The concert featured music from the choir's latest CD, *Declare Your Name*.

On Monday, Feb. 1, the Trinity Broadcasting Network will donate revenue from ticket sales at its Holy Land Experience theme park to Haitian relief efforts. The ministry's charity, Smile of a Child, has already donated \$100,000 to assist earthquake victims.
