Here, in #Algeria, the maternal love of Lalla Meryem gathers everyone as children, within our rich diversity, in our shared aspiration for dignity, love, justice, and peace. In a world where division and wars sow pain and death, living in unity and peace is a compelling sign. #ApostolicJourney

Love Without Compromise: The Gospel Still Stands Alone

There is no question that Christians are called to love. Jesus Himself modeled this by sitting with those society rejected and extending grace without hesitation.

However, love in the biblical sense is never detached from truth.

While gestures of unity and peace may appear noble on the surface, Scripture draws a clear line regarding spiritual agreement. Christianity does not teach that all paths lead to God. Instead, it proclaims an exclusive truth found in the words of Jesus Christ:

“I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me” (John 14:6).

This is reality. Salvation is not found in systems, rituals or alternative beliefs, but in a relationship with Christ alone.
