

After Massive Jezebel Attack, Oprah Repents for Positive Trump Statement

“I couldn’t breathe after the election,” Winfrey told a Peltz Theater at the Museum of Tolerance audience. “My mistake, and this is what I know to be true, is that you can never talk about everybody.
