

Alan Chambers Is Deceiving the Church With New Book, Says Ex-Lesbian

Is it shocking to you that many in the church are being deceived? It shouldn't be. The Bible tell us that these things will happen in the last days. "Take heed that ye be not deceived" (Luke 21:8, KJV).

Alan Chambers, ex-president of Exodus International, is releasing his new book *My Exodus from Fear to Grace*. "Let no one in any way deceive or entrap you, for that day will not come unless the apostasy comes first [that is, the great rebellion, the abandonment of the faith by professed Christians], and the man of lawlessness is revealed, the son of destruction [the Antichrist, the one who is destined to be destroyed]" (2 Thessalonians 2:3, AMP).

As the body of Christ, the church, we should not be looking to man for direction on how to live our lives. It should always and only be Jesus. The Bible says, "Many will say to me in that day, Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in thy name? and in thy name have cast out devils? and in thy name done many wonderful works? And then will I profess unto them, I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work iniquity" (Matt. 7:22-23, KJV).

These folks didn't lose their salvation did they? The question should be were they ever saved to begin with? "I never knew you" implies that they didn't make Jesus Lord of their lives, yet outwardly they appear to be high-profile Christian leader in the church.
