This doesn't work so well in social settings. Relationships, particularly, elude her. Plus, red go-go boots are a constant part of her attire.

She meets Steve (Bradley Cooper) on a blind date. Love is in the air—but only for Mary; Steve thinks she's crazy. Mary believes they're meant to be together and is determined to be with him. She follows Steve across the country while he covers breaking news stories as a cameraman.

Mary's committed pursuit makes Steve believe he's being stalked. And unbeknownst to him, reporter Hartman Hughes (Thomas Haden Church) has been encouraging Mary's passion.
