

Benghazi Victim's Father Speaks Out About Donald Trump

Monday, Republican presidential nominee Donald Trump received the endorsement of Charles Woods, the father of Tyrone "Rone" Woods, a former Navy SEAL who was among those who died during the siege of Benghazi on Sept. 11, 2012.

Rone, as he was known to his friends in the "operator community," gave his life fighting to protect the Americans at the CIA safe house in Benghazi. His sacrifice saved more than 25 American lives, and was recently the subject of the Hollywood film "13 Hours: The Secret Soldiers of Benghazi."
