Could the Russians Be Behind Mysterious Explosions at Natural Gas Facilities in US?

The fire occurred at a “natural gas liquids fractionation facility” operated by ONEOK, a company spokesperson confirmed in a statement to CBS News.

Megachurch Pastor John Gray Hospitalized With Life-Threatening Pulmonary Embolism

South Carolina Pastor John Gray of Relentless Church in Greenville, South Carolina, has been hospitalized since Thursday evening for a life-threatening saddle pulmonary embolism, per an Instagram post from Gray’s wife and co-pastor, Averter Gray. The Grays moved to Greenville in 2018 to former Pastor Ron Carpenter’s Redemption Church (now Relentless Church) after serving under Joel Osteen at Lakewood Church in Houston, Texas.

“My family and I stand in need of a miracle,” Gray wrote on Instagram, adding that “The Saddle PE is in a position that could potential[ly] end his life if it shifts at all.”
