WATCH: Charlie Kirk, Pastor Jack Hibbs Expose End-Times Connections of Globalists' 'Great Reset'

End-times prophecy has a clear connection to the Great Reset put forth by globalists and to what we see happening across the world today. Pastor Jack Hibbs of Calvary Chapel Chino Hills, California, and Charlie Kirk, founder and president of Turning Point USA, came together for a livestreamed discussion of this topic on a recent episode of *Happening Now on Real Life With Jack Hibbs*. Including a powerful connection to the gospel and the hope they find in Christ, the two reveal the biblical patterns behind fast-changing global events.

Hibbs begins with a reading from Matthew 24:1-28, saying the passage provides “a 30,000-foot flyover of the events that would be bringing about the end times in a series of events.”

“Why is this important? Hibbs asks. “Because the age in which we’re going ... they have to change for these things to come to pass. There’s got to be a shift in the structure of the world [as] you and I know it. And in these last couple of years there has been more change in the governance of humanity all at once than in any other time in human history.”
