

DHS Memo Underscores the Refugee Problem We Face

Obama administration officials are quick to defend the President's refugee policy. They claim that it's safe and that the vetting process is comprehensive. However, a leaked memo from the Department of Homeland Security tells a very different story.

The memo said, "Refugee fraud is easy to commit, yet not easy to investigate because refugee laws purposefully contain relaxed evidentiary requirements." That means it is substantially easier for refugees to come to America than it is for other legal immigrants.
