

Donald Trump: Democrats Show More Loyalty Than Republicans

Republican presidential nominee Donald Trump isn't happy with Speaker of the House Paul Ryan (R-Wis.) and other GOP legislators who have declared they won't support him following last weekend's release of the 2005 "hot mic" audio.

"Disloyal R's are far more difficult than Crooked Hillary. They come at you from all sides. They don't know how to win—I will teach them!"

"The very foul mouthed Sen. John McCain begged for my support during his primary (I gave, he won), then dropped me over locker room remarks!"
