

Donald Trump Says There's a 'Pretty Good' Chance He'll Be in Heaven

Donald Trump told *GQ* magazine there's a "pretty good" chance he'll be in heaven after he dies.

In the candid back-and-forth with correspondent Chris Heath, the Republican says not only is there a heaven, it's what he's been working for.
