

Former Miss USA's Warning: 'You'll Sign Your Soul to the Devil'

A former Miss USA is advising pageant competitors against taking the crown.

Recently, the Miss USA organization has been dealing with issues after both Miss USA and Teen Miss USA stepped down from their titleholder duties.

As Fox News reported, Miss USA Noelia Voigt and UmaSofia Srivastava, Miss Teen USA, both walked away from their crowns in May. This led to first-runner up, Savannah Gankiewicz of Hawaii, to take over as Miss USA for the remainder of the pageant year.

Voigt left the pageant for her "mental health," while Srivastava took to Instagram to share her reasoning for exiting the Miss Teen USA world.

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"After months of grappling with this decision, I have made the choice to resign from the title of Miss Teen USA 2023," Srivastava wrote. When Voigt first won the title of Miss USA, she gave praise to God on Instagram.
