

How to Honor Martin Luther King Jr. on the 50th Anniversary of His Assassination

April 4, 2018 marks the 50th anniversary of my uncle, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s assassination. Please pray for his immediate family during this sensitive time.

As a member of "The King Family Legacy" and of the Board of Trustees for The Martin Luther King, Jr. Center for Nonviolent Social Change founded by his widow, the valiant Mrs. Coretta Scott King and other members of our family, I will be joining many of those who will commemorate the MLK legacy publicly and privately.
