

In Spite of Criticism, Rubio Refuses to Stop Tweeting Bible Verses

Senator Marco Rubio is unapologetically vocal about his faith.

Rubio discussed his faith, among other critical issues, with Faith Nation hosts David Brody and Jenna Brower on Capitol Hill.

“Faith is the single biggest influence on my life, and it’s a positive influence.”

In addition to his faith, the senator revealed his conviction towards family values.

“The most important institution in the society is the family ... When you are raising a child, you are raising a future taxpayer who’s going to help fund Medicare and Social Security. Our tax code should take that into account.”
