

Kanye West: 'I Would Have Voted For Trump'

Earlier this year, hip-hop superstar Kanye West told fans he planned to run for president in 2020, inspired in part by President-Elect Donald Trump.

He shocked an audience at a concert in California on Thursday by telling them that while he didn't vote in last week's election, had he done so, he would have voted for Trump. The liberal mainstream media is already trying to portray the statement as a publicity stunt.

"I told y'all I didn't vote, right?" he said. "But if I would have voted, I would have voted on Trump.
