

Lauren Daigle's End Times Warning to the Church: 'Tell the Truth'

Lauren Daigle is calling on Christians to stand boldly for their faith.

In an interview with ChurchLeaders at the Dove Awards, Daigle expressed how this is the current moment for Christians to stand boldly for the truth of the gospel.

She further noted how Christians should be fixated on things that are "tried and true," instead of the temporal. ""At the end of your life, is this what you're going to be talking

about?"

Daigle's new song, "Let It Be a Hallelujah" is her message to the church about praising God in any situation.
