

Marco Rubio: America is 'at the Water's Edge' of Persecuting Christians

In a recent interview with the Christian Broadcasting Network, Presidential hopeful Sen. Marco Rubio said that Christianity is facing a "real and present danger" in the United States due to growing acceptance of gay marriage. He went on to say that, "We are at the water's edge of the argument that mainstream Christian teaching is hate speech."
