"We had guests that would come stay at our bed and breakfast ... one of the things people always said to us is, 'Your place is so healing, it feels so special ... it's just very peaceful,'" Johnson said on a recent episode of 's "Pure Talk." "And I always thought, *That's pretty neat that people can come away on a vacation and feel like they're healed.*"
