Soon, everyone in the plaza started leaving upon Shirley's arrival.

"It's just unbelievable the amount of money these people are making, and they're not even trying to hide it," Shirley said. "People are taking advantage of old people, young people in daycares, disabled people with Autism clinics, and no one's doing anything to stop it. So, I think it's time to stand up to these fraudsters and tell them and let them know you are stealing from everyday American citizens."

What we are witnessing is more than just financial corruption—it is a sobering reflection of what happens when a society loses its moral compass. When the vulnerable—the elderly, the disabled, and even children—become targets for exploitation, it signals a deeper spiritual crisis beneath the surface.
