

Pope Leo's Stark Warning of Dangerous 'Cult' Deceiving Millions Worldwide

Pope Leo is sending a clear and urgent message to Catholics about a toxic "cult" against the body.

In a report by Reuters, it was noted that Pope Leo is calling on Catholics to avoid cosmetic surgery, stating that it can lead to a "cult of the body" as people strive for an unreachable standard of perfection.
