

# Roger Goodell Defends NFL's Upcoming 'Bad Bunny' Halftime Show Amid ICE Controversy

The commissioner of the NFL, Roger Goodell, is once again defending the upcoming Super Bowl's Halftime performance by Bad Bunny.

According to Fox News, Goodell said, "Listen, Bad Bunny of the great artists in the world, and that's one of the reasons we chose him."
