female heroines of the faith as nothing more than church gossips.

Sarahs and Hannahs in their Sunday best / Clutching their
pearls, sighing, "What a mess" / I just learned these people
try and save you 'cause they hate you.

Clearly, these lyrics are taking creative liberty about
Swift's love life and comparing them in negative ways about
the truth of the gospel, that God so loved the world that He
gave us His only Son.
