

Tongva Tribe Eyes Legal Options as Billie Eilish Backlash Grows Over 'Stolen Land' Remark

At the Grammys, superstar Billie Eilish did exactly what you would expect a pop star to do. She completely contradicted herself. Playing off of the growing anti-ICE movement, Eilish stated, "Nobody is illegal on stolen land."
