

Trump Speaks at Historic 'Let Us Worship' Event

Sean Feucht's "Let Us Worship" returned to Washington, D.C., on Saturday, Sept. 11, for a special 9/11 candlelight remembrance, highlighted by a video appearance by former President Donald J. Trump. Trump spoke of the tragic events of 20 years ago and commended Feucht and his team for hosting the event and "bringing prayer and worship to 132 cities across the country."

"By uniting citizens of all denominations and backgrounds to promote faith and freedom in America, you are strengthening our entire nation, and we thank you for it," Trump said. He spoke not only of those who died in the attacks of 9/11 but also of the "bravery and daring" of first responders, adding, "As a lifelong New Yorker, it was extraordinary to witness the strength and resilience of people of that incredible city ... They raced into danger toward the smoke without a thought of their own safety."
