

USA Today's 10 'Trump Disqualifiers' Actually Disqualify Hillary

10 Reasons to Also Tell Hillary, “You’re Fired”

1. Unfit for the Presidency

In their opinion, Trump isn’t fit for president, yet in 2008 President Obama stated emphatically, “Hillary can’t be trusted and isn’t qualified to be president.”

Six months ago Bernie Sanders declared, “Hillary Clinton is not qualified to be president.”

On MSNBC, outspoken actress, Susan Sarandon, said, “People feel she’s a liar ... She’s not authentic... They don’t trust her!”
