

UPDATED: Senate Set to Vote on New Health Care Bill at 3:30 PM

12:30 p.m. Update: *The Senate is now scheduled to vote on Sen. Rand Paul's "clean repeal" bill at 3:30 p.m. EDT. The Senate continues to intermittently debate health care policy in the meantime.*

The U.S. Senate is again debating the House of Representatives' American Health Care Act after Tuesday night's defeat of an amendment that would have replaced that bill with a third version of the Republican leadership's Better Care Reconciliation Act.

A vote was scheduled to take place at 11:30 a.m. EDT, but it's unclear what the vote will be on. Likely, it will be a "clean repeal" amendment. Senate Minority Leader Chuck Schumer, D-N.Y., insisted the Senate instead move the bill back to committee, where Republicans and Democrats can create a compromise that will get a majority of votes in both chambers.

The amendment the Senate will consider was authored by Sen. Rand Paul, R-Ky. {eoa}
