In 1830, George Wilson was tried by a U.S. court in Philadelphia for robbery and murder and was sentenced to hang. President Andrew Jackson pardoned him, but Wilson refused the pardon. Wilson insisted it was not a pardon unless he accepted it. The question was brought before the Supreme Court. Chief Justice, John Marshall wrote the following decision:

"A pardon is a paper, the value of which depends upon its acceptance by the person implicated. It's hardly to be supposed that one under sentence of death would refuse to accept such a pardon, but if it is refused, it is no pardon. George Wilson must hang." He was hanged!
