

Will Donald Trump Serve a 3rd Term?

Could Donald Trump be the first president since FDR to serve more than two terms?

Since Franklin Delano Roosevelt, no president has had the Constitutional right to serve for more than two terms. However, that all may be about to change with Rep. Andy Ogles' (R-TN) new proposed amendment.

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The change would affect the 22nd Amendment, which was created in response to Franklin D. Roosevelt's four-term presidency; Roosevelt died in 1945, a year after being elected to his fourth term.
