

1,700-Year-Old Christian City Found in Egypt With Basilica Church and Biblical-Era Artifacts

Archaeologists have uncovered a remarkably well-preserved Christian city dating back roughly 1,700 years beneath Egypt's western desert, offering a rare glimpse into the daily life of one of Christianity's earliest communities.

According to Fox News, the discovery was made at the Ain al-Sabil archaeological site in the Dakhla Oasis, about 185 miles west of Luxor. Egypt's Ministry of Tourism and Antiquities announced the find on July 3, describing the Byzantine-era settlement as a "complete" city.
